## ROAD FATALITIES — REGIONAL WESTERN AUSTRALIA

## 440. Hon SALLY TALBOT to the Attorney General representing the Minister for Road Safety:

- (1) Of the 77 fatal crashes, 87 deaths and 84 critical injuries that occurred on regional roads in 2015, how many occurred
  - (a) within 50 kilometres of the driver's home;
  - (b) between 50 kilometres and 100 kilometres from the driver's home;
  - (c) between 100 kilometres and 200 kilometres from the driver's home; and
  - (d) more than 200 kilometres from the driver's home?
- (2) How many occurred while the driver was travelling to or from their workplace?
- (3) How many of
  - (a) the deaths; and
  - (b) the critical injuries

occurred in crashes that were related to -

- (i) alcohol;
- (ii) fatigue;
- (iii) inattention; or
- (iv) speed?

## Hon MICHAEL MISCHIN replied:

On behalf of the Minister for Road Safety, I thank the honourable member for some notice of the question.

- (1)–(2) The data requested is not recorded for fatal and critical injury crashes.
- (3) (a) Of the deaths
  - (i) there were 23 related to alcohol;
  - (ii) there were 13 related to fatigue;
  - (iii) there were seven related to inattention; and
  - (v) there were 29 related to speed.
  - (b) Of the critical injuries
    - (i) there were 16 related to alcohol;
    - (ii) there were 14 related to fatigue;
    - (iii) there were eight related to inattention; and
    - (iv) there were 27 related to speed.

Note that these figures are sourced from preliminary 2015 crash data and are subject to change.
