- (c) has the Government dedicated any funds to developing tourism programs around the Burrup Peninsula World Heritage Status area:
 - (i) if yes, how much funding;
 - (ii) what will the monies fund; and
 - (iii) please list the projects the monies will fund;
- (d) how much total area of Western Australia already has UNESCO World Heritage Status; and
- (e) are there any other parts of Western Australia earmarked for similar UNESCO World Heritage Status?

4062. Dr M.D. Nahan to the Minister representing the Minister for Regional Development:

I refer to the media release dated 7 December 2018 titled 'New grant recipients to support Collie's potential', and I ask:

- (a) how many submissions or applications were received for the Collie Futures Small Grants program;
- (b) who was responsible for the assessment of the applications;
- (c) what criteria was used to assess the applications;
- (d) did the Minister approve the grants;
- (e) did the Minister approve any grants that were not recommended by the body responsible for assessing the applications;
- (f) will the Minister table the applications or business cases of the successful grant recipients; and
- (g) if no to (f), why not?

4063. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Heritage:

Can the Minister confirm what areas in and around Subiaco Oval are protected under the *State Register of Western Australia Act 1990*, and:

- (a) when were the areas added to the register;
- (b) how will the registration of areas in and around Subiaco Oval impact on the stadium's redevelopment;
- (c) is only less than half of WA football's Sandover Medal walk listed on the register:
 - (i) if yes, why isn't the entire Sandover Medal walk listed considering its heritage value; and
 - (ii) what will be done with the Sandover Medal walk pavers;
- (d) what steps are being taken to preserve the valuable sporting heritage in and around the stadium; and
- (e) is the Subiaco Oval playing surface also protected under the Act?

4064. Dr M.D. Nahan to the Premier:

I refer to the \$1.5 million funding for the Premier's Science Fellow and the Premier's Early to Mid-Career Fellow, and I ask:

- (a) can you confirm that the \$1.5 million in funding will only support two people over the next four years;
- (b) is there funding in the forward estimates for future rounds and if so, how much funding is allocated in each year;
- (c) will the funding be made available to Western Australians or only those people who reside outside of the State; and
- (d) why won't Western Australian researchers be able to access this funding?

4065. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Culture and the Arts:

I refer to the Inter Library Loans Service, and ask:

- (a) how many items were loaned under the service for each of the years 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18;
- (b) please provide a breakdown of the number of items loaned to each public library for the years 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18;
- (c) what was the breakdown of the cost of items loaned to each public library for the years 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18;

- (d) in terms of books, audiobooks, DVDs and magazines, please provide a breakdown of the items loaned for each of the years 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18:
 - (i) of the books, please provide a breakdown of fiction and non-fiction items; and
 - (ii) of the DVDs, how many were documentaries; and
- (e) following the cuts to the Inter Library Loans Service how many loans does the service expect to process in the next 12 months?

4066. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Culture and the Arts:

In relation to cuts to the Inter Library Loan Service, I ask:

- (a) what business case was conducted to determine the value of the cuts to the service;
- (b) was a six-month trial of restrictive services conducted:
 - (i) if yes, who supervised the trial;
 - (ii) please list the period during which the trial was conducted;
 - (iii) which libraries participated in the trial;
 - (iv) what were the restrictions applied to the service during the trial;
 - (v) what were the savings realised during the trial;
 - (vi) were the savings used elsewhere in the library system and, if yes, where were they applied;
 - (vii) what was the outcome of the trial; and
 - (viii) who provided feedback on the trial; and
- (c) was the WA Local Government Association (WALGA) consulted as part of the trial:
 - (i) if yes, when; and
 - (ii) what was the WALGA feedback concerning the trial?

4067. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Culture and the Arts:

How much did the Inter Library Loan Service cost to run in each of the years 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18, and:

- (a) what was the cost to service regional libraries; and
- (b) what was the cost to service metropolitan libraries?

4068. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Culture and the Arts:

How much did the State Library of WA spend on supplying books, audiobooks, DVDs, magazines and other items to public libraries for each of the years 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18:

- (a) what was the breakdown in numbers and cost of:
 - (i) books;
 - (ii) audiobooks;
 - (iii) DVDs; and
 - (iv) magazines;
- (b) did the State Library of WA supply top-up books, audiobooks, DVDs, magazines and other items to public libraries after the initial yearly allocation:
 - (i) if yes, how many books, audiobooks, DVDs, magazines and other items were supplied;
 - (ii) which libraries received the top-up books, audiobooks, DVDs, magazines and other items; and

- (iii) what was the value of the top-up books, audiobooks, DVDs, magazines and other items;
- (c) do local governments provide any books, audiobooks, DVDs, magazines and other items for use in libraries within their districts:
 - (i) what was the total value of books, audiobooks, DVDs, magazines and other items provided by local governments; and
 - (ii) please provide the value of books, audiobooks, DVDs, magazines and other items provided by each local government; and
- (d) what is the percentage ratio of State Government to local government contributions to fund WA's public library services?

4069. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Culture and the Arts:

I refer to the State Budget and ask what strategy has the State Library of WA adopted to deliver contemporary library services across WA:

- (a) when were the strategy measures implemented;
- (b) what are the strategy measures;
- (c) who will oversee the new strategy; and
- (d) has the strategy been communicated to public library staff:
 - (i) if yes, when and how?

4070. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Culture and the Arts:

I refer to the reduction in funds allocated to the Public Library Service over the forward estimates, and ask:

- (a) what services will be cut to satisfy the lower funding;
- (b) will the reduction force any staff cuts; and
- (c) does the reduction reflect savings from a cut to the Inter Library Loans Service?

4071. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Culture and the Arts:

Members of the public have been advised to ask libraries to buy items no longer available through the Inter Library Loan Service, so I ask:

- (a) what will be the cost of this supply method over the next 12 months;
- (b) who will fund the purchase of this top-up stock;
- (c) who will fund the upgrade and upkeep of libraries to accommodate the extra stock:
 - (i) what is the cost to accommodate the extra stock in individual libraries;
- (d) who owns the extra stock; and
- (e) what strategies are in place to ensure individual libraries aren't left with an overload of unused stock?

4072. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Minister for Local Government:

Can the Minister please provide how many individual local government meetings he has attended since assuming the position, and:

- (a) which local government meetings did he attend and when;
- (b) how many other visits has he made to local government offices or council chambers for meetings with elected members or council administrations; and
- (c) which local government offices or council chambers did the Minister attend and when?

4073. Mr A. Krsticevic to the Premier; Minister for Public Sector Management; State Development, Jobs and Trade; Federal-State Relations:

I refer to the Public and Health Sector Legislation Amendment (Right of Return) Bill 2018, and ask:

- (a) how many senior executive service (SES) employees are eligible to return to the public sector with permanency;
- (b) can the Premier please provide a breakdown of the number of employees with one, two, three, four and five years to go on their SES contracts; and
- (c) how many of the employees signed new SES contracts in the past 12 months:
 - (i) what were the yearly terms of the contracts; and
 - (ii) please provide a breakdown of the number of new contracts signed for one, two, three, four and five years?

4074. Mrs L.M. Harvey to the Minister for Transport:

I refer to the appointment of Mr John Langoulant as Chair of the Peer Review Panel, and I ask:

- (a) has Mr Langoulant been appointed on a contract;
- (b) if yes to (a), what is the length of the contract and how much is Mr Langoulant being paid; and
- (c) if no to (a), what are Mr Langoulant's remuneration arrangements?

4075. Ms L. Mettam to the Deputy Premier; Minister for Health; Mental Health:

I refer to the media statement on 10 May 2018, 'Additional alcohol and drug rehab services in the South-West in 2019' which announced the State Budget allocated \$9.3 million over the next four years to operate 33 additional treatment beds across the South West Region, and I ask:

- (a) what is the current status of the 33 additional treatment beds in the South West Region;
- (b) How much of the allocated \$9.3 million has been spent to date, and on what;
- (c) What are the names of the alcohol and other drug treatment service providers that will provide the additional 33 treatment beds;
- (d) Of the service providers listed in (c), how many additional beds will each service provider add, and where are they located; and
- (e) When will the 33 additional treatment beds be operational?

4076. Mr D.T. Redman to the Deputy Premier; Minister for Health; Mental Health:

I refer to Cyrenian House's proposal to establish a drug and alcohol rehabilitation facility in Pemberton, and ask:

- (a) Can the Minister outline his awareness, or understanding regarding Cyrenian House's proposal to establish a drug and alcohol rehabilitation centre in Pemberton;
- (b) Can the Minister outline the McGowan Government's role in facilitating or otherwise this proposal;
- (c) Does the Minister agree that community support for such a proposal will be essential to its success?;
- (d) What consultation has occurred, or has been planned, to inform the community and allied health and support services of the proposal;
- (e) How will the proposed drug and alcohol rehabilitation centre integrate with professional health services based in Bunbury - located more than 2 hours drive from Pemberton; and
- (f) What assurances can the Minister provide that the Pemberton doctor, small hospital, volunteer ambulance and police services will not be overly stretched?

4077. Mr W.R. Marmion to the Deputy Premier; Minister for Health; Mental Health:

- (1) Can the Minister provide the final water test results undertaken by the Chief Medical Officer which showed that the Perth Children's Hospital met Australian water quality guidelines for lead content?
- (2) Can the Minister advise the final testing methodology that was used to sample the water outlets in the hospital?
- (3) Did this methodology differ from previous testing methodologies?
- (4) Were the same water outlets sampled as per the previous testing which failed the Australian water quality guidelines?
- (5) What was the highest lead content reading from all samples taken?
- (6) Does the hospital still have any brass fittings in the potable water system?
- (7) Can the Minister advise what replacement water fittings have been used in the hospital and what materials they are composed of?
- (8) Can the Minister advise if any of these new fittings are used in any reticulated hot water systems and if so what is the maximum temperature recommended by the manufacturer for their use?
- (9) Can the Minister advise how the recommended life cycle of any non-brass replacement fittings compares to that of the replaced brass fittings?
- (10) Can the Minister advise how many brass fittings were replaced in the Perth Children's Hospital and what was done with them once removed?
- (11) Can the Minister advise if any of the removed brass fittings did not comply with the Australian standards for lead content in brass?
- (12) Have the removed brass fittings been inspected by specialists to determine a likely reason or reasons why some experienced dezincification and consequential increased lead leaching, and if so, what was their advice?
- (13) Has the water testing methodology used to approve the compliance of the Perth Children's Hospital with Australian water quality guidelines been used to test any other facility in Western Australia?
- (14) Will the water testing methodology used to approve the compliance of the Perth Children's Hospital with Australian water quality guidelines now be adopted as the Western Australian standard for testing of water for lead content?

4078. Mr W.R. Marmion to the Deputy Premier; Minister for Health; Mental Health:

- (1) Can the Minister advise when the presence of the 'dead-leg', which formed part of the water supply ring main for Queen Elizabeth II Hospital, was first brought to the attention of the senior management team of the North Metropolitan Health Services (NMHS)?
- (2) Given that the 'dead-leg' section of the water supply ring main for the hospital had been inactive for some decades, had the North Metropolitan Health Service ever recommended to have it removed or shut off through its own internal maintenance and operational procedures, and if so, when was this advice last provided to senior management and why was it rejected?
- (3) Was Strategic Projects, who were managing the construction of the Perth Children's Hospital, notified by NMHS about the presence of the 'dead-leg' prior to the contractor connecting the new hospital water system into the QEII ring main?
- (4) Can the Minister advise if the Department of Health made the contractor John Holland aware of the presence of the 'dead-leg' prior to connecting the new hospital water system into the QEII ring main?
- (5) When was lead first detected in the new Perth Children's Hospital and in which particular sections of the reticulated water system, including storage tanks?
- (6) Did the Minister for Health, or anyone in his office, receive notification from the Department of Health about the presence of the 'dead-leg', and if so, when, and by whom?
- (7) Why was the 'dead-leg' shut off from the rest of the QEII ring main and on what date did this occur?
- (8) Who authorised the closing of the 'dead-leg' connection to the water ring main and on what advice?
