



The Ag Department allowed registration of Earmarks that cuts out original Marymia Earmark, even after seeing evidence of cows with their ears been cut off, and then saying that there has been no change to the Brands and Register, yet there has been. (page 16)

No action has been undertaken by the Ag Department or senior police to stop stock theft and ongoing shooting of Marymia cattle to clean up evidence of numerous cattle that have been interfered with.

The final police report says that the cattle has been accidental marked, cutting ears off clearly shows removing Marymia Earmark that is no accident, numerous neighbours sales tags have been found in our cattle, which show that our cattle have been mustered and prepared for sale, the cattle have been mustered through a lake system (page 7) where swans and pelicans come to bread livestock would not leave this environment without force, you can clearly see where the cattle have been mustered through the lake due to the boggy ground conditions.

Local Police have removed bullets from shot cattle with ears cut off, the evidence seems to get to senior police and then nothing has been done, even right from the start when John Roach first reported in July 2008.

The last report from the Ag Department tried to turn the blame to John Roach form Marymia Station which got nothing to do with the situation when mister John Roach went to muster his cattle he found that they have been interfered with he couldn't continue with the muster and left cattle as evidence for police and Ag Department to sort out. We asked for a crown musters to get his live stock back.

People should have been charged for this offence and should not be allowed to work with live stock ever again or hold a pastoral lease from the lands department.

There seams to very little help in the industry not only for station owners but the live stock as well, it is a shame people can get away with this.

We would like this story broadcasted to show Australian people what is going on in the Industry at our own doorstep, and hope to get help for everyone in the industry who has suffered these losses.

We are looking at setting up a foundation for live stock theft and animal cruelty to help others in the future who can not afford these losses and to help live stock.
