During the reporting period, the Committee continued to oversee the work of the Children's Commissioner and in particular, to monitor the progress and outcomes of the *Improving the Odds* report and the *Speaking Out Survey*. The Committee kept under review the State Government's ongoing response to the *Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse*. As part of this review process, the Committee established an inquiry into the child safe standard provisions recommended by the Royal Commission. The Committee's work has highlighted the need to improve oversight provisions across the government and non-government sector.

I would like to thank my fellow Committee members for their commitment and contribution over the year and acknowledge the valuable support of the Committee secretariat.

Functions of the Committee

Pursuant to Section 51 of the *Commissioner for Children and Young People Act 2006* the Joint Standing Committee on the Commissioner for Children and Young People (the Committee) is established by both house of Parliament and its functions are determined by agreement of both houses.¹

Accordingly, the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council have agreed the following:

It is the function of the Joint Standing Committee to -

- Monitor, review and report to Parliament on the exercise of the functions of the Commissioner for Children and Young People;
- ii. examine Annual and other Reports of the Children's Commissioner; and
- iii. consult regularly with the Children's Commissioner²

Other Activities

Oversight function

In November 2018, the Committee held a public hearing with the Commissioner for Children and Young People (the Commissioner) to discuss his 2017-18 annual report. During the hearing the Committee focused on the Commissioner's Vulnerability Speaker series; the two Advisory Committees for that reporting year; the youth homelessness project; and the outcomes of the school and early learning consultation.

In addition, the Commissioner's 2017 Report – Oversight of services for children and young people in Western Australia – and the recommendations from the Royal Commission into institutionalised responses to child sexual abuse were discussed.

During the reporting year, members of the Committee attended the final event in the Commissioner's Vulnerability Speaker Series. Following this series, the Commissioner published a report - *Improving the odds for WA's vulnerable children and young people*.

The Committee resolved to discuss the outcomes and recommendations from the *Improving* the Odds report with the Commissioner. The Committee will continue to monitor the progress of the Commissioner's Speaking Out Survey.

The Committee will convene a public hearing with the Commissioner for Children and Young People to examine the Commissioner's 2018-19 Annual Report.

Inquiry

On 28 November 2018, the Committee resolved to conduct an Inquiry into child safe standards by examining the scope and direction of the work undertaken by the government, regulatory bodies and non–government organisations to improve the monitoring and implementation of child safe standards. The Inquiry also includes an examination of how the Commissioner for Children and Young People's oversight can ensure the interests of children and young people are protected and enhanced.

The Committee subsequently called for submissions and embarked on an in-depth series of hearings with the relevant agencies responsible for overseeing children services in Western Australia.

Much of the evidence received by the Committee demonstrates the need for a broader approach to child safety that also considers the wellbeing of children, their families and communities. The Committee notes that the National Principles for Child Safe Organisations, endorsed by COAG, have been broadened to embed child wellbeing in the standards the Western Australian government is committed to implementing. The Children's Commissioner's *Improving the Odds* report similarly recommended the establishment of a whole-of-government wellbeing strategy.

The evidence also highlights the importance of considering the needs of all children, not just those at risk. The Committee intends to report the outcomes of its inquiry during the next reporting period.

Chapter 2

Financial Statement

The Committee does not have its own formal budget and is funded out of the budget of the Legislative Assembly. Approval for major expenditures is required on a case-by-case basis and is entirely at the discretion of the Speaker.
