- (a) the number of receiving and possession of stolen property involving:
 - (i) livestock, whether alive or deceased;
 - (ii) agricultural equipment or machinery;
 - (iii) vehicle theft;
 - (iv) trespass; and
 - (v) licenced weapons theft;
- (b) for all above, if anyone was charged;
- (c) if yes to (b), if those individuals were convicted;
