

CYCLING INFRASTRUCTURE

1351. Hon MARTIN PRITCHARD to the parliamentary secretary representing the Minister for Transport:

I refer to page 713 of the budget papers that states that \$8.6 million will be spent on cycling infrastructure in 2016–17.

- (1) How much is allocated to the Department of Transport for cycling infrastructure in 2017–18, 2018–19 and 2019–20?
- (2) How much is allocated in other departments or to local governments for cycling infrastructure in each year from 2016–17 to 2019–20?
- (3) Does the Minister support the introduction of the so-called one-metre rule; and, if so, when will the minister introduce it?

Hon JIM CHOWN replied:

I thank the honourable member for some notice of the question.

- (1)–(2) The table below outlines funding for cycling infrastructure projects across the transport portfolio. I seek leave to have the information incorporated into *Hansard*.
