

BUSSELTON LANDFILL SITE - LICENCE CONDITIONS

307. Hon NIGEL HALLETT to the parliamentary secretary representing the Minister for Climate Change:

I refer to the response to question without notice 266 asked on Tuesday, 8 May 2007.

- (1) Can the minister advise what are the levels of each of the following elements between 1998 and 2007 from the nine monitoring bore locations: pH, electrical conductivity, total dissolved solids, nutrients, potassium chloride, cadmium, chromium, copper, lead, manganese, nickel and zinc?
- (2) What is the location of each of the nine bores at the Rendezvous Road landfill site?
- (3) When will the Department of Environment and Conservation complete the review of the relevant reports as advised in the response to question without notice 266?

Hon SALLY TALBOT replied:

I thank Hon Nigel Hallett for some notice of this question. I have answers to all three parts of the question.

- (1)-(2) The answers to parts (1) and (2) are in a very complex tabular form, so I seek leave to table the attached information.

Hon SALLY TALBOT: The answer to part (3) reads -

- (3) The water quality information received from the shire will be reviewed by 30 June 2007. Following this review, a written response will be provided to the shire advising on the water quality monitoring results, levels of analytes measured with respect to historical trends, the monitoring frequency and the future licensing requirements of the Rendezvous Road rubbish site.
