## SYNOPSIS OF BILLS

### 2008 – 2009

The following synopsis of Bills introduced during the First Session of the Thirty-Eighth Parliament is intended only to give a brief outline of the main features of each Bill at the stage when the second reading motion of the Bill was moved. The full second reading speech for each Bill is available in *Parliamentary Debates (Hansard)* which are available from the State Law Publisher or from the Parliament website: [www.parliament.wa.gov.au](http://www.parliament.wa.gov.au). The ultimate stage reached by each Bill is also indicated. While it does not take into account amendments made in either House, reference can be made to the *Votes and Proceedings* of the Legislative Assembly and the *Minutes* of the Legislative Council where amendments have been agreed to.

- \* Indicates the Act, or parts thereof, comes into operation on a date or dates to be fixed by Proclamation.
- LC Indicates the Bill originated in the Legislative Council; all other Bills without LC originated in the Legislative Assembly.

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#### **Aboriginal Housing Legislation Amendment Bill 2009\* (No. 086)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Housing Act 1980*; and the *Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority Act 1972*, to provide for the first time an appropriate legal framework for improving housing management outcomes in Aboriginal communities. This will apply to an estimated 80 per cent of Aboriginal people living in remote communities in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p 8027b).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 26 November 2009.

#### **Acts Amendment (Bankruptcy) Bill 2009 (LC No. 037)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend over 90 State Acts to reflect changes made to the Bankruptcy Act 1966 (Commonwealth) which made technical amendments to the agreement process between a debtor and a creditor regarding bankruptcy.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 1 April 2009 (P.D.p 2450b).

(Act No. 18 of 2009 – assented to on 16 September 2009).

#### **Acts Amendment (Safety and Human Rights of Persons in Custody) Bill 2009\* (No. 072) (Hon E. Ripper)**

The purpose of this Bill is for an Act to amend the *Inspector of Custodial Services Act 2003*, *Prisons Act 1981*, *Court Security and Custodial Services Act 1999*, *Criminal Law (Mentally Impaired Accused) Act 1996* and the *Young Offenders Act 1994*, in order to enshrine into Western Australian law mechanisms to ensure that humane and safe custodial conditions are consistently and universally maintained.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 September 2009 (P.D.p 7188b).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 26 November 2009.

**Acts Amendment (Weapons) Bill 2009 (No. 088)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend *The Criminal Code* and the *Weapons Act 1999* in order to provide a valuable tool for Western Australia Police to ensure that places where the public gather are safe and for the courts to apply appropriate penalties to punish those people in accordance with public expectations.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p 8025b).

(Act No. 34 of 2009 – assented to on 3 December 2009).

**Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Capital 2007-08 and 2008-09 (Supplementary) Bill 2009 (No. 090)**

The purpose of this Bill is to appropriate out of the Consolidated Account a sum for capital payments made during the year ended 30 June 2008 under the authority of the *Financial Management Act 2006* and the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2008*; and a sum for capital payments made during the year ended 30 June 2009 under the authority of the *Financial Management Act 2006* and the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2009*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 October 2009 (P.D.p 8173b).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 26 November 2009.

**Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Capital 2009-10 Bill 2009 (No. 049)**

The purpose of this Bill is to grant supply and to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Account certain sums for the capital purposes of the year ending 30 June 2010.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 May 2009 (P.D.p 4080b).

(Act No. 13 of 2009 – assented to on 29 June 2009).

**Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Recurrent 2007-08 and 2008-09 (Supplementary) Bill 2009 (No. 091)**

The purpose of this Bill is to appropriate out of the Consolidated Account a sum for recurrent payments made during the year ended 30 June 2008 under the authority of the *Financial Management Act 2006* and the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2008*; and a sum for recurrent payments made during the year ended 30 June 2009 under the authority of the *Financial Management Act 2006* and the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2009*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 October 2009 (P.D.p 8172b).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 26 November 2009.

**Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Recurrent 2009-10 Bill 2009 (No. 048)**

The purpose of this Bill is to grant supply and to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Account certain sums for the recurrent services and purposes of the year ending 30 June 2010.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 May 2009 (P.D.p 4073c).

(Act No. 12 of 2009 – assented to on 29 June 2009).

**Approvals and Related Reforms (No. 1) (Environment) Bill 2009\* (LC No. 094)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* to remove duplicative or unnecessary appeal rights, align appeal periods across regulatory processes and to permit decision making authorities to approve minor and preliminary works to which the Environmental Protection Authority has consented.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 19 November 2009 (P.D.p 9406b).

Referred to Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 19 November 2009.

This Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 1 December 2009.

**Approvals and Related Reforms (No. 2) (Mining) Bill 2009\* (LC No. 102)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide that mine closure plans are required to be submitted with mining proposals and reviewed on a regular basis to ensure that they are up to date. The Bill also provides that mining tenement documents can be lodged at any office of the mining registrar, including Perth, rather than at the office where the mining tenement is located.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 19 November 2009 (P.D.p 9405e).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 1 December 2009.

**Approvals and Related Reforms (No. 3) (Crown Land) Bill 2009\* (No. 100)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend various Acts so as to provide efficiencies in the processes for giving notices, applying for approvals and doing various other things under those Acts which relate to the use and development of, or dealings with, Crown land and freehold land held in the name of the State.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 November 2009 (P.D.p 9263b).

**Approvals and Related Reforms (No. 4) (Planning) Bill 2009\* (No. 101)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Planning and Development Act 2005* to streamline and improve the approvals process.

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 26 November 2009.

#### **Arson Legislation Amendment Bill 2009\* (No. 085)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Bush Fires Act 1954* and *The Criminal Code* in order to strengthen protection to persons and property provided by arson-related offences, it will introduce a new bushfires offence, clarify the applicability of existing offences against the person to harm caused by fire, and increase the maximum penalties available under existing offences.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p 8026b).

Referred to Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 11 November 2009.

#### **Bookmakers Betting Levy Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 078)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Bookmakers Betting Levy Act 1954*, abolishing the two per cent betting levy on horse and greyhound racing payable by Western Australian bookmakers to race clubs registered with Racing and Wagering Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 September 2009 (P.D.p 7558b).

#### **Building and Construction Industry Training Fund and Levy Collection Amendment Bill 2009 (LC No. 031)**

The purpose of this Bill is to remove doubt as to validity of all levies imposed by the *Building and Construction Industry Training Levy Act 1990* and paid in accordance with the *Building and Construction Industry Training Fund and Levy Collection Act 1990* by retrospectively validating those payments.

#### **Bush Fires Amendment Bill 2009\* (No. 073)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Bush Fires Act 1954* and the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* in order to address issues relating to bushfire suppression, prevention and prosecution, and will improve the coordination and collaboration of effective fire management in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 September 2009 (P.D.p 7150a).

**Busselton Water Board (Supply of Water to Dunsborough) Bill 2009 (No. 060)**

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate the supply of water to the Dunsborough area by enabling the Busselton Water Board to supply water to the Water Corporation, and extending the application of the *Water Boards Act 1904* in respect of that supply.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 June 2009 (P.D.p 5167b).

**Butane Products Control Bill 2009\* (No. 041) (Mr R. Cook)**

The purpose of this Bill is to reduce the incidence of illness and death related to the use of butane products by prohibiting the supply of butane products to young persons.

**Cannabis Law Reform Bill 2009\* (No. 087)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Misuse of Drugs Act 1981*, *Spent Convictions Act 1988*, *Young Offenders Act 1994* and the *Cannabis Control Act 2003* in order to discourage the use of cannabis in the community.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p 8022c).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 26 November 2009.

**Child Exploitation Material and Classification Legislation Amendment Bill 2009\* (LC No. 043)**

The purpose of this Bill is to protect children and the community in Western Australia by improving and strengthening Western Australia's criminal laws dealing with child pornography.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 6 May 2009 (P.D.p 3396c).

Referred to Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 6 May 2009.

Referred to Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 18 August 2009.

This Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 1 December 2009.

**Child Support (Adoption of Laws) Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 098)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Child Support (Adoption of Laws) Act 1990*, in order that recent amendments to the Commonwealth legislation are reflected in Western Australia legislation, ensuring that the child support scheme can apply to and benefit all children in the State.



The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 2009 (P.D.p 9770b).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 26 November 2009.

#### **Co-operatives Bill 2009\* (No. 024)**

The purpose of this bill is to replace the *Companies (Co-operative) Act 1943* and the *Co-operative and Provident Societies Act 1903* with legislation that reflects the current commercial and social environment of co-operatives in Western Australia. The bill is in response to the co-operative industry's request for more modern legislation that will facilitate interstate trade and the growth of the co-operatives sector.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 March 2009 (P.D.p 2044b).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 10 September 2009.

(Act No. 24 of 2009 – assented to on 22 October 2009).

#### **Commercial Tenancy (Retail Shops) Amendment Bill 2009\* (No. 081) (Hon F. Logan)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Commercial Tenancy (Retail Shops) Agreements Act 1985* to create the position of small business commissioner, which will provide much-needed protection for small retail business tenants in their dealings with landlords.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p 8059b).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 26 November 2009.

#### **Criminal Code Amendment Bill 2008\* (No. 014)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend *The Criminal Code* to provide that when a person assaults a police officer and causes the officer bodily harm the person must be sentenced to a term of imprisonment.

#### **Criminal Code Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2009 (No. 105)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend *The Criminal Code* to make it a crime to cause fear or alarm to a driver either by causing an object or substance to be directed at or near, or placed in or near the path of a conveyance; or directing a laser pointer or a narrow beam of light at a conveyance.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 November 2009 (P.D.p 9271b).

(Act No. 44 of 2009 – assented to on 3 December 2009).

**Criminal Code Amendment (Graffiti) Bill 2009\* (No. 068)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend *The Criminal Code* in order to strengthen the deterrent effect of the law by increasing existing statutory penalties and introducing new ones. The bill will also introduce a preventative function by curbing the availability of what the bill terms graffiti implements.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 August 2009 (P.D.p 6160b).

(Act No. 26 of 2009 – assented to on 17 November 2009).

**Criminal Code Amendment (Identity Crime) Bill 2009\* (No. 104)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Criminal Code* to create offences for the make, use, supply or possession of identification material with the intent that the material be used to commit, or facilitate the commission of, an indictable offence; and the possession of equipment capable of making, using, supplying, or retaining identification material with the intent that that equipment be used to either commit or facilitate the commission of an indictable offence.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 November 2009 (P.D.p 9269b).

Referred to Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 26 November 2009.

This Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 1 December 2009.

**Criminal Code (Identity Theft) Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 045) (Mr J. Quigley)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Criminal Code* in order to make it an offence to possess someone else's identity or to pass someone else's identity information onto another person.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 6 May 2009 (P.D.p 3469a).

This Second Reading was not agreed to by the Legislative Assembly on 16 September 2009.

**Criminal Code (Identity Theft) Amendment Bill (No.2) 2009 (No. 092) (Mr J. Quigley)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Criminal Code* to render unlawful obtaining or dealing with another entity's identification and/or the possession of equipment capable of copying another person's identification documentation for the purpose of committing an offence.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p 8060b).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 26 November 2009.

**Criminal Code (Rock Throwing and Laser Pointing) Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 099) (Mr J. Quigley)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Criminal Code* to render it unlawful to endanger the safety of a person or the safe use of a vehicle by throwing an object or by a similar activity.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 November 2009 (P.D.p 8806b).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 26 November 2009.

**Criminal Investigation Amendment Bill 2009\* (No. 089)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Criminal Investigation Act 2006* in order to allow police officers to stop and search people and vehicles in entertainment precincts without the consent of the person and without the need for the usual reasonable suspicion test.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p 8024b).

Referred to Standing Committee on Legislation on 26 November 2009.

This Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 1 December 2009.

**Cross-border Justice Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 056)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Cross-border Justice Act 2008* in order to introduce a collaborative system of justice administration in the region where the borders of Western Australia, South Australia and the Northern Territory meet.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 June 2009 (P.D.p 5166b).

Referred to Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 9 September 2009.

This Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 1 December 2009.

**Daylight Savings Amendment Bill 2009\* (LC No. 040) (Hon A. Fels)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Daylight Savings Act 2006* to provide for the holding of a referendum in conjunction with a general election and for the abridgement of the daylight savings trial period.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 1 April 2009 (P.D.p 2450c).

This Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 1 December 2009.

**Electoral Amendment (Miscellaneous) Bill 2008\* (LC No. 004)**

A Bill to amend the *Electoral Act 1907* so that, prisoners serving a sentence of less than one year will be allowed to vote in state elections, citizens who have no fixed address will be allowed to vote in a state elections and provision for inclusion of dates of birth on the electoral role.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 11 November 2008 (P.D.p 59b).

**Equal Opportunity Amendment Bill 2009\* (No. 046) (Hon M. Roberts)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Equal Opportunity Act 1984* to prohibit discrimination against mothers' breast feeding in a public place.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 May 2009 (P.D.p 3955a).

**Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Amendment (Compensation) Bill 2008\* (No. 019)**

The purpose of this Bill is to enable monetary compensation to be available in the following two situations; firstly to persons who have pursuant to a warrant of commitment, served more time in prison than was legislatively authorised, and secondly to persons who have, under a work and development order, undertaken additional work which also was not authorised by the legislation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 3 December 2008 (P.D.p 845b).

(Act No. 4 of 2009 – assented to on 14 May 2009).

**First Home Owner Grant Amendment Bill 2009\* (No. 021)**

The purpose of this bill is to amend the *First Home Owner Grant Act 2000*, firstly, to give legislative effect to the First Home Owners Boost scheme, announced by the commonwealth government on 14 October 2008; secondly, to limit the availability of the first home owner grant in the future to transactions involving a property valued at \$750 000 or less; and, thirdly, to make a number of minor amendments to improve the administrative arrangements applying under the act.

**Fish Resources Management Amendment Bill 2009\* (LC No. 084)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Fish Resources Management Act 1994* in order to implement changes to the Offshore Constitutional Settlement fisheries arrangements, abolish three statutory advisory committees, and modify some of the penalty provisions that currently apply under the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 14 October 2009 (P.D.p 7990b).

#### **Fisheries Adjustment Schemes Amendment Bill 2009 (LC No. 067)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Fisheries Adjustment Schemes Act 1987*, to allow commercial fishing authorisations and entitlements to be withdrawn from a fishery with appropriate compensation for affected licensed fishers.

#### **Gas Supply (Gas Quality Specifications) Bill 2009\* (No. 069)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the supply of gas that does not meet certain gas quality specifications; and the control of the quality of such gas and its impact on gas transmission pipelines; and the payment of compensation to certain gas consumers, operators of gas storage facilities who are adversely affected by receiving such gas; and a programme to modify or replace certain gas appliances and installations that might be rendered unsafe by the supply of such gas, in preparation for its supply; and the operation of an account for contributions by gas producers to the costs of the programme.

#### **Health and Disability Services Legislation Amendment Bill 2009\* (No. 064)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Health Services (Conciliation and Review) Act 1995*; and the *Disability Services Act 1993*; and various other Acts, to enable people with disabilities to make a complaint that a provider has acted unreasonably by not properly investigating a complaint or causing it to be properly investigated, or not taking or causing to be taken, proper action on the complaint. People with disabilities will also be able to complain when a provider has acted unreasonably by charging an excessive fee or otherwise acting unreasonably with respect to a fee.

**Higher Education Amendment Bill 2009\* (No. 093)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Higher Education Act 2004* to implement the revised national protocols for higher education approval processes. The protocols are the key element of a national quality assurance framework for Australian higher education. They are designed to ensure that consistent criteria and standards are applied across all states and territories.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 3 December 2008 (P.D.p 846b).

**Iron Ore Processing (Mineralogy Ptd Ltd) Agreement Amendment Bill 2008 (LC No. 015)**

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify a Variation Agreement to vary the State Agreement ratified by the *Iron Ore Processing (Mineralogy Pty Ltd) Agreement Act 2002*.

**Mines Safety and Inspection Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 095)**

The purpose of this Bill is to implement the new national third party access regime for natural gas pipeline systems in Western Australia, in order to improve governance arrangements for access regulation of natural gas pipelines and increase incentives for investment in new pipeline infrastructure.

These amendments will also affect the rules and principles applying to geothermal titles in the onshore legislation.

**Police Amendment Bill 2009\* (No. 071)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Police Act 1982* in order to provide police auxiliary officers with the same powers as police officers when performing secondary policing functions, unless the Commissioner of Police determines that such powers are not required.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 September 2009 (P.D.p 7152a).

(Act No. 42 of 2009 – assented to on 3 December 2009).

**Police (Medical and Other Expenses for Former Officers) Bill 2008\* (No. 005)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the payment of medical and other expenses incurred by former police officers and Aboriginal police liaison officers in respect of employment-related injuries.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 November 2008 (P.D.p 74c).

(Act No. 46 of 2008 – assented to on 10 December 2008).

**Prisoners (Interstate Transfer) Amendment Bill 2009 (LC No. 026)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Prisoners (Interstate Transfer) Act 1983* by introducing nationally agreed changes to the range of factors taken into account when a transfer of prisoner is requested.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 11 March 2009 (P.D.p 1576b).

**Professional Combat Sports Amendment Bill 2009\* (No. 074)**

**Professional Standards Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 044)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Professional Standards Act 1997* in order to facilitate the capping of occupational liability, while also protecting consumer interests through requirements for insurance and the implementation of risk management strategies and complaints and disciplinary procedures.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 May 2009 (P.D.p 3915b).

Referred to Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 10 September 2009.

**Property Law (Mortgagee's Power of Sale) Amendment Bill 2009\* (LC No. 070)  
(Hon S. Talbot)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Property Law Act 1969* to require a mortgagee or chargee, in exercising a power of sale in respect of mortgaged or charged land, to take reasonable care to ensure that the land is sold for not less than its market value.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 20 August 2009 (P.D.p 6245c).

**Public Sector Reform Bill 2009\* (No. 103)**

**Racing and Wagering Legislation Amendment Bill 2009\* (No. 076)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Betting Control Act 1954*, the *Gaming and Wagering Commission Act 1987* and the *Racing and Wagering Western Australia Act 2003* in order to establish a legislative framework to require both domestic and offshore betting operators who publish or use Western Australian race fields to pay the racing bets levy to the Gaming and Wagering Commission of Western Australia

**Racing Bets Levy Bill 2009 (No. 077)**

**Railway (Butler to Brighton) Bill 2009 (No. 075)**

The purpose of this Bill is to authorise the construction of a railway from Butler to Brighton.
