

**CORONAVIRUS — INTERSTATE TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS —  
KERRY STOKES AND ANDREW FORREST**

3149. Hon Colin Tincknell to the Leader of the House representing the Premier:

- (1) Can the Premier please provide a list of:
  - (a) the dates that Mr Kerry Stokes has entered or exited Western Australia since border restrictions began;
  - (b) the date and location of all meetings between the Premier and/or member(s) of the Premier's staff and Mr Kerry Stokes and/or member(s) of Mr Stokes' staff this year;
  - (c) the dates of all phone calls, emails or any other communications between the Premier and/or member(s) of the Premier's staff and Mr Stokes and/or member(s) of Mr Stokes' staff; and
  - (d) the dates and occasions of any function(s) attended by the Premier at which Mr Stokes was present this year?
- (2) Can the Premier please provide a list of:
  - (a) the dates that Mr Andrew Forrest has entered or exited Western Australia since border restrictions began;
  - (b) the date and location of all meetings between the Premier and/or member(s) of the Premier's staff and Mr Forrest and/or member(s) of Mr Forrest's staff this year;
  - (c) the dates of all phone calls, emails or any other communications between the Premier and/or member(s) of the Premier's staff and Mr Forrest and/or member(s) of Mr Forrest's staff; and
  - (d) the dates and occasions of any function(s) attended by the Premier at which Mr Forrest was present this year?
