3. Mismanagement of the planning operation of Western Australia's public health system

Motion No. 12 having been called, Hon Tjorn Sibma, pursuant to notice, moved —

- (a) express its deep concern for the Cook Labor Government's continued mismanagement of the planning and operation of Western Australia's public health system;
- (b) laments the Government's failure to appropriately fund child development services;
- (c) condemns the Minister for Health's dangerous decision to ignore the Government's own business case into the new Women and Babies Hospital which recommends QEII Medical Centre as the preferred site; and
- (d) in respect of (c), urges the Government to reflect on the advice of health experts, clinicians and advocacy groups and immediately reverse the decision.
