3. When were your key performance indicators last reviewed?

Answer:

Following the announcement in April 2017 of the Machinery of Government changes, the Outcome Based Management (OBM) frameworks of the former Department of Mines and Petroleum and Department of Commerce were reviewed. The key performance indicators presented in the 2017-18 Annual Report represented the amalgamation of these two frameworks and alignment to the new government goals. The Department's amalgamated OBM framework did not include key performance indicators relating to industry development and innovation functions which were transferred from the former Department of Commerce to the Department Jobs, Tourism, Innovation and Science.

During 2017–18, a further review of the Department's OBM framework was undertaken, and a new OBM framework and suite of key performance indicators has been approved for the 2018–19 financial year.
