- (3) What percentage of the capital cost of the Emu Downs Wind Farm represented wages paid to Western Australians and what percentage of the capital cost represented items manufactured in Western Australia?
- (4) Does a power purchase agreement between APA Group and Synergy oblige Synergy to buy the whole output of the Emu Downs Wind Farm and at what price per Megawatt/hour?
- (5) What price per Megawatt/hour does Synergy pay for electricity generated by coal?
- (6) Can the Minister advise the average annual maintenance cost and the anticipated life of the 48 Vestas Wind Turbines at Emu Downs?
- (7) If no to (6), why not?

743. Hon Robin Scott to the Minister for Regional Development representing the Minister for Water:

744. Hon Robin Scott to the Minister for Regional Development representing the Minister for Water:

- (1) Will the Minister advise on the total capital cost of the Kwinana desalination plant operated by the Water Corporation?
- (2) What percentage of the capital cost of the Kwinana desalination plant represented wages paid to Western Australians and what percentage of the capital cost represented items that are manufactured in Western Australia?
- (3) During the most recent twelve-month period for which figures are available to the Minister, what was the total Kwinana Desalination Plant production of fresh water in terms of billions of litres, and what percentage of Perth's total water consumption did this output represent?
- (4) During the same period as (3), what was the total revenue received for sale of water produced by the Kwinana Desalination Plant?
- (5) During the same period as (3), what was total electrical energy consumption of the Kwinana Desalination Plant in gigawatt hours and what was the total payment made for this electricity?
- (6) During the same period in (3), were all the electrical energy needs of the Kwinana Desalination Plant provided by the Emu Downs Wind Farm and, if not, what was the quantity of electricity supplied by, which, other provider or providers in gigawatt hours and at what cost?
- (7) During the same period in (3), what was the net income or net loss of the Kwinana Desalination Plant?

745. Hon Robin Scott to the Minister for Environment representing the Minister for Lands:

- (1) In respect of a proposed purchase of Lot 1522 on deposited plan 186 503, job 1646192, can the Minister confirm that on 1 March 2018 the State Land Officer, Case Management, Goldfields Esperance and Wheatbelt named Jihan Baroquillo, wrote to the applicant, Mr Peter Green in the following terms: "The Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage (DPLH) have considered information and advice pertaining to your application for issue of a lease or to purchase (Part Reserve 18966) Lot 1522 on Deposited Plan 186503. Firstly, there are concerns with the merits and likelihood of success for the development of a commercial plantation of sandalwood in what is a low rainfall zone. It is estimated that it will take 50 years for a plantation in this area to reach commercial potential. Secondly, the proposed area being Lot 1522 forms part of Reserve 18966. Areas of Reserve 18966 are proposed to be

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included into the adjoining Yellowdine National Park Reserve as per the *Conservation Reserve for Western Australia 1975* report (known as the Red Book report). Based on the above, DPLH is not in a position to issue tenure over Lot 1522. Please be advised that Job 164192 will now be closed.”?

- (2) Can the Minister explain why the DPLH purports to evaluate the commercial viability of a project when considering an approval?
- (3) If no to (2), why not?
- (4) Can the Minister state what specific qualifications are possessed by the staff of DPLH which might give them the wisdom to pronounce on such matters?
- (5) If no to (4), why not?
- (6) Can the Minister explain why a buyer should be prevented from making a purchase of land unused for fifteen years on the ground of a four-decades-old report which may never be implemented?
- (7) If no to (6), why not?
- (8) Can the Minister explain why the DPLH is preventing a project which has the potential to bring to Western Australia employment, export income, rail freight and port charges?
- (9) If no to (8), why not?
- (10) Will the Minister personally review this example of bureaucratic overreach?

746. Hon Martin Aldridge to the Minister for Regional Development representing the Minister for Electoral Affairs:

I refer to the *2017 State General Election - Election Report* published by the Western Australian Electoral Commission in August 2017, and I ask:

- (a) has the Minister considered the six recommendations contained within the report;
- (b) if yes to (a), what is the Governments response to each recommendation;
- (c) if the Government has not yet considered the report and its recommendations, when does it intend to do so;
- (d) recommendation one of the report recommends a ‘comprehensive review’ of the *Electoral Act 1907* be undertaken at the ‘earliest opportunity’, does the Minister agree with the recommendation and, when and in what form will the review be undertaken; and
- (e) do you intend to amend the *Electoral Act 1907*, if so when do you expect to introduce an amendment bill?

747. Hon Alison Xamon to the Minister for Education and Training:

I refer to the initial registration, renewal of registration and scope-enhancement audits of Registered Training Providers undertaken by the Training Accreditation Council, and I ask:

- (a) are any of these audits contracted out to third-parties; and
- (b) if yes to (a), will the Minister please provide for each calendar year 2012-2017, for each type of audit:
 - (i) how many audits were completed in total;
 - (ii) how many audits were undertaken by a third party; and

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- (iii) how many audits were undertaken by public servants?

748. Hon Alison Xamon to the Minister for Education and Training:

I refer to the WorkSafe notice against South Regional TAFE in February 2017 and the Public Sector Commissioner's investigation into the culture and leadership of the Orana, and I ask:

- (a) has WorkSafe been notified of the outcome of the risk assessment of "psychosocial hazards in the workplace";
- (b) how many recommendations did the Public Sector Commissioner make regarding the culture and leadership of Orana:
 - (i) how many of these recommendations have been fully implemented;
- (c) how many of recommendations did the Public Sector Commissioner make regarding the college as a whole:
 - (i) how many of these recommendations have been completely implemented;
- (d) has the implementation of the recommendations been audited;
- (e) have the findings and recommendations of this investigation been shared across the TAFE colleges; and
- (f) will the Minister please table the report on the investigation, redacted as appropriate to maintain the privacy of individual staff?

749. Hon Alison Xamon to the Minister for Education and Training:

I refer to the evaluations of the WA Group Training Program, Expanding Career Option for Women Scholarship program and the Aboriginal Youth Transitions Program, and I ask:

- (a) will the Minister please table the completed evaluations; and
- (b) if no to (a), why not?

750. Hon Alison Xamon to the Minister for Education and Training:

I refer to the risk-based contractual audit and compliance monitoring for contracted private training providers undertaken in the 2016-17 financial year that showed more than 50 percent of the audited registered training organisations (RTO) had moderate or significant contractual non-compliance issues, and I ask:

- (a) were any issues identified that might impact the quality of training received by students:
 - (i) if yes, what, if any, actions did the Department take;
- (b) what are the names of the nine RTO that had significant non-compliance issues:
 - (i) how much public funding did they each receive in 2016-17; and
 - (ii) what has now happened with each of those contracts;
- (c) how many private RTO are currently contracted by the department:
 - (i) how many of these have been assessed since their first contract with the department;
- (d) how many more have been identified in the risk assessment as:
 - (i) high risk;
 - (ii) moderate risk; and

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- (iii) low risk; and
- (e) is this audit and compliance monitoring program continuing in 2017-18:
 - (i) if no, why not; and
 - (ii) if yes, how many audits will likely be completed by the end of the 2017-18 financial year?

751. Hon Alison Xamon to the Minister for Education and Training:

I refer to the review of the Delivery and Performance Agreements funding model mentioned on Page 48 of the *2016-17 Department of Training and Workforce Development Annual Report*, and I ask:

- (a) has this review been finalised;
- (b) if yes to (a), will the Minister please table this review;
- (c) if no to (b), why not; and
- (d) if no to (a), when is it likely that the review will be complete?

752. Hon Alison Xamon to the Minister for Education and Training:

I refer to the support services offered through the Participation Program to increase enrolment, retention and graduation of students experiencing barriers to training, and I ask:

- (a) In the 2016 calendar year, how many students accessed this program;
- (b) In the 2016 calendar year, how many students referred to this program received:
 - (i) mentoring and counselling services;
 - (ii) language and literacy services;
 - (iii) translation services;
 - (iv) transport assistance;
 - (v) provision of meals;
 - (vi) childcare assistance; and
 - (vii) assistance with equipment or facilities; and
- (c) How many case managers are employed to work in the Participation Program:
 - (i) on average, how many students do they work with in an academic year?

753. Hon Alison Xamon to the Minister for Education and Training:

I refer to appeals made against the decisions of the Training Accreditation Council (TAC) and managed by the Office of the State Training Board, and I ask:

- (a) how many appeals against TAC decisions have been made in each of the last five academic years; and
- (b) for each year, how many decisions appealed were for decisions against:
 - (i) initial registration;
 - (ii) renewal of registration;
 - (iii) expansion of scope; and
 - (iv) how many appeals were successful for each of (i), (ii) and (iii)?

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754. Hon Alison Xamon to the Minister for Education and Training:

I refer to the Training Accreditation Council's Compliance Recognition Program, and I ask:

- (a) Could the Minister please name the registered training organisations (RTO) currently approved to be part of this program; and
- (b) Could the Minister please clarify whether the RTO internal verification processes would be deemed sufficient for:
 - (i) a higher qualification than has previously been delivered by the RTO; and
 - (ii) a qualification in an industry area that has not previously been delivered by the RTO?

755. Hon Robin Chapple to the Minister for Regional Development representing the Minister for Water:

(1) I refer to the management and facilities of the Broome South Wastewater Treatment Plant, and I ask:

- (a) when was the treatment plant built;
- (b) how many times has effluent and/or wastewater, treated or otherwise, overflowed since it was built;

(2) I refer to the recent widespread rainfall experienced in the North West of Western Australia and various news media reports describing overflow at the Broome South Wastewater Treatment Plant, and I ask:

- (a) on which specific dates did the Broome South Wastewater Treatment Plant overflow in 2018;
- (b) if (a) cannot be answered, why not;
- (c) how long did it overflow for;
- (d) if (c) cannot be answered, why not;
- (e) was the overflow sampled for water quality;
- (f) if no to (e), why not;
- (g) what volume of overflow is estimated;
- (h) if (g) cannot be answered, why not;

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- (i) how many kilograms of total nitrogen and total phosphorous are estimated to have flowed from the Broome South Wastewater Treatment Plant into Roebuck Bay in 2018;
 - (j) if (f) cannot be answered, why not; and
 - (k) what is the maximum capacity of rainfall the treatment plant can receive before overflow occurs?
- (3) I refer to the Water Corporation, and ask:
- (a) is the Water Corporation legally bound to contain wastewater during all rainfall events;
 - (b) if no to (a), why not; and
 - (c) if yes to (a), what is the maximum wastewater the Water Corporation is legally bound to contain during rainfall events?

756. Hon Robin Chapple to the Leader of the House representing the Minister for Local Government:

I refer to the operations of the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder Council and information found at <http://www.robinchapple.com/2018-02-27-abc-goldfields-esperance> entitled “2018-02-27 ABC Goldfields-Esperance.pdf”, and ask:

- (a) is the Minister aware of the report by ABC Goldfields-Esperance;
- (b) is the Minister concerned about the situation where the Chief Executive Officer has been making veiled threats to persons or person unknown via communication with sitting councillors;
- (c) does the Minister believe it is acceptable for any members of a local council, including the Chief Executive Officer to make threats to persons or persons unknown via communication with sitting councillors;
- (d) if yes to (b), what action will the Minister undertake; and
- (e) if no to (b) and/or (c), why not?

757. Hon Martin Aldridge to the Minister for Agriculture and Food:

I refer to the recent speaking tour in Western Australia of Mr Charles Massy, and I ask:

- (a) did the Minister or the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development play any role in arranging, coordinating or funding the speaking engagements of Mr Massy whilst in Western Australia; and
- (b) if yes to (a), please detail those arrangements including any costs borne by the taxpayer?

758. Hon Martin Aldridge to the Minister for Agriculture and Food:

I refer to the recent WA Farmers Federation conference held on 1 to 2 March 2018, and I ask:

- (a) was the Minister invited to speak at the conference by the federation;
- (b) was the Minister’s acceptance of the invitation conditional upon certain requests being met including a request for other persons to be provided speaking opportunities; and
- (c) if yes to (b), what were those conditions or requests?

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759. Hon Martin Aldridge to the Minister for Environment representing the Minister for Emergency Services:

I refer to the former Geraldton Fire Station site at 59 Durlacher Street Geraldton, and I ask:

- (a) does the Department of Fire and Emergency Services have control and responsibility for the site;
- (b) what is the land tenure and appropriate classifications of the site;
- (c) is the site contaminated and, if so, by what;
- (d) what assessments have been conducted at the site, by whom, and at what cost;
- (e) will the Minister please provide a copy of any contamination assessment of the site;
- (f) is there an estimated cost to remediate contamination at the site and, if so, what is the estimated cost; and
- (g) what is the Government's intention with the site now that the Geraldton Fire Station relocated some time ago?

760. Hon Martin Aldridge to the Parliamentary Secretary representing the Minister for Health:

I refer to the official opening of the capital improvements to the Goomalling and York Health Service's on 7 March 2018, and I ask:

- (a) will the Minister please name the invitees for each of the openings including their applicable position or title (if applicable);
- (b) on what date and by what means was each person identified in (a) invited to the events;
- (c) what was the cost of each event;
- (d) who conducted the official opening for each event; and
- (e) on what date was the time and date for each event chosen, and by whom?

761. Hon Colin Holt to the Minister for Environment:

I refer to the Tuart Forest National Park between Busselton and Bunbury, the largest remaining Tuart tall woodland in the State, and ask:

- (a) does the Minister recognise the significance of our remaining Tuart forests;
- (b) is the Minister aware of the increasing degradation of flora in the Tuart Forest National Park due to overgrazing by kangaroos;
- (c) is the Minister aware of the Minninup forest kangaroo exclusion enclosure near Stratham;
- (d) is there any up-to-date data on kangaroo populations in the Minninup Forest Block; and
- (e) how many damage licences, in accordance with the Wildlife Conservation Regulations, have been issued to surrounding land holders in the area surrounding Minninup Forest in:
 - (i) 2014;
 - (ii) 2015;

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- (iii) 2016;
- (iv) 2017; and
- (v) 2018 respectively?

762. Hon Robin Chapple to the Minister for Environment representing the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs:

- (1) Does the Western Australian Government intend on being realistic with respect to Indigenous Expenditure reporting in WA by excluding the cost of mainstream services (policing, schools, government departments, TAFE etc), unlike previous Government reporting, such as the reporting on the town of Roebourne in 2012 and 2014?
- (2) If no to (1), why not?
- (3) How has the WA Government sought to address the issues identified in the Indigenous Expenditure reports for Roebourne?
- (4) Since the Indigenous Expenditure reports for Roebourne, has the Western Australian Government through the Regional Services Reform Unit provided the Roebourne Community with a full list of who has received funding; how much; and for what purpose?
- (5) If no to (4), why not?
- (6) Will the Minister table Indigenous Expenditure reports for Roebourne?
- (7) If no to (6), why not?

763. Hon Robin Chapple to the Minister for Environment representing the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs:

I refer to section 38 of the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972*, “The Registrar shall, so far as practicable, maintain, in such manner and form as the Minister may determine, a register of – All protected areas; All Aboriginal cultural material; and All other places and objects to which this Act applies, whether within the State or elsewhere”, and I ask:

- (a) is it possible within the current system at the Department of Planning Land and Heritage to add information to existing site files within the Register of Aboriginal Sites that are made available to Land Councils, Aboriginal heritage custodians and researchers;
- (b) if yes to (a), was there a period when the system would not permit the addition of relevant information to existing sites on the Register of Aboriginal Sites;
- (c) if no to (a), and/or if there was a period when it was not possible to add information to the existing listings on the Register of Aboriginal Sites, how many sites were not updated with relevant information submitted by heritage custodians, consultants, members of the public and/or as part of Applications under the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972*;
- (d) if no to (a), and/or there was a period when it was not possible to add information to the existing listings on the Register of Aboriginal Sites, how long will it take and what resources will be necessary to update information submitted to the Department of Aboriginal Affairs or Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage during this period;
- (e) if no to (a), and/or there was a period when it was not possible, why was the relevant system designed in this manner;

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- (f) previously it was possible to download from Aboriginal Heritage Inquiry System (AHIS) a pdf list of reports relevant to specific sites, but this is no longer possible. Will the Minister please explain why;
- (g) will the Minister please explain why the current AHIS website is slow compared to what it was a couple of months ago;
- (h) a number of experienced senior heritage officers were made redundant in December 2016. Have any of them been replaced since then; and
- (i) how many senior heritage officers are in the department now, and who are they?

764. Hon Robin Chapple to the Minister for Environment:

- (1) I refer to the contaminated site at the former Pillara Lead and Zinc Mine on Gogo station, and ask:
 - (a) is the department aware of thallium and/or other heavy metals present in the groundwater and soil at Gogo station;
 - (b) if yes to (a), are thallium and/or other heavy metals present in the area of the proposed irrigation development on Gogo station;
 - (c) has analysis been undertaken of the risk of thallium or heavy metals in the soils and/or waterways at Gogo station, and/or in the variety of proposed food crops or beef at Gogo Station if the proposed irrigated agriculture development was to go ahead;
 - (d) if no to (c), why not;
 - (e) if yes to (c), can the Minister provide a summary of outcomes and a copy of the analysis;
 - (f) does the contaminated site pose a potential, short, medium or long term risk to groundwater at Gogo Station, for irrigation or human consumption purposes;
 - (g) does the contaminated site pose a potential short, medium or long term risk of heavy metal or thallium contamination of surface water, wetlands or soil at Gogo Station;
 - (h) could trends of increasing rainfall cause an increased risk of contamination on Gogo Station as a result of uncontrolled flooding of the contaminated site;
 - (i) can the Minister advise if dams designed to capture overland flow downstream from the contaminated site on Gogo Station could contribute to increasing the concentrations of thallium and other heavy metals over time;
 - (j) have there been any known spills or leaks from the contaminated site in the last five years;
 - (k) if yes to (j), what remediation was done and what is the assessment of the effectiveness of this remediation; and
 - (l) have site specific screening criteria been developed for assessing water quality for livestock or irrigation at the site, particularly for thallium?

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- (2) I refer, to the document “Kimberley cropping – submission for discussion of business case proposal Oct 2014” that was submitted by the proponent seeking Government support for irrigated agriculture at Gogo Station and was recently released under a Freedom of Information request, and ask:
- (a) the document states that 10.5l/ha of various herbicides would be expected to be applied for irrigated sorghum crops at Gogo Station via aerial spraying (based on figures given by the proponent that are provided as an estimate for Gogo based on DPI NSW figures). Have any studies been undertaken into the potential health or environmental impacts of this spraying program;
 - (b) if no to (a), why not;
 - (c) if yes to (a), can the Minister provide a summary of outcomes and a copy of the assessment;
 - (d) if no to (c), why not;
 - (e) the document outlines the amount of fertilizers that the proponent expects will be needed to grow irrigated crops on Gogo Station (based on figures given by the proponent that are provided as an estimate for Gogo based on DPI NSW figures). Has the Department assessed the effects of the proposed fertilizer use at Gogo station for their impact on the Fitzroy River and local wetlands and creeks;
 - (f) if no to (e), why not;
 - (g) if yes to (e), can the Minister provide a summary of outcomes and a copy of the assessment; and
 - (h) if no to (g), why not?

765. Hon Robin Chapple to the Minister for Agriculture and Food:

I refer to the proposal on Gogo station for irrigated agriculture, and I ask:

- (a) has the Department undertaken an economic analysis of the business case for the irrigation project on Gogo Station;
- (b) if no to (a), why not;
- (c) if yes to (a), will the Minister table the analysis;
- (d) if no to (c), why not;
- (e) if no to (a), when will the analysis be undertaken;
- (f) historically there have been issues with the ability of the soils and environment in the Fitzroy Catchment to support broad scale irrigated agriculture. Has the Department conducted an assessment of the ability of the soils and environment at Gogo Station to support the crops proposed to be grown as part of the irrigation project;
- (g) if no to (f), why not;
- (h) if yes to (f), will the Minister table the analysis; and
- (i) if no to (h), why not?

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766. Hon Robin Chapple to the Minister for Regional Development:

I refer to the proposal on Gogo station for irrigated agriculture, and I ask:

- (a) has the Department undertaken an economic analysis of the business case for the irrigation project on Gogo Station;
- (b) if no to (a), why not;
- (c) if yes to (a), will the Minister table the analysis;
- (d) if no to (c), why not;
- (e) if no to (a), when will the analysis be undertaken;
- (f) historically there have been issues with the ability of the soils and environment in the Fitzroy Catchment to support broad scale irrigated agriculture. Has the Department conducted an assessment of the ability of the soils and environment at Gogo Station to support the crops proposed to be grown as part of the irrigation project;
- (g) if no to (f), why not;
- (h) if yes to (f), will the Minister table the analysis; and
- (i) if no to (h), why not?

767. Hon Robin Chapple to the Minister for Environment:

I refer to an article in *The West Australian* titled “Red tape ‘blocking jobs and strangling farmers’” by Ben Harvey, which refers to a submission by the Kimberley Pilbara Cattlemen’s Association (KPCA), whose CEO was Catherine Marriott at the time, to a Federal senate inquiry into ‘red tape’, and I ask:

- (a) the KPCA allegedly state that station owners were ordered to comb a ‘200,000ha station looking for a purple flower – even though the plant was not in season’, is it true that they were ordered to do so;
- (b) if no to (a), what was the advice provided to them with regard to surveying the ‘purple flower’;
- (c) what was the ‘purple flower’ mentioned by the KPCA and what is its conservation status on a State and Federal level;
- (d) the KPCA implied in their submission that the plant had “...been introduced”, is the plant introduced or is it a local native plant;
- (e) with reference to the Forshaws, pastoral lease holders at Nita Downs, it stated that they waited over six months for a response to an application to bulldoze 350 hectares of land, how long did it take for the relevant department to respond to the application;
- (f) the article also states that Mowanjum station had been waiting ten months for approval to install two irrigation pivots, is this true and, if not, when was a response provided;
- (g) the article states that the KPCA submission said ‘the day after they (Mowanjum station) won the Premiers Award for Improving Aboriginal Outcomes, their application was knocked back due to the requirement for regional flora and fauna surveys’. Is it true that Mowanjum station had been previously informed that they would be required to undertake flora and fauna surveys for future proposals when their first land clearing application was approved in 2014;

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- (h) the KPCA submission also stated that a clearing application was not granted due to concerns regarding the presence of a threatened species, the Greater Bilby, even though “the Aboriginal people who own this land haven’t sited (sic) a Bilby in the years they have lived there”. Is it true that flora and fauna studies must be conducted by qualified specialists according to the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*;
- (i) according to the article ‘the State Government will also invest \$600,000 of Royalties for Regions funding in targeted biodiversity surveys’. Was this funding allocated;
- (j) if yes to (i), when was it allocated and what was the outcome of the surveys;
- (k) if no to (i), was any funding provided;

(2) There is a large proportion of data missing from the online version of the Audit, specifically regarding details of threats faced by flora, fauna, and communities, and conservation statuses for many species throughout Western Australia.
