SYNOPSIS OF BILLS, 1985

The following synopsis of Bills introduced during the Third session of the Thirty-First Parliament is intended only to give a brief outline of the main features of each Bill as it was introduced and to indicate the ultimate stage reached by the Bill. It does not take into account amendments made in either House.

*Indicates Clause 2 provides for the Act or part of it to come into operation on a date or dates to be fixed by proclamation.

*ACTS AMENDMENT (AMERICA'S CUP DEFENCE AND SPECIAL EVENTS) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to override specified Acts so that certain activities may be carried out in connection with the World 12 Metre Yacht Championships and the America's Cup. The provisions of the Bill will expire on 30 June 1987.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Council on 31 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3388).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Council.

(Act No. 102 of 1985-assented to 5 December 1985)

ACTS AMENDMENT AND REPEAL (STATUTORY BODIES) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to abolish eight statutory agencies and repeal six Acts.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 26 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1667).

(Act No. 59 of 1985—assented to 28 October 1985.)

*ACTS AMENDMENT AND REPEAL (TRANSPORT CO-ORDINATION) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to amalgamate the office of the Co-ordinator General of Transport and the Transport Commission to form a new department.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 27 August 1985 (P.D.p. 367).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly.

(Act No. 54 of 1985—assented to 28 October 1985.)

ACTS AMENDMENT (AUTHORITY FOR INTELLECTUALLY HANDICAPPED PERSONS) BILL 1985

This Bill is complementary to the Authority for Intellectually Handicapped Persons Bill 1985. Its purpose is to separate services to the intellectually handicapped from those to people suffering from severe psychiatric disorders.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 26 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1670).

(Act No. 69 of 1985—assented to 15 November 1985.)

*ACTS AMENDMENT (EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS SUPERANNUATION) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to confer on the Western Australian Institute of Technology and the Western Australian College of Advanced Education the right to join the superannuation scheme for Australian Universities.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 30 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3347.) (Act No. 77 of 1985—assented to 20 November 1985.)

*ACTS AMENDMENT (FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION AND AUDIT) BILL 1985

This Bill is complementary to the Financial Administration and Audit Bill 1985. Its purpose is to amend 161 Acts with respect to existing accounting, reporting and audit provisions.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 19 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1271).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Council.

(Act No. 98 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985)

*ACTS AMENDMENT (HOSPITALS) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to transfer all matters relating to hospitals from the Health Act to the Hospitals Act. The Bill also provides that all proposed private hospitals, including nursing homes, be subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Health.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 3 September 1985 (P.D.p. 725).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly. (Act No. 53 of 1985—assented to 5 November 1985.)

*ACTS AMENDMENT (MEAT INDUSTRY) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to establish the Western Australian Meat Marketing Corporation which will combine the functions of the Western Australian Lamb Marketing Board and the marketing division of the Western Australian Meat Commission.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 22 October 1985 (P.D.p. 2679). This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council.

(Act No. 107 of 1985—assented to 7 January 1986)

*ACTS AMENDMENT (POTATO INDUSTRY) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to replace the Potato Marketing Board with an authority. It enables the Ministerial appointment to the authority to be a person with specialised commercial and marketing skills.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 8 October 1985 (P.D.p. 1807).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Council.

(Act No. 96 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985)

ACTS AMENDMENT (RESOLUTION OF PARLIAMENTARY DISAGREEMENTS) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to provide—

- (a) that where the Legislative Council rejects or fails to pass in one month the Appropriation Bills, the Legislative Assembly may direct that the Bills be presented to the Governor for Royal Assent;
- (b) for simultaneous dissolution of both Houses of Parliament where the Houses disagree twice on a Bill that is not an Appropriation Bill;
- (c) for a joint sitting of both Houses of Parliament in the event that the disagreement persists after a simultaneous dissolution; and
- (d) for a referendum on the proposals in the Bill.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 19 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1258).

This Bill was defeated in the Legislative Council.

*ACTS AMENDMENT (SEXUAL ASSAULTS) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce categories of sexual assault punishable according to degrees of violence on a scale from four years to a maximum penalty of twenty years for the worst types of sexual assault. The Bill also seeks to alter the procedures at the trial of a person accused of sexual assault.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 3 September 1985 (P.D.p. 699).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Council. (Act No. 74 of 1985—assented to 20 November 1985.)

*ACTS AMENDMENT (STATE PLANNING COMMISSION) BILL 1985

This Bill is complementary to the State Planning Commission Bill 1985 and its purpose is to make the necessary consequential legislative changes to enable the establishment of the State Planning Commission.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 24 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3001). This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly.

(Act No. 92 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985)

*ACTS AMENDMENT (WATER AUTHORITIES) BILL 1985

— The purpose of this Bill is to make some minor alterations to the procedures and practices of the Water Authority, in particular the extension of the four-payment option for settling Water Authority accounts for country people.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 22 October 1985 (P.D.p. 2663).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly.

(Act No. 110 of 1985—assented to 17 December 1985)

*ADOPTION OF CHILDREN AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to implement the recommendations of the Select Committee into the Adoption of Children Bill. In particular it provides for—

- (a) the formalisation of the existing adoption contact register;
- (b) the approval of organisations as adoption agencies; and
- (c) the right of an adopted person to obtain an original birth certificate.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 22 October 1985 (P.D.p. 2682).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Council.

(Act No. 108 of 1985—assented to 13 December 1985)

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to abolish three fruit sales advisory committees and transfer their functions to the Western Australian Fruit Advisory Council.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 21 August 1985 (P.D.p. 145). (Act No. 47 of 1985—assented to 3 October 1985.)

ALUMINA REFINERY (MITCHELL PLATEAU) AGREEMENT AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify an agreement between the State and the current joint venturers under the Alumina Refinery (Mitchell Plateau) Agreement Act 1971 to establish an alumina refinery in the Kimberley region.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 5 November 1985 (P.D.p. 3577).

(Act No. 90 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

APPROPRIATION (CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and from the Public Account certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the year ending 30 June 1986 and to supplement grants made by the present Parliament during the Second Session in adjustment of the Vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1984-85" for changes during the year ended 30 June 1985.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 10 October 1985 (P.D.p. 2097). (Act No. 111 of 1985—assented to 17 December 1985.)

APPROPRIATION (GENERAL LOAN FUND) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to appropriate and apply from the General Loan Fund certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the year ending 30 June 1986 and to supplement grants made by the present Parliament during the Second Session in adjustment of the Vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1984-85" for charges during the year ended 30 June 1985.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 10 October 1985 (P.D.p 2097). (Act No. 112 of 1985—assented to 13 December 1985.)

AUSTRALIA ACTS (REQUEST) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify Commonwealth and United Kingdom legislation which will sever remaining constitutional links between Australia and the United Kingdom.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 17 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1018).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly. (Act No. 65 of 1985—assented to 6 November 1985.)

AUTHORITY FOR INTELLECTUALLY HANDICAPPED PERSONS BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to establish an authority for intellectually handicapped persons, which shall be independent of the Health Department. The Bill also provides for the licensing of non-Government services for the intellectually handicapped.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 26 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1668).

(Act No. 68 of 1985—assented to 15 November 1985.)

BARROW ISLAND ROYALTY AGREEMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify an agreement between the State and West Australian Petroleum Pty. Ltd. (WAPET) that substitutes a resource rent royalty for the existing ad valorem provisions.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 7 November 1985 (P.D.p. 3935).

This Bill was discharged in the Legislative Assembly.

BARROW ISLAND ROYALTY TRUST ACCOUNT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to establish a trust fund for the receipt of royalty revenue from Barrow Island.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 7 November 1985 (P.D.p. 3937).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly. (Act No. 114 of 1985—assented to 13 December 1985.)

BARROW ISLAND ROYALTY VARIATION AGREEMENT BILL 1985

This Bill replaces the Barrow Island Royalty Agreement Bill 1985. Its purpose is to ratify an agreement between the State and West Australian Petroleum Pty. Ltd. (WAPET) which replaces the *ad valorem* royalty with a resource rent royalty.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 12 November 1985 (P.D.p. 4090).

(Act No. 113 of 1985—assented to 7 January 1986.)

*BLF (DEREGISTRATION) BILL 1985 (Hon. G. E. Masters)

The purpose of this Bill is to deregister the Builders' Labourers' Federation (BLF, WA). This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Council on 3 September 1985 (P.D.p. 648). Lapsed in the Legislative Council on conclusion of Session.

BLOOD DONATION (LIMITATION OF LIABILITY) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to protect the Red Cross Society, hospitals, doctors and blood donors from claims relating to the transmission of the disease Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS).

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 29 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3145). (Act No. 88 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985).

CAMBALLIN FARMS (AIL HOLDINGS PTY. LTD.) AGREEMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify an agreement between the State and Camballin Farms Pty. Ltd. relating to the development and management of irrigable lands in the Fitzroy River area.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 22 October 1985 (P.D.p. 2689). (Act No. 71 of 1985—assented to 20 November 1985).

CASINO CONTROL AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to ensure that officers and inspectors engaged to police the Act are employed under the provisions of the Public Service Act.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Council on 17 October 1985 (P.D.p.2494). (Act No. 64 of 1985—assented to 5 November 1985.)

COAL MINE WORKERS' (PENSIONS) AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to make provision for lump sum payments to beneficiaries of single mineworkers,

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 17 October 1985 (P.D.p. 2524). (Act No. 75 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985).

COLLIE COAL (WESTERN COLLIERIES) AGREEMENT AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify an amendment agreement between the State and Western Collieries Ltd. with respect to development of the Western No. 7 underground coal mine at Collie.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 17 October 1985 (P.D.p. 2525). (Act No. 76 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985).

*COMMERCIAL ARBITRATION BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for a uniform system of arbitration for the settlement of disputes arising from commercial agreements.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Council on 21 February 1985 (P.D.p. 172). This Bill was amended in the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly. (Act No. 109 of 1985—assented to 7 January 1986).

COMMERCIAL TENANCY (RETAIL SHOPS) AGREEMENTS AMENDMENT BILL 1985 (Mr Court)

The purpose of this Bill is to exempt certain short-term leases and arrangements, whereby tenants use that part of the common areas in shopping centres immediately in front of their shops, from the provisions of the Act.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 18 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1188).

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on conclusion of the Session.

COMMERCIAL TENANCY (RETAIL SHOPS) AGREEMENTS AMENDMENT BILL (No. 2) 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the definition of "lease" to clarify the position with respect to the use of common areas in shopping centres by retailers and charity groups.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 18 September 1985(P.D.p 1171).

(Act No. 49 of 1985—assented to 28 October 1985.)

CONSERVATION AND LAND MANAGEMENT AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to allow duck shooting on specified nature reserves. This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 24 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3002). (Act No. 86 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985).

*CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY PORTABLE PAID LONG SERVICE LEAVE BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to establish a scheme of portability of long service leave in the building and construction industry.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 17 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1026).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Council. (Act No. 72 of 1985—assented to 13 December 1985).

*CONTRACEPTIVES AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to allow more retail outlets to sell condoms as a preventative measure to lessen the spread of Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS).

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 21 August 1985 (P.D.p. 145). (Act No. 61 of 1985—assented to 5 November 1985.)

*CRIMINAL INJURIES COMPENSATION BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to—

- (a) extend the range of eligible claimants;
- (b) provide a discretion for applications to be determined without a hearing;
- (c) transfer the responsibility for recovery of compensation to the Crown; and
- (d) prevent an award against an acquitted person.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 29 August 1985 (P.D.p. 582).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Council.

(Act No. 73 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

*CRIMINAL LAW AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to—

- (a) provide for quicker and less expensive procedures for the disposition of minor assault charges;
- (b) define the offences for which a person may be arrested without a warrant; and
- (c) widen the provisions for restitution and compensation.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Council on 30 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3211).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Council.

(Act No. 119 of 1985—assented to 17 December 1985.)

*ELECTORAL AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to—

- (a) provide for optional preferential voting;
- (b) include party designations on ballot papers;
- (c) alter the criteria for forfeiture of candidates deposits;
- (d) increase the time between the issue of the writ and closure of the rolls;
- (e) reduce the time between issue of the writ and polling day;
- (f) close the polls at 6 p.m.;
- (g) make it an offence to distribute or publish misleading or deceptive material to electors; and
- (h) align State and Commonwealth rolls as far as possible.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 21 August 1985 (P.D.p. 164).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Council. It was subsequently referred to a Conference of Managers, which failed to agree.

*ELECTORAL AMENDMENT BILL (No. 2) 1985

This Bill is complementary to the Commonwealth's Australian Citizenship Act.

Its purpose is to delete reference to "British subject" and instead to refer to a fixed list of countries for the purposes of enrolment entitlement.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 13 November 1985 (P.D.p. 4304).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly.

(Act No. 104 of 1985—assented to 7 December 1985.)

ELECTORAL DISTRICTS AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to require the electoral boundary commissioners to—

- (a) invite suggestions relating to the distribution of boundaries; and
- (b) give consideration to demographic trends when determining electoral boundaries.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 21 August 1985 (P.D.p. 170).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly.

(Act No. 62 of 1985—assented to 5 November 1985.)

EQUAL ELECTORAL RIGHTS (REFERENDUM) BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for a referendum on the question of equal electoral rights.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 26 November 1985 (P.D.p. 5067).

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on conclusion of the Session.

FATAL ACCIDENTS AMENDMENT BILL 1985 (Restored from previous Session)

The purpose of this Bill is to extend the class of persons who can claim compensation under the Fatal Accidents Act.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Council on 22 March 1984 (P.D.p. 6463).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly.

(Act No. 97 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

*FINANCIAL ADMINSTRATION AND AUDIT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to—

- (a) make departmental heads and boards of management of statutory authorities responsible for the financial administration of their respective bodies;
- (b) place time constraints on the presentation of an annual report;
- (c) modify the keeping of and reporting on the Treasurer's accounts; and
- (d) enable the Auditor General to assess financial performance.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 19 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1265).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council. (Act No. 117 of 1985—assented to 30 December 1985.)

FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS DUTY AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to reduce the primary rate of duty from three cents to two cents per \$100.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 29 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3125) (Act No. 81 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

*FIRE BRIGADES AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for—

- (a) an employee representative on the Fire Brigades Board;
- (b) powers to undertake fire-related services, and charge fees for those services:
- (c) commercial marketing of technological developments;
- (d) the use of Valuer General's rolls as a means of apportioning local government contributions to the Board's operations.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 22 August 1985 (P.D.p. 297). (Act No. 51 of 1985—assented to 23 October 1985.)

*FIRE BRIGADES SUPERANNUATION BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to—

- (a) provide for greater employee participation in the management of the superannuation and disability funds;
- (b) widen the scope of the fund's investment powers; and
- (c) extend membership eligibility to employees of certain associated employers.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 29 October 1985 (P.D.p 3144). (Act No. 87 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

FORREST PLACE AND CITY STATION DEVELOPMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for a formal agreement between the State, Perth City Council and Westrail to enable the redevelopment of Forrest Place and the city station area.

This Bill was introduced into the Lorisleting Assembly as 5 N.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 5 November 1985 (P.D.p 3576).

(Act No. 106 of 1985—assented to 17 December 1985.)

*GAS STANDARDS AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to control the sale, hire or advertising of gas appliances which do not have current approval by a recognised body.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 21 August 1985 (P.D.p. 147). (Act No. 63 of 1985—assented to 5 November 1985.)

HEALTH AMENDMENT BILL (No. 2) 1985 (Hon I. D. Thompson)

The purpose of this Bill is to require medical practitioners to advise the Commissioner of Health if a patient has Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS), although the identity of the patient should not be revealed. It also seeks to oblige AIDS sufferers or parents of children with AIDS to have regular contact with a medical practitioner, and provide for penalties for people who knowingly pass on AIDS.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 25 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1558).

This Bill was defeated in the Legislative Assembly.

INDUSTRIAL TRAINING AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for formal legislative recognition of traineeships offered under the Skills West 1985 programme.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 12 November 1985 (P.D.p. 4103).

(Act No. 103 of 1985—assented to 7 December 1985.)

IRON ORE (CLEVELAND-CLIFFS) AGREEMENT AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify an amendment agreement between the State and the participants of the Cliffs project in the central Hamersley Ranges.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 29 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3187). (Act No. 95 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

IRON ORE (DAMPIER MINING COMPANY LIMITED) AGREEMENT AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify an amendment agreement between the State and Broken Hill Proprietary Minerals Limited relating to the production of iron ore in the central Hamersley Ranges.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 29 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3186). (Act No. 94 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

*LAND TITLES BILL 1985

This Bill did not proceed to the second reading.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on conclusion of Session.

LAW SOCIETY PUBLIC PURPOSES TRUST BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to give statutory recognition to the payment of interest on funds held in solicitors' trust accounts.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Council on 3 September 1985 (P.D.p. 647). (Act No. 60 of 1985—assented to 28 October 1985.)

LIQUOR AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to permit the conduct of trade promotion lotteries on licensed premises.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Council on 2 April 1985 (P.D.p. 1600). (Act No. 50 of 1985—assented to 23 October 1985.)

*LIQUOR LICENSING (MORATORIUM) AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to extend the moratorium on the granting of certain liquor licences and permits until 31 December 1986.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Council on 24 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1367).

(Act No. 55 of 1985—assented to 28 October 1985.)

LOAN BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to authorise the raising of a sum of ninety million dollars by loan for the construction of certain public works and for other purposes.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 23 October 1985 (P.D.p. 2816). (Act No. 116 of 1985—assented to 13 December 1985.)

*LOCAL GOVERNMENT AMENDMENT BILL (No. 2) 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to provide local government with more autonomy with respect to the control of eating areas in public places, authorisation of interstate travel, licensed street trading, the delegation of power to council officers and the construction and management of certain types of commercial premises.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 24 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1398).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council. (Act No. 99 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

LOCAL GOVERNMENT AMENDMENT BILL (No. 3) 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to phase in a change from unimproved valuations to gross rental valuations for the purposes of assessing rates payable.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 14 November 1985 (P.D.p. 4472).

(Act No. 105 of 1985—assented to 7 December 1985.)

*LOCAL GOVERNMENT GRANTS AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to alter the constitution of the Local Government Grants Commission by replacing the Treasury representative with a representative from the Country Urban Councils' Association.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 29 August 1985 (P.D.p. 581).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly.

(Act No. 56 of 1985—assented to 28 October 1985.)

*MEDICAL AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to—

- (a) provide consumer representation on the Medical Board;
- (b) allow more flexible advertising by medical practitioners;
- (c) provide for the approval and control of organisations providing after hours emergency services;
- (d) update the provisions for investigating misconduct by a medical practitioner; and
- (e) increase the penalties for misconduct.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 24 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1401).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Assembly.

(Act No. 70 of 1985—assented to 15 November 1985.)

*MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT (FINANCIAL INTERESTS) BILL (No. 2) 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to require members of State Parliament to register publicly their financial interests.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 29 August 1985 (P.D.p. 581). Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on conclusion of the Session.

*MINING AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to—

- (a) restrict the granting of a special prospecting licence for gold;
- (b) provide for a right of renewal of a mining lease for a further 21 days;
- (c) empower the Minister to exempt certain leaseholders from the expenditure condition;
- (d) establish a tribunal to resolve disputes between miners and farmers; and
- (e) create penalties for failure to lodge royalty returns and production details.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 13 March 1985 (P.D.p. 884).

OCCUPIERS LIABILITY BILL 1984 (Restored from previous Session)

The purpose of this Bill is to abolish the existing categories and labels relating to the liability of an occupier of premises, and to apply the general principles of the law of negligence.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Council on 21 November 1984 (P.D.p. 4368).

The Bill was amended in the Legislative Council. (Act No. 52 of 1985—assented to 28 October 1985.)

OFFENDERS PROBATION AND PAROLE AMENDMENT BILL (No. 2) 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to—

- (a) give the sentencing court a very wide discretion to decline to fix a minimum term; and
- (b) alter the composition of the Parole Board.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Council on 24 October 1985 (P.D.p. 2919).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Council.

(Act No. 118 of 1985—assented to 17 December 1985.)

OIL REFINERY INDUSTRY (ANGLO-IRANIAN OIL COMPANY LIMITED) AMEND-MENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify an agreement between the State and B.P. Refinery (Kwinana) Pty. Ltd. relating to financial concessions by the State and certain obligations to other companies operating in the Kwinana area.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 22 October 1985 (P.D.p. 2693). (Act No. 80 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

PARLIAMENTARY PAPERS AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to exempt the staff of the Parliament and the Government Printer from liability for any defamatory material contained in copies of Members' speeches.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Council on 20 February 1985 (P.D.p. 71).

This Bill was amended in the Legislative Council.

PAY-ROLL TAX AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to reduce the rate of payroll tax from 4.75% to 4% for businesses with annual payrolls of less than \$880 000 and a tapered reduction for businesses with annual payrolls of between \$880 000 and \$1.408 million.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 29 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3159). (Act No. 82 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

PAY-ROLL TAX ASSESSMENT AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to—

- (a) increase the level of exemption from payroll tax;
- (b) exempt local government associations from payroll tax; and
- (c) exempt wages paid to government sponsored trainees from payroll tax.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 29 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3125). (Act No. 83 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

*QUEEN ELIZABETH II MEDICAL CENTRE BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to enable the Queen Elizabeth II Medical Centre Trust to be responsible for the day to day management of the site of the Centre.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 24 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1400).

The purpose of this Bill is to complete the reservation of the Star Swamp area in Whitfords.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 17 October 1985 (P.D.p. 2524). (Act No. 66 of 1985—assented to 15 November 1985.)

ROAD TRAFFIC AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to provide aged pensioners with a total exemption from motor vehicle drivers licence fees and other pensioners with a 50% exemption.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 30 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3280). (Act No. 89 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

RURAL ADJUSTMENT AND FINANCE CORPORATION BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to enable the Rural Adjustment and Finance Corporation to administer the new Commonwealth-State agreement under which the State can subsidise loans to farmers.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 7 November 1985 (P.D.p. 3828).

RURAL MORTGAGE PROTECTION AND RELIEF BILL 1985 (Mr Crane)

The purpose of this Bill is to prevent the forced sale of farms by mortgagees at less than 80% of the assessed value.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 25 September 1985 (P.D.p. 1564).

This Bill was defeated in the Legislative Assembly.

SKELETON WEED AND RESISTANT GRAIN INSECTS (ERADICATION FUNDS) AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to extend the legislation covering skeleton weed eradication for a further three years and to increase the levy on grain growers.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 15 October 1985 (P.D.p. 2285). (Act No. 67 of 1985—assented to 15 November 1985.)

STAMP AMENDMENT BILL 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to—

- (a) exempt from the duty all residential leases and tenancy agreements up to \$80 per week; and
- (b) exempt from the duty transfers of corporate debt securities.

This Bill was introduced into the Legislative Assembly on 29 October 1985 (P.D.p. 3158). (Act No. 84 of 1985—assented to 4 December 1985.)

STAMP AMENDMENT BILL (No. 2) 1985

The purpose of this Bill is to set out the rates of duty payable on transactions by members of the Stock Exchange of the United Kingdom.
