#### 1959. Hon Ben Dawkins to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Health:

I refer to the number of excess deaths recorded in Western Australia in the 2021 calendar year, and I ask:

- (a) has the Government investigated the number of excess deaths recorded in 2021:
  - (i) if no to (a), why not;
- (b) is the Government able to provide an explanation as to why there was a statistically significant increase in the number of excess deaths in 2021:
  - (i) if no to (b), why not; and
- (c) how many confirmed cases of COVID-19 were recorded in Western Australia in the 2021 calendar year?

### 1960. Hon Ben Dawkins to the Minister for Women's Interests:

I refer to female sports, and I ask:

- (a) does the Minister support the separation of biological males and biological females in some sports;
- (b) can the Minister explain why biological males and biological females are separated in some sports;
- (c) what sports require the separation of biological sexes to ensure the physical safety of all participants and fairness in competition for biological females; and
- (d) does the Minister support the right of biological females to choose to participate in sports where they are not required to compete against biological males?

#### 1961. Hon Ben Dawkins to the Minister for Emergency Services:

I refer to the closure of schools on 20 February 2024 in parts of the South West region, and I ask:

# 1963. Hon Nick Goiran to the Minister for Emergency Services representing the Minister for Transport:

I refer to the tragic deaths of three young people who were hit by a train on 8 July 2000 at the Yarramony Road level crossing near Jennacubbine in the WA Wheatbelt, and I ask:

- (a) after the 2021 inquest, the Western Australian coroner made several recommendations, one of which was related to the lack of lighting on the train, which the coroner described as constituting a very serious hazard. Is the Minister aware of this issue;
- (b) what has been done by the Department of Transport to mitigate the risk of inadequate train lighting; and
- (c) why has the coroner's recommendation still not been actioned?

# 1964. Hon Martin Aldridge to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Climate Action:

I refer to the Minister's appointment as the Minister for Climate Action from 21 December 2021, and I ask:

- (a) on how many occasions has the Minister taken a commercial flight in an official capacity;
- (b) of those identified in (a), on how many of the occasions did the Minister elect, as part of the booking, to offset related carbon emissions;
- (c) on how many occasions has the Minister utilised the Government owned ministerial aircraft or charter aircraft in an official capacity;
- (d) of those identified in (c), how did the Minister assess and consider offsetting the related carbon emissions; and
- (e) please identify the relevant Government policy relating to offsetting carbon emissions created in the course of official Government travel?

# 1965. Hon Martin Aldridge to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Energy:

I refer to the severe weather event that left more than 30,000 properties without power, and I ask:

- (a) noting the Minister's comments that the event caused more damage to the network than Severe Tropical Cyclone Seroja, on what basis did the Minister make such a claim:
- (b) were the transmission towers rated to 260km/h, as claimed by the Hon. Darren West in the Legislative Council on 14 March 2024, and if so, what was the wind speed recorded in the vicinity at the time of the damage;
- (c) how many transmission towers were lost and how many were damaged arising from the event:
- (d) what was the cost related to replace or repair transmission towers arising from the event;
