6. Statement by President — Peter Dooley

The President made the following Statement —

It is with great sadness that I advise the House of the death of Peter Dooley on 14 August. Pete began his role as a Parliamentary Education Officer in April 2017 retiring in December 2021.

Pete was a teacher, a passionate, creative educator, a man who loved Parliament and believed in democracy. He was open to every opportunity to engage with the community, always welcoming of new ideas and happy to share his knowledge and offer encouragement. He was loved and respected by his team and the broader Parliamentary community.

Pete's creativity and his in depth understanding of the school curriculum was integral to the development of the Civics and Citizenship program run by the Parliament.

Prior to commencing at Parliament, Pete had a varied work life. He worked with the Aboriginal Legal service and with TAFE, he was a musician, poet and a comedian. Pete's life experience and his commitment to reconciliation brought a richness to his delivery of the education program at Parliament.

Pete died at home with his family. Our condolences to his wife Jodi, his two daughters Sian and Alana and his beloved grandson Logan.

Details of Peter's service will be advised in due course.
