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ANNUAL REPORT 2004

INTRODUCTION

The Land Surveyors Licensing Board of Western Australia (the Board) is constituted under Section 4 of the *Licensed Surveyors Act 1909* (the Act). In accordance with Section 25C of the Act the Board has prepared the following report of its activities for the year ending 31 December 2004.

THE BOARD

The Board consisted of six members comprising the Surveyor General ex officio, two members nominated by the Surveyor General, two members nominated by the WA Division of the Institution of Surveyors Australia and one member nominated by Curtin University as the approved tertiary education institution offering a relevant undergraduate course in surveying.

ROLE OF THE BOARD

The Board's Charter is to provide for the registration, regulation and supervision of persons who undertake surveys and to assist the profession in the control of matters incidental thereto.

The Objectives of the Board are:

- 1. To promote the provision of sound education requirements for the profession, coupled with continuing assessment.
- 2. To maintain reciprocity between the States and Territories of Australia and certain other countries and provide a licensing or registration structure for those persons involved in authorised surveys.
- 3. To provide a means of administering discipline in cases of breaches of the Act in accordance with relevant sections of the Act.
- 4. To ensure sound liaison with Government.
- 5. To ensure sound liaison with Industry.

BOARD ACTIVITIES

Activities undertaken by the Board to meet its five objectives were:

1 TO PROMOTE THE PROVISION OF SOUND EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PROFESSION, COUPLED WITH CONTINUING ASSESSMENT

Continuing Education

The Board believes that licensed surveyors must undertake continuing education programs to ensure that their knowledge of land law and regulatory requirements of cadastral practice is current. Section 11B of the *Licensed Surveyors Act 1909* allows the Board to specify continuing education requirements to maintain and improve the knowledge and skills of licensed surveyors. An annual requirement has been specified for practising licensed surveyors wanting to renew their practising certificates.

The Board accredited ten cadastral education seminars to enable licensed surveyors to meet these requirements.

Two licensed surveyor completed the continuing education requirements for verification of survey documents.

Application of Survey Law

The Board scheduled two examinations for the written subject Application of Survey Law.

Four candidates applied for the February examination. All were successful.

At the September examination three candidates applied and all were successful.

Practical Examinations

Examinations for the awarding of a Certificate of Competency were scheduled for March and September.

In March 2004 three candidates participated and at the September examinations four candidates presented.

The successful candidates were H N Fisher, L J Gatti, J M Herrington, C J Kealley, C P Oliver, A J Robertson and S G Thompson.

In recognition of the standard of excellence in his overall presentation Mr Gatti was awarded the Sydney John Stokes Award. Mr Gatti was also awarded the Malcolm Evensen Prize for excellence in the Projects component of the examinations.

The Board undertook a major review of the examination process. This resulted in a substantial change to the requirements for the Position Fixing examination component. The Board approved the amendments to the Guidelines for Examinations which will take effect for the March 2005 examinations.

Professional Training Agreements

There were 25 Professional Training Agreements registered with the Board as at 31 December 2004.

Letters of Accreditation

The Board issues Letters of Accreditation to Western Australian licensed surveyors wishing to register with Surveyors Boards in other States. There were two applications for Letters of Accreditation in 2004.

Reciprocating Surveyors Boards of Australia and New Zealand

The Reciprocating Surveyors Boards of Australia and New Zealand meet to resolve matters concerning the reciprocal acceptance of registration.

In 2004 a meeting was held in May and a teleconference held in December. Major issues discussed included the future organisation of the reciprocating Boards, mutual recognition, competition policy reviews, continuing education, national competency based standards, training agreements and national surveying standards.

3 TO PROVIDE A MEANS OF ADMINISTERING DISCIPLINE IN CASES OF BREACHES OF THE ACT IN ACCORDANCE WITH RELEVANT SECTIONS OF THE ACT

There were two disciplinary cases heard in 2004.

Enquiry E1 of 2004

Having found two charges laid under Section 21(1)(ba) and 21(1)(f) of the *Licensed Surveyors Act 1909* against Robert Tudor Owen proven, the Board ordered that Mr Tudor Owen be reprimanded, fined \$1000 and pay costs of \$500. Further, Mr Tudor Owen was required to complete the subdivision expeditiously, submitting regular progress reports to the Board and a Business Plan showing how record keeping, document control and communications with clients will be improved. Conditions were placed on Mr Tudor Owen's Practising Certificate in relation to complying with Board Orders.

Enquiry E2 of 2004

Having found two charges laid under Section 21(1)(aa) and 21(1)(f) of the *Licensed Surveyors Act 1909* against Peter James Neale proven, the Board ordered that Mr Neale rectify the plan by notifying the Registrar of Titles of relevant matters and lodging a fieldbook. Mr Neale's license was suspended for a period of three months and conditions placed on his Practising Certificate in relation to complying with Board Orders. In relation to the second charge Mr Neale was fined \$1000 and ordered to pay costs of \$500.

4 TO ENSURE SOUND LIAISON WITH GOVERNMENT

Legislation

- 1. The Board completed *Licensed Surveyors* (*Licensing and Registration*) *Amendment Regulations 2004* which amend Schedule 1 of the parent regulations, the *Licensed Surveyors* (*Licensing and Registration*) *Regulations 1990*. Schedule 1 prescribes the fees payable to the Board in respect of certain matters. In line with the Board policy of regular updating of fees, the Board made the amendments.
- 2. The Parliamentary Joint Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation required changes to the *Licensed Surveyors (Guidance of Surveyors) Amendment Regulations 2003* that had previously been gazetted in August 2003. The required amendments provide for the prescription of the visual, dimensional and choice of material specifications for construction of survey marks. The process of consultation and enactment of the required amendments is well advanced.

5 TO ENSURE SOUND LIAISON WITH INDUSTRY

Notices and Newsletters

The Board issued two Newsletters and six Notices to Surveyors during the year.

Country Visit

The Board held a meeting in Port Hedland in August 2004. This was followed by a seminar and forum with the surveyors of the North West region. The discussions enabled an interchange of ideas and the chance for rurally based surveyors to have direct contact with Board members.

GENERAL

Mr K Alexander announced his resignation as Surveyor General and Chairman of the Board, effective 1 January 2005.

Mr G J Searle will be appointed Surveyor General of Western Australia, effective 1 January 2005.

During 2004 the Board initiated actions to prepare for changes to its structure that result from *The Acts Amendment and Repeal (Competition Policy) Act 2003*. The changes will come into effect on 1 January 2005. The major reform to the *Licensed Surveyors Act 1909* will be in the composition of the Board. To provide for a smooth transition to the new Board structure the following arrangements were announced as coming into effect on 1 January 2005:

The Hon Minister nominated Mr N E Browne to be Chairman of the Board and Mrs C M Randolph to continue to represent the consumers of surveying services;

Mr G J Searle, ex officio, will become a member of the Board.

Scope
