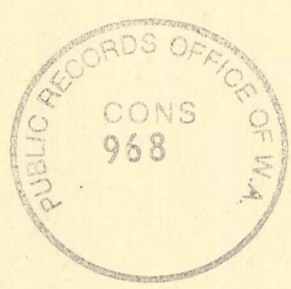

Incinerator

The suggestion made here was made some time ago by the Medical Officer but is impossible, as the Works Department refuse to permit it, alleging it would interfere with the draught of chimney. The only person to complain about any smell from the incinerator is the present Medical Officer whose quarters, it is alleged suffer from the fumes. The chimney of the incinerator has recently been heightened. The previous Medical Officer, who occupied the same Quarters for years, never made any complaint in this respect, and I do not think there can be any very great grounds for complaint, or we should have heard of it before. The Resident Magistrate lives in the adjoining house, and neither the present nor previous Magistrate ever mentioned the subject.

(15). INCINERATOR.

Complaints were made regarding the smell from the
incinerator. The chimney is not sufficiently high
to carry the fumes over the wall, & the suggestion was
made that it be led into the cook-house chimney.
