WEDNESDAY, 16 AUGUST 2023 1.00pm

1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 1.00pm pursuant to order.

Hon Martin Aldridge presented an E-Petition from 1,046 petitioners requesting the Legislative Council to support an additional Midwest aeromedical rescue helicopter based in Geraldton. (Tabled Paper 2443).

3. Mismanagement of the planning and operation of Western Australia's public health system

Hon Tjorn Sibma: To move on the next day of sitting —

That this House —

- (a) express its deep concern for the Cook Labor Government's continued mismanagement of the planning and operation of Western Australia's public health system;
- (b) laments the Government's failure to appropriately fund child development services;
- (c) condemns the Minister for Health's dangerous decision to ignore the Government's own business case into the new Women and Babies Hospital which recommends QEII Medical Centre as the preferred site; and
- (d) in respect of (c), urges the Government to reflect on the advice of health experts, clinicians and advocacy groups and immediately reverse the decision.
