

Mines Ministers of Western Australia

A Mines Ministry was first established in the Forrest Government, the first Government, after responsible government was granted in 1890. There have been 38 Ministers for Mines in 35 Governments. Henry Gregory was Minister for Mines in six different Governments. Arthur Frederick Griffith was the longest continuous serving Minister for Mines in the Brand Government serving from 1959 to 1971.
