

NON-GOVERNMENT BUSINESS

1. Vape Stores

Hon Dr Brian Walker to move —

- (1) This House notes the recent vaping education pack issued by the McGowan Government, and supports regulation to prevent vape stores from operating within a pre-determined radius of schools.
- (2) Further, the Legislative Council encourages the Government to investigate the potential to regulate such distanced-based solution, alongside an investigation into the level and scope of regulation necessary to allow small vape businesses to continue to provide a valuable economic and social service to the community, while protecting the vulnerable, the results to be presented to Parliament upon completion.

2. Hemp and Cannabis Industries

Hon Sophia Moermond to move —

That this House notes that the hemp and cannabis industries in Western Australia are rapidly growing sectors that are key to the future of many rural and regional economies, and urges the Government, through the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, to work collaboratively with hemp and cannabis industry stakeholders including farmers, manufacturers, processors and retailers, to realise the vision of Western Australia as a nation-leading innovator in the sector.
