- (a) acknowledges the invaluable contributions of frontline healthcare workers, healthcare providers and non-government organisations in safeguarding the health of all Western Australians;
- (b) recognises the critical state of Western Australia's public health system, including record ambulance ramping, low staff morale, staff burnout, and numerous devastating and preventable incidents in our hospitals;
- (c) expresses deep concern at the State Government's dismissal of clinician objections regarding the safety of patients arising from the relocation of the Women and Babies Hospital; and
- (d) calls for urgent action to address regional health concerns including ongoing delays and budget cuts to health projects and the need for improvements to the Patient Assisted Transport Scheme.

For that reason, I will ask the President to consider the issues the Member has raised and to report to the House as the President sees fit.

Hon Nick Goiran also raised an issue with respect to an answer he received in question time today. There is a fine but clear line between taking issue with an answer that has been provided and making a claim that a Member has misled the House.

If it is the latter, the Member should rise under Standing Order 93, which relates to matters of privilege, and formally refer the matter to the President for consideration.
