LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

WEDNESDAY, 17 MAY 2023 1.00pm

1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 1.00pm pursuant to order.

The President, Hon Alanna Clohesy, took the Chair.

Prayers and an Acknowledgement of Country were read.

2. Death of Hon Douglas Wenn — Motion of Condolence

The Leader of the House moved, without notice —

That this Council expresses its deep regret at the death of Hon Douglas Wenn, a former Member of the Legislative Council for the South West Region; and places on record its appreciation for his long public service, and tenders its profound sympathy to his family in their bereavement.

- (1) A select committee to be known as the Disaster Resilience Select Committee is established.
- (2) The Select Committee is to inquire into and report on
 - (a) the increasing prevalence of natural disasters in Western Australia, risks posed to communities, infrastructure, the economy and the environment and the State's preparedness to meet these challenges;
 - (b) the capability of our government, non-government organisations and the private sector including service delivery models to surge capacity during peak periods of demand;
 - (c) the current model of recovery delivery in Western Australia, whether it is fit-for-purpose and lessons learnt from other jurisdictions and models; and
 - (d) to make recommendations to improve Western Australia's resilience to natural disasters now and into the future.
- (3) The Select Committee is to report no later than 12 months after the motion is agreed to.
- (4) The Select Committee shall consist of no fewer than three members.
