1. Meeting of Council

Dear Madam President

Inquiry into the Monitoring and Enforcing of Child Safe Standards — Extension of reporting date

On the 12 August 2019 the Joint Standing Committee on the Commissioner for Children and Young People resolved to extend this inquiry in order to maintain scrutiny over the progress of the State's response to the recommendations made by the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses into Child Sexual Abuse and examine more fully the ways and means child safe standards and oversight of children's services should be implemented in WA.

Consequently, the Committee intends to report Parliament the outcomes of this inquiry by the end of June 2020.
