

Health Ministers of Western Australia

The Health Ministry was first established in the Mitchell Nationalist Government in 1919 with a Minister for Public Health. There have been 31 different Ministers responsible for Health in 20 different Governments. Selby Walter Munsie was Minister for Health in three different Labor governments.
