## SYNOPSIS OF BILLS

2007

The following synopsis of Bills introduced during the First Session of the Thirty-Seventh Parliament is intended only to give a brief outline of the main features of each Bill at the stage when the second reading motion of the Bill was moved. The full second reading speech for each Bill is available in *Parliamentary Debates (Hansard)* which are available from the State Law Publisher or from the Parliament of WA website: [www.parliament.wa.gov.au](http://www.parliament.wa.gov.au)). The ultimate stage reached by each Bill is also indicated. While it does not take into account amendments made in either House, reference can be made to the *Votes and Proceedings* of the Legislative Assembly and the *Minutes* of the Legislative Council where amendments have been agreed to.

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### Acts Amendment (Advance Health Care Planning) Bill 2006\* (No. 149)

[Name changed to Acts Amendment (Consent to Medical Treatment) Bill 2006]

This Bill reforms the law relating to medical treatment for the dying. This Bill is necessary to give people certainty when dealing with end of life issues, enabling terminally ill people to govern their medical treatment and protecting medical professionals who adhere to their wishes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 June 2006 (P.D.p. 4061).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 29 November 2006.

Short title of the Bill changed to Acts Amendment (Consent to Medical Treatment) Bill 2006.

### Acts Amendment (Consent to Medical Treatment) Bill 2006\* (No. 149)

[Name changed from Acts Amendment (Advance Health Care Planning) Bill 2006 (No. 149)]

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 5 September 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

### Acts Amendment (Justice) Bill 2007\* (No. 231)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the relevant Acts in order to allow for the improvement of procedural aspects of existing legislation necessary for the administration of justice.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5954).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Alcohol and Drug Authority Repeal 2005 (No. 070)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Alcohol and Drug Authority Act 1974*. The Bill dissolves the Western Australian Alcohol and Drug Authority and, as a consequence:

- staff employed by the Authority will be employed by the Minister for Health in his incorporated capacity pursuant to section 7 of the *Hospitals and Health Services Act 1927*; and
- all liabilities, rights and assets of the Authority will be appropriately invested in the Minister for Health.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 September 2005 (P.D.p. 5015).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**ANZAC Day Amendment Bill 2005 (No. 066)**

The Bill proposes the deletion of sections 5(4) and 7(3) of the principal Act as a result of the removal of the legislative restriction prohibiting race meetings or sporting events being held on Anzac Day if it falls on a Sunday.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2005 (P.D.p. 3596).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Bill (No. 1) 2007 (No. 204)**

The purpose of this Bill is to grant supply and to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Account certain sums for the recurrent services and purposes of the year ending 30 June 2008.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 May 2007 (P.D.p. 2100).

(Act No. 14 of 2007 – assented to on 29 June 2007)

**Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Bill (No. 2) 2007 (No. 205)**

The purpose of this Bill is to grant supply and to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Account certain sums for the capital purposes of the year ending 30 June 2008.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 May 2007 (P.D.p. 2107).

(Act No. 15 of 2007 – assented to on 29 June 2007)

**Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 5) 2006 (No. 178)**

This Bill provides for a sum to be appropriated from the Consolidated Fund the sum of \$247,117,833.38 for recurrent payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2006, for purposes and services as detailed in Schedule 1 of the Bill. These payments, which were all of an extraordinary and unforeseen nature, were made under authority of the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2005*.



The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 2 November 2006 (P.D.p. 8162).

(Act No. 16 of 2007 – assented to on 29 June 2007)

#### **Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 6) 2006 (No. 179)**

This Bill provides for a sum to be appropriated out of the Consolidated Fund for the purpose of capital payments made during the year ended 30 June 2006 under the authority of the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2005*

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 2 November 2006 (P.D.p. 8163).

(Act No. 17 of 2007 – assented to on 29 June 2007)

#### **Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Bill (No. 5) 2007 (No. 243)**

This Bill seeks to appropriate out of the Consolidated Account the sum of: \$298,768,898.32 for the recurrent payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2007 for the purposes and services detailed in Schedule 1 of the Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6694).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Bill (No. 6) 2007 (No. 244)**

This Bill seeks to appropriate out of the Consolidated Account the sum of: \$44,056,450.47 for capital payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 2007, for the purposes detailed in Schedule 1 of the Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6694).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Bail Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 217)**

The Bill implements the recommendations of the Doig Report. The Bill amends the *Bail Act 1982* and the *Supreme Court Act 1935* to accommodate new appeal provisions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3428).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 22 November 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Biosecurity and Agricultural Management Bill 2006\* (No. 118)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide effective biosecurity and agriculture management for Western Australia. It will achieve this by establishing an effective means of:

- controlling the entry, establishment, spread and impact of animal and plants pests and diseases;
- controlling the use of agricultural and veterinary chemicals;
- allowing standards to be set to ensure the safety and quality of agricultural products; and
- enabling certain funds to be raised for biosecurity related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 31 August 2006 (P.D.p. 5571).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 1 November 2006 and in the Legislative Council on 28 June 2007.

Referred to Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 7 December 2006.

(Act No. 23 of 2007 – assented to on 12 October 2007)

**Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Rates and Charges Bill 2006\* (No. 119)**

The purpose of this Bill is to impose the rates and any fee or charge referred to in the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Bill 2006, insofar as any of those rates, fees or charges are taxes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 31 August 2006 (P.D.p. 5574).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 7 December 2006.

(Act No. 21 of 2007 – assented to on 12 October 2007)

**Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Repeal and Consequential Provisions) Bill 2006\* (No. 117)**

The Bill provides for the repeal of the 17 Acts within the Agriculture portfolio that are to be replaced by the proposed Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act, and for savings and transitional arrangements required due to repeals. The Acts that are replaced are:

*Agricultural Produce (Chemical Residues) Act 1983*  
*Agricultural Products Act 1929*  
*Agricultural Protection Board Act 1950*  
*Agricultural and Related Resources Protection Act 1976*

*Fertilizers Act 1977*  
*Plant Diseases Act 1914*

*Seeds Act 1981*

*Stock (Identification and Movement) Act 1970*

*Stock Diseases (Regulations) Act 1968*

*Veterinary Chemical Control and Animal Feeding Stuffs Act 1976*

Referred to Standing Committee on Legislation on 7 December 2006.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 30 August 2007.

(Act No. 24 of 2007 – assented to on 12 October 2007)

### **Botanic Gardens and Parks Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 157) (Ms S.E. Walker)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the Sunset Hospital site (Reserve No. 1720) to be known as ‘Sunset Park’ and be protected under the *Botanic Gardens and Parks Act 1998*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 August 2006 (P.D.p. 5112).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

### **Casino (Burswood Island) Agreement Amendment Bill 2007 (LC No. 213)**

The purpose of this Bill is to ratify the Eleventh Supplementary Agreement, which in turn amends the *Casino (Burswood Island) Agreement Act 1985*. The Supplementary Agreement expands the purposes on which the Board may expend its funds and changes the composition of the Burswood Park Board.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 14 August 2007 (P.D.p. 3799).

The Bill passed the Third Reading stage in the Legislative Council but had not been introduced into the Legislative Assembly as at 6 December 2007.

### **Chemistry Centre (WA) Bill 2006\* (No. 121)**

The purpose of this Bill is to take the Chemistry Centre, an office within the Department of Industry and Resources, and establish it as a statutory authority.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 April 2006 (P.D.p. 1169).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 6 June 2007.

(Act No. 10 of 2007 – assented to on 29 June 2007)

### **Child Care Services Bill 2007\* (No. 208)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Children and Community Services Act 2004* to enable the transfer of the child care licensing functions of the Department for Child Protection (as the Department is now called) to the newly established Department for Communities. This will have a two-fold effect:

- ensuring that the primary focus of the Department for Child Protection is on protecting vulnerable children in our community and supporting their families; and
- ensuring that there is a clear focus on the important function of licensing child care services in our State.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 May 2007 (P.D.p. 2226).

(Act No. 19 of 2007 – assented to on 3 July 2007)

#### **Child Support (Adoption of Laws) Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 200)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Child Support (Adoption of Laws) Act 1990* by adopting recent changes to the relevant Commonwealth legislation to allow ex-nuptial children in Western Australia to be treated in the same way as nuptial children.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 May 2007 (P.D.p. 2225).

(Act No. 29 of 2007 – assented to on 31 October 2007)

#### **Children and Community Services Amendment (Body Piercing) Bill 2007 (No. 230) (Dr J. Woollard)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Children and Community Services Act 2004* in order to make it an offence for a person to pierce any part of the body of a child (defined in the Act as a person under the age of 18) without obtaining the written consent of the child's parent.

The Bill will provide the same penalty for body piercing a child under the age of 18 as already exists for tattooing or branding a child.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 August 2007 (P.D.p. 4501).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Children and Community Services Amendment (Reporting Sexual Abuse of Children) Bill 2007\* (No. 257)**

The purpose of the Bill is to introduce legislation for the mandatory reporting of child sexual abuse by amending the *Children and Community Services Act 2004*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7901).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Children and Community Services (Mandatory Reporting) Amendment Bill 2006\* (No. 162) (Hon P. Omodei)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Children and Community Services Act 2004* to provide for mandatory reporting of harm, or suspected harm, to children by abuse or neglect.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 November 2006 (P.D.p. 8049).

Second reading not agreed to in the Legislative Assembly on 21 November 2007.

### **Community Protection (Offender Reporting) Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 256)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide a valuable tool for the Western Australia Police to monitor offenders who pose a risk to the community, particularly those who pose a risk to children.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7897).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

### **Constitution Amendment Bill 2005\* (LC No. 001)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1899* by giving the President a deliberative vote on all questions that come before the House, and by removing the President's casting vote.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 30 March 2005 (P.D.p. 29).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

### **Contractual Benefits Bill 2007\* (No. 240)**

The purpose of this Bill is to restore the right of employees of constitutional corporations to make a claim for denied contractual benefits in the Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5958).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

### **Co-operatives Bill 2007\* (No. 160)**

The purpose of this Bill is to replace the existing *Companies (Co-operative) Act 1943* and the *Co-operative and Provident Societies Act 1903* with legislation that is reflective of the current commercial and social environment of co-operatives in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 November 2007 (P.D.p. 8036).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

### **Corruption and Crime Commission Amendment (Investigative Function) Bill 2007 (No. 262) (Hon P. Omodei)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Corruption and Crime Commission Act 2003* to enable the Corruption and Crime Commission and Western Australia Police to engage in joint taskforce operations to investigate offences independently of the Western Australia Police.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7933).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Criminal Code Amendment (Drink and Food Spiking) Bill 2007\* (No. 218)**

The purpose of this Bill is to insert into the Western Australian *Criminal Code* section 305, which expressly and specifically deals with drink and food spiking.

Specifically, the Bill will apply in two situations:

- where a person causes another person to be given or to consume drink or food containing an intoxicating substance where that other person is not aware of that intoxicating substance; and
- where a person causes another person to be given or to consume drink or food containing more intoxicating substance than the person receiving the drink or food would reasonably expect that drink or food to contain.

The Bill also provides a specific defence to these new offences. It will be a defence where an accused person had reasonable cause to believe that each person who was likely to consume the drink or food would not have objected to consuming the drink or food if the person was aware of the presence and quantity of the intoxicating substance in the drink or food.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3426).

(Act No. 31 of 2007 – assented to on 21 December 2007)

**Criminal Code Amendment (Sale of Spray Paint Cans) Bill 2007 (No. 248) (Mr T.R. Sprigg)**

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce legislation that makes it an offence for retailers to sell spray paint cans to minors under the age of 18.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7127).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Criminal Law and Evidence Amendment Bill 2006\* (No. 145)**

This Bill is an amalgamation of two proposed reform packages, amending the *Evidence Act 1906*, *The Criminal Code* and the *Criminal Procedure Act 2004*. This will give effect to procedural reforms in sexual assault cases in order to complete the reforms intended as part of the Sexual Assault Reforms Package. It will also amend *The Criminal Code*, the *Criminal Procedure Act 2004* and the *Criminal Appeals Act 2004* to provide for a right to appeal by the prosecution against acquittals in trials before juries and to remedy certain deficiencies in existing provisions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 June 2006 (P.D.p. 4211).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 2 November 2006.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 21 March 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Cross-border Justice Bill 2007\* (No. 236)**

This Bill seeks to break down the barriers that state borders create in the administration of justice in the cross-border region. The Bill will enable Western Australia to participate in cross-border justice schemes in conjunction with South Australia and the Northern Territory.

For cross-border schemes to operate, it will be necessary for each jurisdiction to have corresponding laws. Therefore the Bill will also serve as a model to be followed by the governments of South Australia and the Northern Territory.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6314).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 21 November 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Daylight Saving Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 192) (Mr B.J. Grylls)**

This Bill amends the *Daylight Saving Act 2006* by providing for a referendum to be held on 20 October 2007.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 March 2007 (P.D.p. 513).

Second reading not agreed to in the Legislative Assembly on 16 May 2007.

**Daylight Saving Amendment Bill (No. 3) 2007 (LC No. 246)**

This Bill amends the *Daylight Saving Act 2006* in order to change the timeframe for the proposed referendum on daylight saving. It changes the prescribed timeframe from between 10 May 2009 and 13 September 2009 to between 13 April 2008 and 18 May 2008.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 25 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6788).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Daylight Saving Amendment Bill (No.2) 2007 (No. 196)**

This Bill seeks to amend the *Daylight Saving Act 2006* by removing the months of February and March from the daylight saving trial and any future daylight saving model.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 March 2007 (P.D.p. 514).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Daylight Saving Bill 2006 (No. 174)**

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce daylight saving to the State of Western Australia for an initial period on 1 December 2006 with the finishing date of 25 March 2007.

The Bill has a 'sunset clause' which allows for a review to be undertaken by Parliament and presented to both Houses by 31 July 2009.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 October 2006 (P.D.p. 7648).

The Bill was discharged from the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper under Standing Order 144A on 13 November 2007.

**Dental Bill 2005\* (No. 113)**

This Bill provides for effective registration of persons practising dentistry and for dental prosthetics. It controls the use of the titles: dentist; dental prosthetist; dental therapist; school dental therapist; and dental hygienist. It seeks to prevent conduct from non-dental professionals that may be misleading to consumers and the general public. Importantly the Bill adequately identifies members of the dental profession, enabling consumers of dental services to make informed decisions when engaging a practitioner.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 November 2005 (P.D.p. 7646).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 May 2006

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Director of Public Prosecutions (Standing Committee) Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 181)**

This Bill amends the *Director of Public Prosecutions Act 1991* to establish a joint standing committee which oversees aspects of the role of the Director of Public Prosecutions.

This Bill was introduced and read a first time in the Legislative Assembly on 29 November 2006.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Duties Bill 2007 (No. 259)**

The purpose of this Bill, alongside the Duties Legislation Amendment Bill 2007, is to put in place a new duties regime to replace the outdated stamp duty arrangements that are currently imposed by the *Stamp Act 1921*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7893).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Duties Legislation Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 260)**

The purpose of this Bill, alongside the Duties Bill 2007, is to put in place a new duties regime to replace the outdated stamp duty arrangements that are currently imposed by the *Stamp Act 1921*.



The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7896).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Eastern Goldfields Transport Board Repeal Bill 2007 (No. 199)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Eastern Goldfields Transport Board Act 1984* and to amend certain other Acts as a consequence and for related purposes.

The Bill provides for existing employees of the Board to transfer to the Public Transport Authority on commencement of the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 May 2007 (P.D.p. 2311).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Election of Senators Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 211)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Election of Senators Act 1903* to bring it into conformity with the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918* with respect to the establishment of a date for the close of rolls for a federal election.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3431).

(Act No. 20 of 2007 – assented to on 4 September 2007)

#### **Electricity Corporations Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 132) (Mr M.W. Trenorden)**

The purpose of the Bill is to amend section 126 of the *Electricity Corporations Act 2005* to provide for dividend paying corporations. The Bill provides that the Electricity Networks Corporation must not pay any dividend.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 May 2006 (P.D.p. 2511).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Electricity Industry Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 224)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide the heads of power for regulations to be made to permanently exempt the Wholesale Electricity Market arrangement in Western Australia from the licensing requirements under Chapter 7 of the *Corporations Act 2001* of the Commonwealth (the 'Corporations Act').

The Bill will provide certainty for market participants regarding the application of Chapter 7 of the Corporations Act to the Wholesale Electricity Market arrangements in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 August 2007 (P.D.p. 4096).

(Act No. 32 of 2007 – assented to on 21 December 2007)

**Electricity Industry (Western Australian Renewable Energy Targets) Amendment Bill 2005\* (LC No. 097) (Hon P. Llewellyn)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Electricity Industry Act 2004* to impose, as a condition of holding a retail license to sell electricity in the South West interconnected system, an obligation to acquire target levels of electricity generated from renewable energy sources.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 1 December 2005 (P.D.p. 7964).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Employment Dispute Resolution Bill 2007\* (No. 239)**

This Bill develops the role of the Western Australian Industrial Relations Commission (WAIRC) in the provision of dispute resolution and mediation services. The Bill will enable parties to employment disputes the opportunity to avail themselves of the WAIRC's extensive experience in industrial dispute resolution.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5959).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Equal Opportunity Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 173)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend Part III of the *Equal Opportunity Act 1984*, which deals with discrimination on the grounds of race. The Bill inserts a new division into Part III entitled 'Racially Offensive Behaviour'. It will be unlawful for a person to do any act, otherwise in private, that is reasonably likely to offend, insult, humiliate or intimidate another person on the ground of race, or on the ground of a characteristic appertaining or imputed to persons of that race.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 November 2006 (P.D.p. 8015).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Fines Legislation Amendment Bill 2006\* (No. 161)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994* and the *Sentence Administration Act 2003*. The amendments will increase the level of flexibility of fines enforcement to assist people to pay fines whilst maintaining the integrity of the fine as a sentence. As a result, there will be a reduction in the number of people imprisoned for fine default only.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 September 2006 (P.D.p. 5857).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 28 November 2006 and in the Legislative Council on 5 December 2007.

The Bill passed the Third Reading stage in the Legislative Council but had not received Royal Assent before 31 December 2007.

#### **Fiona Stanley Hospital Construction Account Bill 2007 (No. 202)**

The purpose of this Bill is to set aside \$1.09 billion from the expected 2006–2007 cash surplus to fund the construction and establishment of the Fiona Stanley Hospital.

The Bill, when enacted, will create a statutory account to control and quarantine the money appropriated to it, and to ensure it is used for no purpose other than the construction of the Fiona Stanley Hospital.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 May 2007 (P.D.p. 2224).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 19 September 2007.

(Act No. 22 of 2007 – assented to on 3 October 2007).

#### **Fish Resources Management Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 148)**

This Bill amends the *Fish Resources Management Act 1994* to provide for adequate and appropriate State penalties and to strengthen the State forfeiture and seizure provisions in respect of foreign fishing offences committed in State coastal waters.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 June 2006 (P.D.p. 4068).

(Act No. 28 of 2007 – assented to on 26 October 2007)

#### **Food Bill 2005\* (No. 110)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the safety and suitability of food for human consumption, and for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 November 2005 (P.D.p. 7657).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 20 June 2006.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 22 June 2006.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Freedom of Information Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 191)**

The Bill's purpose is to ensure that the *Freedom of Information Act 1992* (the FOI Act) remains an effective tool in ensuring open and accountable government, by providing an effective regime for access to the information held by government.

The Bill includes amendments:

- relating to access to documents under the FOI Act;
- relating to the determination of complaints;
- relating to the ongoing review of the FOI Act and its operation; and
- which address practical problems relating to the operation of the FOI Act, and which are intended to enhance the effective operation of the FOI Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 March 2007 (P.D.p. 827).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

### **Gas and Electricity Safety Legislation Amendment Bill 2006\* (No. 030)**

This Bill amends the *Energy Coordination Act 1994*, the *Gas Standards Act 1972* and the *Electricity Act 1945* to improve the technical and safety regulation provisions in the energy industry legislation. Amendments are required to the legislation to ensure there is an effective technical and safety regulatory framework for the now fully privatised and competitive gas supply industry, as well as the increasingly competitive electricity supply industry.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 June 2006 (P.D.p. 3663).

(Act No. 5 of 2007 – assented to on 18 April 2007).

### **Gene Technology Amendment Bill 2005 (No. 018)**

This Bill provides for a person, who is the holder of a licence to deal with genetically modified organisms, to pay a charge for that licence. The amount of the charge is prescribed by regulations.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 7 April 2005 (P.D.p. 580).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

### **Greenhouse Gas Emission Reduction (Hot Water Systems) Bill 2007 (LC No. 263) (Hon P. Llewellyn)**

The purpose of this Bill is to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in Western Australia by providing that only efficient hot water systems may be offered for sale.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 6 December 2007 (P.D.p. 8249).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

### **Health (Fresh Produce – State or Territory of Origin) Amendment Bill 2005 (No. 067) (Mr D.T. Redman)**

This Bill provides for origin labelling of ‘fresh produce’ such as fruits, vegetables and nuts. It means that all fresh produce displayed for retail sale, originating from within the Commonwealth, must be labelled indicating the item’s state or territory of origin.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2005 (P.D.p. 3630).

Referred to the Legislative Assembly Economics and Industry Standing Committee on 29 June 2005. The Bill was investigated within the scope of the Committee's *Inquiry into the Production and Marketing of Foodstuffs* and, following the tabling of the Committee's report, was not restored to the Notice Paper.

### **Heritage of Western Australia (Crown Acquisition of Registered Places) Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 182) (Ms S.E. Walker)**

This Bill provides that an owner whose land has been entered in the Register of Heritage Places has the right to require the Crown to acquire the owner's estate or interest in the land at a price determined by reference to the value of the land before the entry was made in the register.

The Bill was introduced and read a first time in the Legislative Assembly on 23 November 2006.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

### **Human Reproductive Technology Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 194)**

The Bill amends the *Human Reproductive Technology Act 1991* (the HRT Act) in respect of the regulation of embryo research and prohibited practices that relate to reproductive technology. In summary, the amendments:

- retain the existing framework in relation to embryos created by fertilisation of human eggs by human sperm. Such embryos can only be created for the purpose of achieving pregnancy in women. If at the end of the assisted reproductive technology (ART) treatment the embryos are excess to the needs of the people to whom they were created they can be donated for research. Any use of the ART embryos for research will continue to be subject to the strict licensing requirements that are provided in the HRT Act;
- retain the ban on human cloning for reproductive purposes;
- allow for the creation of embryos by means other than fertilisation and the use of those embryos for research. Both the creation and the use of the embryo is subject to the same strict licensing that applies to excess ART embryos. Embryos created by means other than fertilisation cannot be developed by any means for more than 14 days and must not be used for reproductive purposes;
- require the tabling of reports prepared by the relevant Commonwealth Minister regarding the establishment of a national stem cell bank, a national register of excess ART embryos that have been donated for research and the feasibility of a national approach to non-blood human tissue-based therapies; and
- require the Western Australian Minister to cause a further independent review of the legislation in three years (which may be undertaken as part of the required review of the Commonwealth Acts).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 March 2007 (P.D.p. 831).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 18 September 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Indigenous Conservation Title Bill 2007\* (No. 237)**

The purpose of the Bill is to create a form of title that recognises Indigenous interests in the Rudall River National Park and the Gibson Desert Nature Reserve.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5798).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Industrial and Related Legislation Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 238)**

The primary objective of this Bill is to strengthen protections for vulnerable workers by addressing the following issues:

- child labour protections;
- occupational safety and health protections;
- protections for injured workers;
- access to the common law; and
- amendments to the *Industrial Relations Act 1979*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5957).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 24 October 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Industrial Relations (Prohibition of Bargaining Services Fees) Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 221) (Mr M.J. Cowper)**

The purpose of this Bill is to bring the *Industrial Relations Act 1979* into alignment with the Workplace Relations Amendment Bill currently before federal Parliament. The proposed amendments would insert an amendment into section 96A of the *Industrial Relations Act 1979* which deals with freedom of association. The purpose is to clarify and simplify the interpretation of 'bargaining services' and 'bargaining services fees'. A further proposed amendment would insert after section 96B a section to be known as 96BA which will expressly provide that any award, industrial agreement or order under the Act shall not include in it a 'bargaining services fee'.

The Bill was introduced and read a first time on 21 June 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Information Privacy Bill 2007\* (No. 193)**

This Bill will amend the *Freedom of Information Act 1992* and the *Parliamentary Commissioner Act 1971*, as well as other Acts. The Bill aims to:

- regulate the handling of personal information by the public sector;
- regulate the handling of health information by the public and private sectors;
- create a right to apply for access, and amendment of, health records held by the private sector; and
- facilitate the exchange of personal or health information held by the public sector in appropriate circumstances.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 March 2007 (P.D.p. 824).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Inheritance (Family and Dependants Provision) Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 234)**

The purpose of this Bill is to update and modernise the law in relation to family provision. In particular, this Bill will enable a claim to be made against a deceased estate by a step-child in two limited circumstances, and where there exists a duty to maintain a step-child or there is a legitimate expectation.

The Bill will also address the following areas of family law:

- kinship relationships;
- costs;
- undisclosed property;
- interim orders;
- probate and letters of administration; and
- evidence.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5956).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Integrity of Parliamentary Process Bill 2005 (LC No. 002) (Hon P.G. Foss)**

The purpose of this Bill is to protect the integrity of the parliamentary process from undue influence from outside or within the Parliament and to assist Members in making decisions as parliamentary representatives in the best interests of their electorate.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 30 March 2005 (P.D.p. 33).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Judges' Salaries and Pensions Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 214)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend section 6 of the *Judges and Pensions Act 1950* to provide that anyone who was over 60 years of age at the time they were appointed as a Judge should receive a pro-rata judicial pension upon retirement at the statutory retiring age of 70.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3430).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 19 September 2007.

(Act No. 33 of 2007 – assented to on 21 December 2007).

#### **Legal Profession Bill 2007\* (No. 245)**

The purpose of this Bill is to complete the legislative reform that the Parliament commenced when it enacted the *Legal Profession Act 2003*. The Bill seeks to regulate the legal profession in a way that is sufficiently flexible to balance the requirements of small local firms and larger national firms.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6695).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 21 November 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Lobbying Disclosure and Accountability Bill 2007\* (No. 242) (Dr E. Constable)**

This Bill introduces measures to ensure openness and accountability of professional lobbying activities directed at Members of Parliament, ministerial staff and other public officials in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6342).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Local Government Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2006\* (LC No. 180)**

This Bill was created as a consequence of the Legislative Council dividing the Local Government Amendment Bill 2006 (155—2) into two Bills.

The key purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Local Government Act 1995* to remove the ‘first-past-the-post’ system of voting for local government elections and replace it with the preferential system for single member elections and the proportional system for multi-member elections. These systems currently apply for the Legislative Assembly and the Legislative Council respectively.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Environment and Public Affairs on 23 November 2006.

(Act No. 9 of 2007 – assented to on 25 June 2007).

**Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Amendment Bill 2005\* (No. 089)**

The proposed changes in this Bill are to the *Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960* (the Act) and include:

- some amendments carried over from the *Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Amendment Bill 2003* (the 2003 Bill) which lapsed on 23 January 2005;
- some revised amendments based on provisions in the 2003 Bill; and
- other changes not contemplated in the 2003 Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 10 November 2005 (P.D.p. 7138).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 8 May 2007.

(Act No. 11 of 2007 – assented to on 29 June 2007)



**Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Amendment (Smoke Alarms) Bill 2007\* (No. 203)**

This Bill amends the *Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960* in order to give support for the mandatory fitting and maintenance of mains-powered smoke alarms in existing residential dwellings.

The Bill will allow progressive phasing in of new requirements for mains-powered smoke alarms in existing residences. This will mean the battery issues experienced with many current alarms will be a thing of the past.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3008).

(Act No. 34 of 2007 – assented to on 21 December 2007).

**Local Government (Official Conduct) Amendment Bill 2005\* (No. 104)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Local Government Act 1995* to provide a disciplinary framework to deal with individual misconduct by local government council members. At present, apart from prosecution, the only avenue for action in response to inappropriate behaviour is against the whole council.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 November 2005 (P.D.p. 7380).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 11 April 2006.

(Act No. 1 of 2007 – assented to on 28 March 2007)

**Medical Practitioners Bill 2006\* (No. 183)**

This Bill repeals the *Medical Act 1894* and replaces it with a modern registration scheme to ensure that only properly qualified and competent persons are registered to practise medicine and to regulate the practice by those persons for the purpose of protecting consumers of health services in Western Australia. The Bill implements the recommendations of the review of the *Medical Act 1894* which was provided to the Minister for Health in 2001.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 November 2006 (P.D.p. 9044).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 14 November 2007.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 21 November 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Minerals and Energy Research Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 122)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Minerals and Energy Research Act 1987*. The Act establishes the Minerals and Energy Research Institute of Western Australia, the function of which is to encourage the development of the minerals and energy industries for the benefit of the State by fostering and promoting all aspects of minerals and energy research.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 April 2006 (P.D.p. 1169).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Mines Safety and Inspection Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 210)**

The Bill has been developed to strengthen and improve the existing provisions of the *Mines Safety and Inspection Act 1994*. The changes contained in the Bill are in the following broad areas:

- the Occupational Safety and Health Tribunal;
- typographical errors;
- safety and health representatives;
- review of notices;
- penalties in line with general penalty provisions;
- alternative labour hire arrangements; and
- clarification of the definition of 'exploration manager'.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3009).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Mining Legislation Amendment and Validation Bill 2007\* (No. 232)**

The purpose of this Bill is to:

- validate miscellaneous licences made for purposes pursuant to regulation 42B(n) of the *Mining Regulations 1981*;
- validate the extension of term of certain exploration licences lodged at the incorrect office of the Department; and
- amend section 19 of the *Mining Amendment Act 2004* to provide for the lodgement of the extension of term of exploration licences and compulsory surrenders at any office of the Department.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7501).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Misuse of Drugs (Methylamphetamine) Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 222) (Mr M.J. Cowper)**

The intent of this Bill is to have continuity between possession of amphetamine and methylamphetamine, so that law enforcement officers dealing with drug offenders can charge without having to differentiate the weight of the two prohibited drugs before processing offenders to the appropriate court.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5853).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**National Environment Protection Council (Western Australia) Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 188)**

The purpose of the Bill is to implement minor amendments to the *National Environment Protection Council (Western Australia) Act 1996* (NEPC (WA) Act). The main effect of the amendments are to:

- allow the National Environmental Protection Council (NEPC) Service Corporation to provide support and assistance to other Ministerial Councils;
- provide a simplified process for making minor variations to the National Environment Protection Measures; and
- require five-yearly reviews of the NEPC (WA) Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 March 2007 (P.D.p. 833).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 5 September 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Nuclear Facilities Prohibition Bill 2007\* (No. 212)**

The purpose of the Bill is to prohibit the construction and operation of nuclear facilities in Western Australia. The Bill provides that no State laws or authorisations granted under State laws allow the construction or operation of a nuclear facility or other activities prohibited by the Bill.

The Bill makes it an offence to construct and operate a nuclear facility in Western Australia with a penalty of \$500,000.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3427).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 14 November 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Occupational Safety and Health Legislation Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 223)**

The purpose of the Bill is to clarify amendments made to the *Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984*. The amendments contained in this Bill relate to the following broad areas:

- alternative labour arrangements;
- safety and health representatives;
- the Occupational Safety and Health Tribunal; and
- police officers.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 August 2007 (P.D.p. 4466).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Owner-Drivers (Contracts and Disputes) Bill 2006\* (No. 176)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide legislation that ensures safe and sustainable rates for owner-drivers in the road transport industry. This legislation aims to regulate the industry so that standards are maintained at a high level and that self-employed drivers are guaranteed a reasonable rate of return.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 31 October 2006 (P.D.p. 7884).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 28 November 2006 and in the Legislative Council on 3 April 2007.

(Act No. 7 of 2007 – assented to on 6 June 2007).

#### **Parental Support and Responsibility Bill 2005\* (No. 041)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for responsible parenting agreements and responsible parenting orders. It provides for information sharing between government agencies, and makes consequential amendments to the *Children's Court of Western Australia Act 1988*, the *Young Offenders Act 1994* and provides for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 June 2005 (P.D.p. 2585).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 30 November 2005.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 3 April 2007.

The Bill passed the Third Reading stage in the Legislative Council but had not received Royal Assent as at 31 December 2007.

#### **Petroleum Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 227)**

The purpose of the Bill is to amend the *Petroleum Act 1967* to provide for exploration and recovery of geothermal energy.

Geothermal energy is a naturally occurring, sustainable source of energy. This Bill covers both conventional geothermal energy, which is usually associated with hot geothermal springs and the geothermal energy generated from the energy contained in hot dry rocks or high heat producing granites located deep below earth's surface.

The key elements of the Bill provide for:

- vesting of Western Australia's geothermal energy resources in the Crown;
- legislative coverage for both conventional (hydrothermal) geothermal energy and hot dry geothermal energy;
- secure title for geothermal explorers and producers;
- coexistence of petroleum and geothermal resource titles; and
- a mechanism for the collection of geothermal royalties.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 August 2007 (P.D.p. 4215).

(Act No. 35 of 2007 – assented to on 21 December 2007)

**Pharmacists Bill 2006\* (No. 185)**

The objective of the Bill is to protect the public of Western Australia from potential harm by providing for the effective regulation of pharmacy. To achieve this objective, the Bill vests the Pharmacists Board of Western Australia with two principal statutory functions:

- registration – the Board is responsible for determining who may be registered as pharmacists in Western Australia by reference to eligibility criteria that are contained in the Bill. The Board is also responsible for the registration of pharmacy premises and to ensure that pharmacy premises meet appropriate standards; and
- professional regulation – the Board is authorised to inquire into complaints about pharmacists and to take appropriate action where a disciplinary or impairment matter as set out in the Bill is established.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 November 2006 (P.D.p. 8930).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 3 April 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Police Amendment Bill 2006\* (No. 184)**

The purpose of the Bill is to amend the *Police Act 1892*, and various other Acts, to update provisions relating to Aboriginal aides who are now known as ‘Aboriginal police liaison officers’.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 November 2006 (P.D.p. 8929).

Amended in the Legislative Council on 5 December 2007.

The Bill passed the Third Reading stage in the Legislative Council but had not received Royal Assent as at 31 December 2007.

**Police (Compensation for Injured Officers) Amendment Bill 2006\* (No. 159) (Mr M. J. Cowper)**

There is currently no statutory provision for the support, compensation and rehabilitation of members and former members of the WA Police Force who retire, resign or otherwise leave the Police Force with residual illness or injuries which arise through the performance of a police duty or function. Police are specifically excluded from coverage of the *Workers’ Compensation and Injury Management Act 1981* (except in death) and this Bill addresses that anomaly by amending the *Police Act 1892* to provide compensation and ongoing medical benefits for officers injured in the course of duty.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 August 2006 (P.D.p. 5115).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Prisoners (Interstate Transfer) Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 250)**

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce nationally agreed changes to the range of factors taken into account when a transfer of a prisoner is requested.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7502).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Professional Combat Sports Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 235) (Mr T. R. Sprigg)**

The purpose of the Bill is to provide for the Minister to give directions in writing to the Professional Combat Sports Commission with respect to the exercise by the Commission of its powers generally or with respect to a particular matter.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 September 2007 (P.D.p. 5833).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Prostitution Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 226)**

The purpose of the Bill is to provide a framework for addressing the regulation of prostitution in a manner that is conducive to public health, protects sex workers from exploitation and protects children from being involved in or exposed to prostitution.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 August 2007 (P.D.p. 4467).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 23 October 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Public Notaries Amendment Bill 2005\* (LC No. 008)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Public Notaries Act 1979*. This Bill proposes to simplify procedures by transferring the functions of the Attorney General to the Legal Practice Board, which will then report directly to the Chief Justice regarding the suitability and fitness of an applicant and the need for a further appointment.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 30 March 2005 (P.D.p. 30).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Public Trustee and Trustee Companies Legislation Amendment Bill 2006\* (No. 102)**

The purpose of this Bill is to modernise the Public Trustee's legislative framework which has remained largely unchanged for over 60 years. This will allow the Public Trustee to remove inequitable investment and fee arrangements which currently disadvantage some of the most vulnerable members of the Western Australian community, and to provide full trustee services in terms of performing essential financial and legal functions. This Bill will provide for the reform of the Public Trustee's operations and services and enable it to bring its activities up to date with industry best practice, in line with the other Public Trustees in Australia and the Trustee Companies Act. It will also allow the Public Trustee to achieve self-funding over time.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 November 2006 (P.D.p. 8932).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 April 2007 and in the Legislative Council on 6 December 2007.

The Bill passed the Third Reading stage in the Legislative Council but had not received Royal Assent as at 31 December 2007.

#### **Racing and Wagering Legislation Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 167)**

This Bill complements the Racing and Wagering Western Australia Tax Amendment Bill 2006 to change the method of taxation for off-course racing totalisator wagering, effective from 1 July 2007. The Bill also amends the *Racing Penalties (Appeals) Act 1990*, to change the financial year end for the Racing and Penalties Appeal Tribunal to 30 June.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 October 2006 (P.D.p. 7208).

(Act No. 2 of 2007 – assented to on 28 March 2007).

#### **Racing and Wagering Western Australia Tax Amendment Bill 2006 (No. 168)**

This Bill amends the *Racing and Wagering Western Australia Tax Act 2003*, so that from 1 July 2007, the rate of taxation is set at 11.9 per cent and defines ‘gross revenue’ for off-course racing wagers in order to determine the appropriate tax payable.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 October 2006 (P.D.p. 7207).

(Act No. 3 of 2007 – assented to on 28 March 2007).

#### **Racing, Wagering and Betting Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 2007 (No. 189)**

This Bill amends the:

- *Betting Control Act 1954*;
- *Gaming and Wagering Commission Act 1987*; and
- *Racing and Wagering Western Australia Act 2003*.

The Bill repeals the:

- *Kalgoorlie and Boulder Racing Clubs Act 1904*; and
- *Kalgoorlie and Boulder Racing Clubs Act Amendment Act 1953*.

Of particular significance to the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Racing Club, is that the Bill provides for the club to become an incorporated body and manage its own affairs in the same manner as other racing clubs throughout Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 March 2007 (P.D.p. 597).

(Act No. 8 of 2007 – assented to on 13 June 2007).

**Real Estate and Business Agents Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 247)**

The purpose of this Bill is to assist in removing red tape in relation to the licensing requirements for business agents, while increasing competition in the marketplace.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7091).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Revenue Laws Amendment (Assessment) Bill 2007 (No. 206)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Rates and Charges (Rebates and Deferments) Act 1992* to:

- ensure that pensioner concession card holders do not lose their concession where their payment type changes under the Commonwealth 'Welfare to Work' initiative;
- allow an eligible person to retrospectively register their entitlement after death of their registered spouse or de facto partner;
- remove the requirement for a registration application and certain other matters to be in writing; and
- extend the time in which a rebated amount will satisfy a liability to pay a prescribed charge in exceptional circumstances.

This Bill also proposes an amendment to the *Taxation Administration Act 2003* to complement changes to metropolitan region improvement tax arrangements contained in the Revenue Laws Amendment (Taxation) Bill 2007.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 May 2007 (P.D.p. 2222).

(Act No. 13 of 2007 – assented to on 29 June 2007).

**Revenue Laws Amendment (Taxation) Bill 2007 (No. 207)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Land Tax Act 2002*, the *Land Tax Assessment Act 2002*, the *Metropolitan Region Improvement Tax Act 1959* and the *Stamp Act 1921*. It implements taxation measures which focus on first home buyer stamp duty relief, motor vehicle license stamp duty cuts and it reforms the land tax and metropolitan region improvement tax scales.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 May 2007 (P.D.p. 2221).

(Act No. 12 of 2007 – assented to on 29 June 2007).

**Road Traffic Amendment Bill 2006\* (No. 177)**

This Bill will chiefly amend the vehicle impounding and confiscation provisions contained in Part V Division 4 of the *Road Traffic Act 1974*. These provisions were inserted by the *Road Traffic (Impounding and Confiscation of Vehicles) Act 2004*. Presently, these provisions create certain offences, the commission of which may result in the impounding or confiscation of the vehicle used in the commission of an offence.

This Bill removes the current requirement for police, when considering whether to impound the vehicle of a hoon driver for 48 hours, to have personal knowledge that these are the grounds to impound the vehicle prior to doing so.



The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 2 November 2006 (P.D.p. 8163).

(Act No. 4 of 2007 – assented to on 11 April 2007)

### **Road Traffic Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2007\* (No. 220)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Road Traffic Act 1974* in three key areas:

- penalties applying to hit and run cases where drivers leave the scene of traffic crashes and/or fail to report crashes resulting in death or serious injury;
- changes to affect the Government's novice driver reform package; and
- the method of reporting breath analysis results to comply with new Australian Standards.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3576).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 16 August 2007.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 24 October 2007.

(Act No. 39 of 2007 – assented to on 21 December 2007)

### **Road Traffic Amendment (Drugs) Bill 2006\* (No. 171)**

This Bill will expand and strengthen existing drug driving legislation in Western Australia with the aim of increasing the detection of drug drivers and their removal from roads. The Bill introduces two new drug driving offences and supports policy and operational changes within the WA Police. The Bill includes legislative amendments related to random roadside drug testing using oral fluid and those concerning the more serious offence of driving while impaired by a drug.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 October 2006 (P.D.p. 7206).

(Act No. 6 of 2007 – assented to on 23 May 2007)

### **Road Traffic (Administration) Bill 2007\* (No. 252)**

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce various components of the model provisions contained in the federal Road Transport Reform (Compliance and Enforcement) Bill, required to effectively investigate and enforce breaches of the mass, dimension and load restraint requirements throughout the road transport chain.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7899).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Road Traffic (Authorisation to Drive) Bill 2007 (No. 249)**

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate the introduction of the national Road Transport Reform (Compliance and Enforcement) Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7898).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Road Traffic (Consequential Provisions) Bill 2007 (No. 253)**

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal and delete the various clauses of the *Road Traffic Act 1974* which have been moved to new statutes and provides for the amendment of all other legislation impacted by these changes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7900).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Road Traffic (Smoking in Motor Vehicles) Amendment Bill 2006\* (No. 151) (Dr K.D. Hames)**

The purpose of this Bill is to make it an offence, punishable by a penalty of two penalty units, for a person to smoke inside a motor vehicle, whether in motion or at rest, when any other person inside the motor vehicle has not yet attained the minimum age of 17 years.

The Bill was introduced and read a first time in the Legislative Assembly on 22 June 2006.

The Bill was discharged from the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper under Standing Order 144A on 14 August 2007.

**Road Traffic (Vehicles) Bill 2007 (No. 251)**

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate the introduction of the national Road Transport Reform (Compliance and Enforcement) Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7898).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Road Traffic (Vehicles) (Taxing) Bill 2007 (No. 254)**

The purpose of this Bill is to provide the legal mechanism whereby vehicle licence fees can exceed the administrative costs associated with issuing a vehicle licence.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7900).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Rottnest Island Authority Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 201)**

The Bill's purpose is to amend the *Rottnest Island Authority Act 1987* to address corporate governance issues raised by the Rottnest Island Taskforce Report 2004 and to create the Rottnest Island Wadjemup Conservation Reserve under the care, control and management of the Rottnest Island Authority.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 May 2007 (P.D.p. 2224).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Scrutiny of Government Publicity Bill 2005\* (No. 064) (Mr M. J. Birney)**

The objectives of this Bill are to:

- ensure that, as far as possible, public money is not expended on government publicity for a partisan political purpose; and
- constitute a committee to scrutinise government publicity that appears to the committee to have the capacity or to be likely to have the capacity, in whole or in part, to be used for that purpose.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2005 (P.D.p. 3628).

The Bill was discharged from the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper under Standing Order 144A on 12 June 2007.

**Security and Related Activities (Control) Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 241)**

The purpose of this Bill is to bring together a range of major reforms and minor administrative changes to the *Security and Related Activities (Control) Act 1996*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6310).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Seeds Amendment Bill 2007 (LC No. 209)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Seeds Act 1981* with the principal purpose of increasing the flexibility and usefulness of that Act in relation to seed that is prohibited.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 29 August 2007 (P.D.p. 4434).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Sentence Administration (Interstate Transfer of Community Based Sentences) Bill 2007\* (No. 255)**

The purpose of the Bill is to provide for the formal transfer and enforcement of community based sentences between jurisdictions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 November 2007 (P.D.p. 7503).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **State Superannuation Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 219)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *State Superannuation Act 2000* for the benefit of Government Employees Superannuation Boards (GESB) members to provide choice of superannuation fund for Western Australian public sector employees and transition GESB to a mutual structure which is owned and controlled by its members under Commonwealth regulation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3431).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 16 August 2007 and in the Legislative Council on 25 September 2007.

(Act No. 25 of 2007 – assented to on 16 October 2007)

#### **State Supply Commission Amendment Bill 2007\* (No. 225)**

The purpose of this Bill is to formally transfer accountability for State Fleet from the State Supply Commission (SSC) to the Department of Treasury and Finance (DTF). The amendments incorporated into this Bill will:

- enable the SSC to enter into an agreement with the Minister of another agency (in practice this will be the Treasurer and DTF respectively) for the SCC's functions to be transferred to the Treasurer, and delegated by the Treasurer to DTF, to the extent necessary to permit DTF to provide the State Fleet services in its own right;
- enable DTF to draw on the powers of the *State Supply Commission Act 1991* to the extent necessary to undertake the State Fleet functions. The powers required will include powers to contract with any person, to set and retain charges from other government agencies and to borrow; and
- amend the Act's accounting provisions to provide that the State Fleet functions will be accounted for as DTF functions in its budget and annual report, in compliance with the *Financial Management Act 2006*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 August 2007 (P.D.p. 4095)

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Statutes (Repeals and Minor Amendments) Bill 2006 (LC No. 170)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the statute law by repealing various Acts and adopted imperial Acts, and making minor amendments to various other written laws and adopted imperial Acts, and for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 18 October 2006 (P.D.p. 7142).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Uniform Legislation and Statutes Review on 18 October 2006.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Sunset Hospital Site Bill 2006 (No. 137)**

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate land tenure and planning amendments to A Class reserve 1667 to enable implementation of the Sunset Community Master Plan, providing for:

- the timely adaptive reuse and conservation of the heritage listed Sunset Hospital site;
- most of the Sunset site remaining as an A Class reserve and being placed under the custodianship of the University of Western Australia for use as the UWA Arts Centre and for development of a residential aged care facility;
- excision of a relatively small part of the A Class reserve 1667 for the development of residential apartments;
- appropriate amendment to the Metropolitan Region Scheme; and
- minor boundary rationalisation to protect improvements owned by the City of Nedlands.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 May 2006 (P.D.p. 2862).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Surrogacy Bill 2007 \* (No. 190)**

This Bill provides for the regulation of surrogacy arrangements and for the parentage of children born as a result of those arrangements. Under the Bill surrogacy will be provided for by:

- allowing access to IVF for a women who has agreed to bear a child for a women or couple who would be eligible for IVF;
- providing a parentage order which will alter the birth certificate to make the arranged parents the legal parents of the child; and
- regulating activities around the making of surrogacy arrangements.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 March 2007 (P.D.p. 193).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 5 September 2007.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 14 November 2007.

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Taxi Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 187)**

The Bill amends the *Taxi Act 1994* in three ways to enable the taxi industry to provide a timely and efficient taxi service to consumers.

The Bill seeks to:

- improve the enforceability of conditions;
- provide greater flexibility to issue more plates in the growing demand for taxi services, both peak and non-peak; and

- provide an opportunity for the owners of transferable restricted hours taxi plates to upgrade their plates to owned conventional plates on terms to be approved by the Minister.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 22 March 2007 (P.D.p. 631).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 10 May 2007 and in the Legislative Council on 5 September 2007.

(Act No. 26 of 2007 – assented to on 16 October 2007)

#### **Terrorism (Preventative Detention) Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 215)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Terrorism (Preventative Detention) Act 2006* (the Act) in order to avoid any doubt about the ability of ASIO to take a person who is in preventative detention under the Act into their custody.

It is necessary to amend the Act to refer to the updated provisions of the *Australian Security Intelligence Organisation Act 1979*. The Bill will achieve this by making a number of housekeeping amendments to the *Terrorism (Preventative Detention) Act 2006*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 20 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3426).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

#### **Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (Western Australia) Bill 2005\* (LC No. 015)**

The purpose of this Bill is to adopt the *Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997* of the Parliament of the Commonwealth. The Trans-Tasman Recognition Arrangement provides for the recognition within each State and Territory of the Commonwealth of regulatory standards adopted in New Zealand regarding goods and occupations, and for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 21 June 2005 (P.D.p. 2789).

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Legislation on 3 May 2007.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 14 November 2007.

(Act No. 30 of 2007 – assented to on 6 December 2007)

#### **Uranium Mining (Implementation of Government Commitments) Bill 2007 (LC No. 198) (Hon G. Watson)**

The purpose of this Bill is to prohibit the mining of uranium in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 4 April 2007 (P.D.p. 1164).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery Bill 2007\* (No. 152)**

The purpose of this Bill is to contribute towards sustainability in Western Australia and to effect the transition to a waste-free society.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6311).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 14 November 2007.

(Act No. 36 of 2007 – assented to on 21 December 2007).

**Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery Levy Bill 2007\* (No. 153)**

This Bill repeals the *Environmental Protection (Landfill) Levy Act 1998*. The purpose of the Bill is to ensure the ongoing imposition of a levy on waste landfill, to both discourage the disposal to landfill of potentially useful resources and to provide funds for projects to promote waste avoidance and resource recovery.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 October 2007 (P.D.p. 6313).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 14 November 2007.

(Act No. 37 of 2007 – assented to on 21 December 2007)

**Water Resources Legislation Amendment Bill 2006\* (No. 138)**

The purpose of the Bill is to amend water and water resource management related Acts. It incorporates machinery of government amendments introduced in Parliament in 2003 and amends relevant provisions to vest in the Minister certain functions and powers.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 May 2006 (P.D.p. 2763).

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 22 June 2006 and in the Legislative Council on 17 October 2007.

Referred to the Legislative Council Standing Committee on Public Administration on 7 December 2006.

(Act No. 38 of 2007 – assented to on 21 December 2007).

**Water Services Licensing (Water Conservation Target) Amendment Bill 2007 (LC No. 264) (Hon P. Llewellyn)**

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Water Services Licensing Act 1995* to impose, as a condition of holding specified operating licences for water supply services, an obligation to meet a specified water conservation target, and for incidental purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 6 December 2007 (P.D.p. 8248).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Council Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Western Australian College of Teaching Amendment Bill 2007 (No. 216)**

The purpose of this Bill is to address a conflict in the *Western Australian College of Teaching Act 2004* that is preventing the making of regulations for the conduct of an election of members to the Board of the College of Teaching. It also addresses a number of other matters related to appointments and elections to the Board.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 June 2007 (P.D.p. 3007).

(Act No. 18 of 2007 – assented to on 3 July 2007)

**Western Australian Resources Heritage Fund Bill 2007\* (No. 197) (Hon J. Day)**

The Bill provides for the establishment of the Western Australian Resources Heritage Fund. The purpose of the Bill is to create a secure capital fund using a proportion of Western Australia's considerable earnings from non-renewable resources. Once established, the Fund will generate a stable, long-term income stream to benefit future generations of Western Australians when the State's non-renewable resources are depleted.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 4 April 2007 (P.D.p. 1222).

The Bill remains on the Legislative Assembly Notice Paper as at 6 December 2007.

**Wills Amendment Bill 2006\* (No. 125)**

This Bill updates and modernises the *Wills Act 1970*. Succession laws, or laws relating to wills, were imported into Australian colonies from English law. Although the law has been amended over time, many archaic provisions remain. This Bill will enhance the current wills legislation, give greater effect to a testator's intentions and update ancient provisions of the legislation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 March 2006 (P.D.p. 933).

(Act No. 27 of 2007 – assented to on 26 October 2007).
