

## Prisons or Corrective Services Ministers of Western Australia

The first Minister for Prisons was Joseph Max Berinson in the Burke Labor Government in 1983. He served as concurrent Minister for Prisons across three different Labor Governments. Prior to the creation of a Prisons Ministry the responsibility for Prisons was with the Minister for Justice or the Attorney General. There have been 13 different Ministers for Prisons/Corrective Services in eight different Governments.
