SYNOPSIS OF BILLS

1999-2000

The following synopsis of Bills introduced during the Third Session of the Thirty-Fifth Parliament is intended only to give a brief outline of the main features of each Bill at the stage when the second reading motion of the Bill was moved. The full second reading speech for each Bill is available in *Parliamentary Debates (Hansard)* which are available from the State Law Publisher or from the Parliament of W.A. Internet site (address: www.parliament.wa.gov.au). The ultimate stage reached by each Bill is also indicated. While it does not take into account amendments made in either House, reference can be made to the *Minutes* of the Legislative Council and *Votes and Proceedings* of the Legislative Assembly where amendments have been agreed to.

- * Indicates the Act, or parts thereof, comes into operation on a date or dates to be fixed by Proclamation.
- [E] Indicates an Explanatory Memorandum was presented with the Bill.
- LC Indicates the Bill originated in the Legislative Council; all other Bills originated in the Legislative Assembly.
- (P.D.p.) Indicates the *Hansard* page number for the second reading of the Bill in the House in which it was first introduced.
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Acts Amendment and Repeal (Competition Policy) Bill 2000 * (No. 132) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal two Acts (the *Bread Act 1982* and the *Racing Restriction Act 1927*) and amend a number of other Acts in accordance with recommendations of National Competition Policy reviews of those laws, undertaken to comply with the State's obligations under the 1995 Competition Policy Agreements.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 May 2000 (P.D.p. 7270)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Acts Amendment (Australian Datum) Bill 2000 * (No. 92) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate Western Australia's part in a nation-wide change in the geographical datum used in Australia. A datum is a reference system that defines the location of features commonly shown on maps. There is more than one system in existence. Each system is based on a particular model of the earth. The effect of this Bill is to remove references to a specific datum in Western Australian legislation. When a reference to a datum is required, that datum will be prescribed by regulations rather than specified within the Act itself. Therefore, any new datum can be adopted by regulations, which will be far more efficient in terms of cost and time than regular legislative changes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5465)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Acts Amendment (Continuing Lotteries) Bill 1999 * (No. 53) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to transfer responsibility for the licensing and regulation of suppliers of continuing lottery tickets from the Commissioner of State Revenue to the Gaming Commission so that only one government agency is responsible for the licensing and regulation of continuing lotteries in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3695)

(Act No.6 of 2000 -- assented to on 11 April 2000)

Acts Amendment (Evidence) Bill 1999 (LC No. 1) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend -

- the *Evidence Act 1906*;
- the *Justices Act 1902*;
- the *Children's Court of Western Australia Act 1988*; and
- *The Criminal Code*.

The amendments effected by the Bill will -

- facilitate the admission of documentary and foreign evidence in trials involving complex commercial crime;
- allow for the admission of documentary evidence created using modern information technology;
- permit child and vulnerable witnesses to give their evidence on video-tape to save them from the trauma of giving evidence in open court;
- remove inappropriate requirements for the tendering of statements of child witnesses at the early stages of the prosecution process;
- allow the use of witness statements in prosecutions for crimes in the children's court and where there is an ex officio indictment, if the witness has died, is too ill to come to court, or simply cannot be found before the trial;
- restore an element of fairness when an accused person makes unsubstantiated assertions against the character of a deceased victim of a crime;
- extend certain provisions in the *Evidence Act 1906* to the prosecution of offences where the offender has been charged with repealed Criminal Code sections; and
- allow a complainant in a sexual offence to authorise the publication or communication of their name without being held to be committing a crime.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 14 September 1999. (P.D.p. 1054)

Amended in the Legislative Council on 16 March 2000 and in the Legislative Assembly on 11 May 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Acts Amendment (Fines Enforcement and Licence Suspension) Bill 2000 * (No. 146) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend two Acts in a number of respects. These Acts and amendments are as follows -

The *Fines Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994* is amended to -

- allow the Fines Enforcement Registrar to have the discretion to not impose or uplift a licence when there is undue hardship on the offender, and to allow a period of time to pay;
- restrict the ability of certain offenders from undertaking Work and Development Orders when they may pose a safety risk to the public or the supervising Community Corrections Officer;
- allow greater flexibility to the Fines Enforcement Register to enforce matters;
- allow for a full range of enforcement sanctions, for collection of bail surety monies, where current enforcement is restricted to the issue of a warrant of execution; and
- ensure the right of the Crown to attend for re-hearing matters.

The *Road Traffic Act 1974* is amended to -

- create a separate offence of driving under fine default suspension and allows for a greater range of sentencing dispositions for offences of driving under suspension, as provided for under the *Sentencing Act 1995*;
- provide for the Police to caution an offender when contacted in the first instance, in circumstances where the driver is suspected of being under fine default suspension; and
- address an existing anomaly, so as to bring the cancellation of probationary drivers' licences in line with other drivers' licences, in providing for such drivers' licences to be suspended rather than cancelled.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8407)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Acts Amendment (Fines Enforcement) Bill 1999 * (LC No. 25) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994*. This Bill seeks to allow for fines to be converted to a Work and Development Order, either in court or by the Registrar of the Fines Enforcement Registry, where an offender has no capacity to pay and licence suspension is likely to be ineffective and will ensure that the courts' order will be dealt with in a timely manner and enforced whilst still fresh in the offender's mind.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 14 September 1999. (P.D.p. 1053)

(Act No.9 of 2000 -- assented to on 19 May 2000).

Acts Amendment (Fixed Odds Betting) Bill 1999 * (No. 21) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to allow the Totalisator Agency Board (T.A.B.) in Western Australia to -

- conduct fixed odds betting;
- accept electronic and other commercially acceptable forms of payment for a bet;
- supplement dividend pools; and
- to validate a dividend declared by the T.A.B. where a bet that should not have been accepted is included in a betting pool or where the outcome of a race or sporting event, once declared, is later disputed.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 August 1999. (P.D.p. 503)

(Act No.40 of 1999 -- assented to on 16 November 1999)

Acts Amendment (Police Immunity) Bill 1999 (No. 32) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide protection from civil action against a member of the Police Service. This protection is for anything that the member has done, without corruption or malice, in the performance of their functions as a member of the Police Service, whether or not under a written or other law.

Importantly, this Bill does not preclude an innocent third party from seeking compensation for any injury or loss arising from an action of a member of the Police Service, which is negligent but neither malicious nor corrupt.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 September 1999. (P.D.p. 972)

(Act No. 42 of 1999 -- assented to on 25 November 1999)

Acts Amendment (Prisons Administration) Bill 2000 (No. 101) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to make a number of amendments to the *Prisons Act 1981* and associated legislation, which will improve the administration of custodial offender service in this State. The Bill amends various Acts in relation to certain functions of the Governor in Executive Council, and of the Chief Executive Officer of the Ministry of Justice.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5254)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Acts Amendment (Sexuality Discrimination) Bill 1997 (LC No. 75) (Hon. H. Hodgson)

The purpose of the Bill is to prohibit discrimination on the basis of an individual's sexuality, assumed sexuality or transgender identity by inserting new definitions and parts into the *Equal Opportunity Act 1994*. The Bill specifically addresses the following areas: work provisions, education, goods, services and facilities; accommodation, clubs and incorporated associations, discrimination in sport, land and other areas. The Bill amends the Criminal Code in respect of equalising the age of consent for gay men. The Bill also repeals the *Law Reform (Decriminalization of Sodomy) Act 1989*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 17 September 1997. (P.D.p. 6302)

Reinstated from the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 21 March 2000.

Referred to Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council 23 March 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals (Western Australia) Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 8) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to rectify an inconsistency in the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals (Western Australia) Act 1995*, through which certain veterinary chemicals and some veterinary preparations added to feedstuffs are exempt from the control of the Act. This means that controls that are intended to apply nationwide cannot currently be applied to these chemicals in Western Australia because of these exemptions. This Bill ameliorates this situation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2089)

(Act No.4 of 2000 -- assented to on 10 April 2000)

Animal Welfare Bill 1999 * (No. 79) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the protection of animals by -

- regulating the use of animals for scientific purposes; and
- prohibiting cruel, inhumane or improper treatment of animals.

The Bill intends to accomplish this by -

- promoting and protecting the welfare, safety and health of animals;
- ensuring the proper and humane care and management of animals in accordance
- with generally accepted standards; and
- reflecting the community's expectation that people who are in charge of animals
- will ensure that they are properly treated and cared for.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3699)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 1) 2000 (No. 129) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to grant supply and to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Fund certain sums for the recurrent services and purposes of the year ending 30 June 2001, as detailed in the estimates contained in the 2000/2001 Budget Papers.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6906)

(Act No.31 of 2000 -- assented to on 6 July 2000)

Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 2) 2000 (No. 130) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to grant supply and to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Fund certain sums for the capital services and purposes of the year ending 30 June 2001, as detailed in the estimates contained in the 2000/2001 Budget Papers.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6917)

(Act No.32 of 2000 -- assented to on 6 July 2000)

Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 3) 1999 (No. 4) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to appropriate out of the Consolidated Fund the sum of \$247,281,850.40 for recurrent payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 1998, for the purposes and services detailed in Schedule 1 of the Bill, and the sum of \$348,154,996.00 for recurrent payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 1999, for purposes and services detailed in Schedule 2 of the Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2091)

(Act No.18 of 2000 -- assented to on 28 June 2000)

Appropriation (Consolidated Fund) Bill (No. 4) 1999 (No. 5) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to appropriate out of the Consolidated Fund the sum of \$270,617,088.24 for capital payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 1998, for purposes and services detailed in Schedule 1 of the Bill, and the sum of \$24,316,297.25 for capital payments made during the financial year ended 30 June 1999, for purposes and services detailed in Schedule 2 of the Bill.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2091)

(Act No.19 of 2000 -- assented to on 28 June 2000)

Bail Amendment Bill 2000 * (No. 96) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to address a range of procedural difficulties which have arisen with the operation of the *Bail Act 1982*. The principal matters dealt with by the Bill are as follows. The Bill -

- clarifies the process of bail for persons appearing before the Court in answer to a summons;
- provides that judicial officers, in addition to their existing authority to grant or refuse bail, will be able to dispense with bail in cases of trivial offending;
- provides that a defendant who is charged with murder or wilful murder will only be considered for bail where an application has been made by the defendant or their counsel;

- provides that a decision to refuse release on bail will extend without further consideration for bail where a trial extends beyond one day, unless the defendant or a person on behalf of the defendant applies for bail to be re-considered;
- broadens the class of persons with powers to approve sureties;
- clarifies which Court Officer is responsible for instituting proceedings following a defendant's failure to attend at Court in compliance with a bail undertaking;
- establishes a formal appeal process to the Court of Criminal Appeal for appeals against bail decision made in the Supreme, District and Children's Court; and
- extends the period for an initial appearance in Court from 7 to 30 days, to enable a defendant to appear on their initial appearance before a Magistrate.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5466)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Building Legislation Amendment Bill 2000 * (No. 123) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Builders Registration Act 1939* and the *Home Building Contracts Act 1991* to enhance the ability of the Builders' Registration Board to maintain high building standards in Western Australia and to improve the operation of the Building Disputes Committee, which is to be renamed and hereafter referred to as the Building Disputes Tribunal, to a level of service which is acceptable to both government and the community.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 May 2000. (P.D.p. 7141)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Bulk Handling Repeal Bill 2000 (No. 133) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Bulk Handling Act 1967* and to deal with certain consequential and related matters.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 May 2000. (P.D.p. 7272)

(Act No.33 of 2000 -- assented to on 6 July 2000)

Child Support (Adoption of Laws) Amendment Bill 1999 (LC No. 3) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Child Support (Adoption of Laws) Act 1990 (WA)* by adopting a range of changes made to the *Child Support (Registration and Collection) Act 1998 (Clth)* and the *Child Support (Assessment) Act 1989 (Clth)* which have been enacted since 1994 when Western Australia last adopted changes to the Commonwealth child support legislation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 18 August 1999. (P.D.p. 375)

(Act No.21 of 2000 -- assented to on 30 June 2000)

Child Welfare Amendment Bill 1998 * (No. 164)

The purpose of this Bill is to regulate the operations of the Child Protection Services Register. The Register is the formal mechanism to improve co-ordination and co-operation across Government agencies.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 June 1998. (P.D.p. 4772)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 May 1999.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Referred to Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council 23 May 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Conservation and Land Management Amendment Bill 1999 * (No. 77) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984* to establish a new conservation body to be known as the "Conservation Commission of Western Australia", in which national parks, nature reserves, conservation parks, State forests and timber reserves will be vested.

The Bill contains related amendments including abolition of three existing bodies: the Lands and Forest Commission; the Forest Production Council; and the National Parks and Nature Conservation Authority. Amendments will also be made to the functions of the "Department of Conservation and Land Management", which will be re-named the "Department of Conservation".

The ability to contract for the harvesting of forest products from public land and timber sharefarm land and for the sale of those products will be removed from the Conservation and Land Management Act 1984. Those functions will be undertaken by the Forests Products Commission provided for in the *Forest Products Bill 1999*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3855)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 April 2000.

Referred to Select Committee on Ecologically Sustainable Development in the Legislative Council 25 May 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Constitution of Western Australia Bill 1997 (LC No. 61) (Hon. J.A. Cowdell)

The Bill seeks to overcome the worst deficiencies of the Constitution of Western Australia. It consolidates the *Constitution Act 1889* and the *Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1899* into one Act. It re-orders the sections of these Acts so that they are arranged in five parts - Preliminary, the Parliament, the Executive Government, the Judiciary and Local Government - and further arranged by division. Obsolete sections of the 1889 and 1899 Acts are discharged.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 15 October 1997. (P.D.p. 6791)

Referred to Standing Committee on Legislation the Legislative Council 9 September 1998.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Consumer Credit (Western Australia) Amendment Bill 1999 * (No. 58) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to bring the special transitional regulations contained in the Consumer Credit Regulation 1996 into the appendix of the *Consumer Credit (Western Australia) Act 1996* which is termed "the Consumer Credit Code", and makes them permanent. Coroners Amendment Bill 1999 (LC No. 24) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Coroners Act 1996*. The provisions included are -

- a Deputy State Coroner who will assist the State Coroner with coronial work throughout the State;
- the extensions to time limits for applications to the Supreme Court in relation to various decisions of the State Coroner; and
- if the senior next of kin has requested that a post mortem examination not be performed, the senior next of kin can withdraw that request and the Coroner may then direct that a post mortem examination be performed.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 14 September 1999. (P.D.p. 1052)

Court Security and Custodial Services Bill 1998 * (No. 54) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide a unified statutory framework for the substantial reorganisation of arrangements and powers in respect of the operation and provision of services central to the support and functioning of the court and related custody processes. These services include court security, court custody management, prisoner movement and lock-up management.

This Bill combines responsibility for these services under the Ministry of Justice. It transfers, from the Western Australia Police Service to the Ministry of Justice, responsibility for the operation of court security services and prisoner custody and transport services. This will release up to 200 police officer full-time-equivalents, enabling the deployment of these resources to core policing duties. The Bill gives responsibility to the Chief Executive Officer of the Ministry of Justice for the functions of lock-up management, court security, court custody and the movement of persons in custody.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 November 1998. (P.D.p. 3372)

Court Security and Custodial Services (Consequential Provisions) Bill 1998 * (No. 51) [E]

The *Court Security and Custodial Service Bill 1998* provides a unified statutory framework for the substantial reorganisation of arrangements and powers in respect of the operation and provision of services central to the support and functioning of the court and related custody processes. These services include court security, court custody management, prisoner movement and lock-up management.

Criminal Code Amendment Bill 1999 (LC No. 60)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend *The Criminal Code* in order to address criminal law reform in the areas of burglary and videotaped interviews conducted by officers of the Anti-Corruption Commission.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 24 March 1999. (P.D.p. 6960)

Amended in the Legislative Council on 15 June 1999.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No.35 of 1999 -- assented to on 18 October 1999)

Criminal Code Amendment Bill (No 2) 2000 (LC No. 105) (Hon. H. Hodgson)

To repeal the mandatory sentencing laws, known as the three strikes law, as they have been applied to the offence of home burglary in this state.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 30 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5746)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Criminal Property Confiscation Bill 2000 * (No. 145) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the confiscation in certain circumstances of property acquired as a result of criminal activity and property used for criminal activity, to provide for reciprocal enforcement of certain Australian legislation relating to the confiscation of profits of crime and the confiscation of other property, and for connected purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8611)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Culture, Libraries and the Arts Bill 1998 * (No. 35) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to, in conjunction with the *Culture, Libraries and the Arts (Consequential Provisions) Bill 1998*, makes the changes consequential to the formation of the Ministry of Culture and the Arts. The Bill has three major objectives -

- it establishes the Minister as a Body Corporate - The Corporate Minister;
- it defines the powers and responsibilities of the Body Corporate; and
- it establishes the Libraries Council of Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 October 1998. (P.D.p. 2667)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Culture, Libraries and the Arts (Consequential Provisions) Bill 1998 * (No. 36) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to deal with the amendments that can now be made to the *Art Gallery Act 1959* and to the *Museum Act 1969* as a result of the process began over a year ago to ensure that the Art Gallery of Western Australia and the Western Australian Museum become service agencies of the new Ministry for Culture and the Arts. The Bill removes the Corporate Status of these statutory authorities and creates two statutory advisory bodies, the Art Gallery Advisory Board and the Museum Council. The Bill also re-establishes the Art Gallery Foundation and creates the Museum Science and Humanities Foundation. Finally, the Bill repeals the *Perth Theatre Trust Act 1979* and the *Library Board of Western Australia Act 1951*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 October 1998. (P.D.p. 2669)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Dairy Industry and Herd Improvement Legislation Repeal Bill 2000 * (No. 110) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce legislation to de-regulate two major components of the dairy industry in Western Australia, by repealing two existing statutes: the *Dairy Industry Act 1973* and the *Herd Improvement Service Act 1984*. Simultaneously, the Bill also introduces transition provisions to ensure that relevant functions of existing statutory bodies are transferred to new organisations, which will be owned and managed by the dairy industry itself.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 April 2000. (P.D.p. 5982)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 May 2000.

Referred to Standing Committee on Constitutional Affairs in the Legislative Council on 9 May 2000.

(Act No.25 of 2000 -- assented to on 5 July 2000)

Director of Public Prosecutions Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 93) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to make a limited number of amendments to the *Director of Public Prosecutions Act 1991*, the effect of which will give the Director of Public Prosecutions the authority to bring and conduct, or take over, prosecutions for prescribed summary offences. The intention behind the Bill is limited in that it is presently planned only for prosecutions currently undertaken by the Western Australian Police Service. It will not impact upon the prosecution functions conducted by other agencies. The Crown Solicitor's Office will continue to undertake prosecutions on behalf of government agencies and those public sector agencies that prosecute their own cases, such as the Minister for Fair Trading and the Department of Transport, will continue to do so.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5253)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Disability Services Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 55) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to implement the recommendations of the report of a Ministerial Review undertaken into the operations and effectiveness of the *Disability Services Act 1993*. Specifically, the Bill will

- where it is in the best interests of people with disabilities, strengthen the application of competition policy to the outsourcing and purchasing of client services;
- respond to the community's strong support for better targeted services in the area of disability services complaints and reconciliation;
- strengthen the existing provisions relating to the reporting of client death and serious accidents; and
- increase the community's access to and involvement with the Disability Service Plan initiative by introducing decentralised reporting by all public authorities about their Disability Service Plans.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2486)

(Act No.44 of 1999 -- assented to on 25 November 1999)

Electoral Amendment Bill 2000 * (No. 134) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to implement a number of changes recommended by the Western Australian Electoral Commissioner, including -

- providing for the formal registration of political parties;
- enabling greater efficiency and convenience in the casting and processing of absentee and postal votes, and in candidate nominations; and
- removing a number of obsolete provisions from the *Electoral Act 1907*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 June 2000. (P.D.p. 7621)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Electoral Amendment (Constitutional Provisions) Bill 1997 (LC No. 66) (Hon. J.A. Cowdell)

This Bill is designed to give effect to the Report of the Joint Select Committee on the Constitution (1991). Currently the *Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1899* contains a number of sections on the disqualification of members. The committee recommended moving certain Electoral Act provisions into the Constitution, and moving the provisions for disqualification of members from the Constitution to the *Electoral Act 1907*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 21 October 1997 (P.D.p. 7058)

Referred to Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on 9 September 1998.

Reinstated to the Stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Financial Administration and Audit Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 67) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Financial Administration and Audit Act 1985* to allow for the implementation of accrual appropriations and a capital users charge. The Bill also contains an amendment to facilitate E-Commerce.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 27 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2787)

Referred to Standing Committee on Estimates and Financial Operations on 25 November 1999.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Financial Relations Agreement (Consequential Provisions) Bill 1999 (No. 46) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to put in place a number of measures to reform Commonwealth-State financial relations, as agreed by the Commonwealth and all States and Territories in June 1999. The Intergovernmental Agreement on the Reform of Commonwealth-State Financial Relations is based on the introduction of a GST by the Commonwealth government, which will replace the Commonwealth's existing wholesale sales tax and some State taxes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 September 1999. (P.D.p. 1654)

Referred to Standing Committee on Constitutional Affairs in the Legislative Council on 20 October 1999.

(Act No.53 of 1999 -- assented to on 13 December 1999)

First Home Owner Grant Bill 2000 (No. 111) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to put in place a scheme to assist eligible first home buyers by providing a \$7,000 grant where they enter into a contract on or after 1 July 2000 to purchase or build their first home.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 6 April 2000. (P.D.p. 6134)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 2 May 2000.

Referred to Standing Committee on Constitutional Affairs in the Legislative Council on 4 May 2000.

(Act No.16 of 2000 -- assented to on 9 June 2000)

Fish Resources Management Amendment Bill 1999 * (No. 78) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the Fish Resources Management Act 1994 to provide for a new type of licence (a "fishing tour operators licence") to be created by regulation. The commercial activity which the licence will regulate is the provision of "fee for service" recreational fishing tours, whether they are conducted on board a "charter boat" or through another form of guided fishing service.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3456)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Forest Products Bill 1999 * (No. 76) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to establish the Forest Products Commission as the body which will be responsible for contracting for the harvesting of forest products on public land and for selling those products. It will also have similar responsibilities with respect to timber sharefarming agreements entered into under section 34B of the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984* if harvesting or sale of forest products is provided for under such an agreement.

The Forest Products Commission will effectively take over the commercial responsibilities that the Department of Conservation and Land Management presently has with respect to the harvesting and sale of forest products and matters related to the forest products industry.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3858)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 4 April 2000.

Referred to Standing Committee on Ecologically Sustainable Development in the Legislative Council on 30 May 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Gaming Commission (Continuing Lotteries Levy) Bill 1999 * (No. 52) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the imposition of a prescribed levy on continuing lottery tickets. The Bill complements the *Acts Amendment (Continuing Lotteries) Bill 1999*, which transfers responsibility for the licensing and regulation of suppliers of continuing lottery tickets from the Commissioner of State Revenue to the Gaming Commission so that only one government agency is responsible for the licensing and regulation of continuing lotteries in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3696)

(Act No.5 of 2000 -- assented to on 11 April 2000)

Gas Corporation (Business Disposal) Bill 1999 * (No. 116) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the sale of AlintaGas by way of a Cornerstone Initial Public Offering (IPO). The Bill includes provisions that -

- establish the basis for the disposal of AlintaGas;
- enable and facilitate a convenient transfer of the business of AlintaGas from the corporation to the new owner;
- empower the Governor to make regulations for purposes related to the sale including to provide for a tariff path to 2002 and a capped tariff thereafter; and

- amend, or modify, a substantial number of other Acts to ensure a suitable industry structure is in place (including safety and consumer protection measures) in the context of a privately owned AlintaGas.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 July 1999. (P.D.p. 9930)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 12 October 1999.

(Act No.58 of 1999 -- assented to on 24 December 1999)

Gender Reassignment Bill (No. 2) 1997 * (No. 27)

The purpose of this Bill is to allow the reassignment of gender and establish a Gender Reassignment Board with power to issue recognition certificates; to make consequential amendments to the *Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1899* and the *Registration of Births, Death and Marriages Act 1961*; to amend the *Equal Opportunity Act 1984* to promote equality of opportunity, and provide remedies in respect of discrimination, on gender history grounds in certain cases.

This Bill was initially introduced and passed by the Legislative Council but was subsequently ruled out of order by the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly on 9 April 1997, on the grounds that it was in breach of s. 46 of the Constitution Act 1889. That Bill was subsequently re-introduced in the Legislative Assembly.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 April 1997 (P.D.p. 1360)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 24 November 1999.

(Act No.2 of 2000 -- assented to on 12 April 2000)

Genetically Modified Material (Temporary Prohibition) Bill 1999 (LC No. 50) (Hon. J. Scott)

The purpose of this Bill is to regulate the possession, disposition, cultivation or release of genetically modified material.

Bill introduced and first read in the Legislative Council on 19 October 1999.

Referred to Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on 19 October 1999.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Government Financial Responsibility Bill 1998 (No. 143)

The purpose of this Bill is to form a framework for government financial targeting, planning and reporting. The Bill will set out a number of requirements for the Government and Treasury, with the intent of strengthening the financial accountability and transparency of Government.

The Bill requires three tiers of "financial indicators" -

- principles;
- key elements; and
- targets.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 30 April 1998. (P.D.p. 2298)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 31 May 2000.

(Act No.26 of 2000 -- assented to on 5 July 2000)

Government Railways (Access) Amendment Bill 2000 * (No. 112) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to establish an independent office of the Rail Access Regulator.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 3 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6428)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Guardianship and Administration Amendment Bill 1999 (LC No. 41) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- amend the *Guardianship and Administration Act 1990*;
- allow for the appointment of alternative, conditional donees for Enduring Powers of Attorney;
- provide a hierarchy of persons who would be responsible to be able to provide consent without the need to apply to the Board for the appointment of a Guardian;
- provide additional functions for Plenary Guardians; and
- have donees of Enduring Powers of Attorney inform the Board if they become subject to bankruptcy provisions.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 23 September 1999. (P.D.p. 1595)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 11 May 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Health Professional (Special Events Exemption) Bill 1999 (No. 33) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to facilitate the provision of health care services by health professionals who accompany overseas teams to major sporting, cultural and other events in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2464)

Amended in the Legislative Council on 16 March 2000.

(Act No.7 of 2000 -- assented to on 14 April 2000)

Heritage Bill 1999 * (No. 95)

The purpose of this Bill is to re-write the present legislation in a more logical arrangement, with greater use of "plain english", and retaining the fundamentals of the existing legislation. However, small but significant changes to the system have been made which will make it more effective and easier to administer, and will provide greater transparency in decision making responsibility together with better focussed review procedures to provide greater accountability.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 June 1999. (P.D.p. 9555)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Heritage (Consequential Provisions) Bill 1999 * (No. 94)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend various acts as a consequence of the changes proposed by the *Heritage Bill 1999*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 June 1999. (P.D.p. 9558)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Hope Valley-Wattleup Redevelopment Bill 2000 * (No. 114) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- provide for the development and redevelopment of certain land in the local government districts of Cockburn and Kwinana (particularly in Hope Valley and Wattleup);
- appoint the Western Australian Land Authority as the Authority to undertake the development and redevelopment; and
- provide the necessary powers for the Authority to undertake the development and redevelopment.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 6 April 2000.(P.D.p. 6135)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 29 June 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Horticultural Produce Commission Amendment Bill 1999 * (No. 16) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide the opportunity for agricultural industry to be independent in the funding and management of services and activities. The amendments will allow industry trust funds currently operating under differing legislation to be rationalized under a consistent model.

Under the Bill, the "Horticultural Produce Commission" will become the "Agricultural Produce Commission", and the opportunities provided by the *Horticultural Produce Commission Act 1988* will be extended to all agricultural producers.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 August 1999. (P.D.p. 255)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 19 October 1999 and in the Legislative Council on 24 May 2000.

(Act No.20 of 2000 -- assented to on 30 June 2000)

Hospitals and Health Services Amendment Bill 1998 * (No. 48) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to underpin the establishment of the Metropolitan Health Service Board, to clarify the role of the Commissioner of Health and to improve the Minister's power to obtain information in the possession of appointed boards and to oblige appointed boards to keep the Minister informed of their financial and operational position.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 November 1998. (P.D.p. 3378)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Juries Amendment Bill 1998 (LC No. 18) [E]

This Bill amends the *Juries Act 1957* and provides for

- a more effective method of serving jury summonses;
- more widespread use of computer technology in the jury selection process;
- increasing the age limit of prospective jurors;
- excluding persons from jury service where they have been subject to a suspended imprisonment order; and
- a reduction in the number of citizens required to be summoned for jury service through reducing the number of peremptory challenges.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 22 October 1998. (P.D.p. 2525)

Amended in the Legislative Council on 10 March 1999 and in the Legislative Assembly on 6 May 1999.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No.12 of 2000 -- assented to on 27 May 2000)

Labour Relations Legislation Amendment (No. 2) Bill 1997 (LC No. 64) (Hon. H. Hodgson)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Labour Relations Legislation Amendment Act 1997* ("principal Act"). Provisions of the Bill include -

- repealing Part 3 of the principal Act and inserting new provisions relating to pre-strike ballots resulting in the requirements that the ballot be secret, that a scrutineer be appointed by the Commission and that all known members of the union are available to vote;
- providing limited immunity from legal action in two situations:
 - (i) where union action has been sanctioned by the secret ballot process; and
 - (ii) where an employer or an employee engages in industrial action for the purpose of compelling the other party to enter into a workplace agreement;
- repealing Part 5 of the principal Act, which removed the dual system of registration and awards at Federal and State levels;
- repealing the prohibition on the collection of union dues by employers;
- repealing section 34 of the principal Act so that the powers of entry revert to the former arrangements under which an employee could request that information relating to his or her employment be kept confidential; and
- repealing Part 4 of the principal Act relating to political expenditure and transferring it, in an amended form that extends the requirement for disclosure to all public companies as defined in the Corporations Law, into the *Electoral Act 1907*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 28 August 1997. (P.D.p. 5611)

Referred to Standing Committee on Public Administration in the Legislative Council on 9 September 1998.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Legal Contribution Trust Amendment Bill 2000 * (No. 137) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Legal Contribution Trust Act 1967* to widen the range of potential beneficiaries of surplus funding from the Legal Contribution Trust to include community legal centres and their peak organisations.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8614)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Liquor Licensing Amendment Bill 1998 (LC No. 7) (Hon. N. Kelly)

The Bill amends the *Liquor Licensing Act 1988* to limit the number of licences that can be held by any individual, company or associated groups of individuals or companies.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 19 August 1998. (P.D.p. 452)

Amended in the Legislative Council on 5 May 1999.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Liquor Licensing Amendment (Petrol Stations and Lodgers' Registers) Bill 2000 * (LC No. 90) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- preclude the licensing authority from granting liquor licenses that authorise the sale of packaged liquor from petrol stations in most areas;
- provide for the cancellation of liquor licences that authorise the sale of packaged liquor if a petrol station is established on the same premises; and
- reduce from six years to two years the time a hotel licensee is required to retain a register of lodgers.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 6 April 2000. (P.D.p. 6070)

Amended in the Legislative Council 30 May 2000.

(Act No.23 of 2000 -- assented to on 30 June 2000)

Local Government (Political Donations and Electoral Expenditure) Amendment Bill 1997 * (No. 108) (Dr G.I. Gallop)

The purpose of this Bill is to incorporate recommendation 142 of the Commission on Government requiring the disclosure of political donations received and electoral expenditure relating to local government elections.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 November 1997. (P.D.p. 8219)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Maritime and Transport Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 1999 * (No. 37) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to consolidate into one Act matters relating to the Western Australian maritime industry that were previously covered under eight separate Acts. The Bill is presented in conjunction with the *Maritime Bill 1999*.

The Acts to be repealed are the -

- *Harbours and Jetties Act 1928*;
- *Jetties Act 1926*;
- *Lights (Navigation) Protection Act 1938*;
- *Marine and Harbours Act 1981*;
- *Marine Navigation Aids Act 1973*;
- *Pilots Limitation of Liability Act 1962*;
- *Shipping and Pilotage Act 1967*; and
- *Western Australian Marine Act 1982*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3876)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Maritime Bill 1999 * (No. 39) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to enable the provision of infrastructure necessary for the efficient and safe conduct of maritime activities and industries in Western Australia and to facilitate safety in relation to the design standards, construction, operation and navigation of vessels. The Bill has been drafted to provide government, industry and the community the flexibility to meet the current and future needs of this State's vibrant maritime industries and the demands of water based recreation. It will also provide government the flexibility for any future shift from direct provision and management of maritime services and activities.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3875)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Maritime Fees and Charges (Taxing) Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 34) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to validate any mooring or maritime dues and charges to be imposed under the Maritime Bill 1999, to the extent that any of those fees is a tax.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3877)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Amendment Bill 1999 (LC No. 17) (Hon. N. Kelly)

To amend the *Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act 1959*, with the primary intent to allow for the partial disallowance of omnibus amendments to the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 18 August 1999. (P.D.p. 377)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Midland Redevelopment Bill 1999 * (No. 117)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the establishment of the Midland Redevelopment Authority with planning, development control and other functions to undertake the redevelopment of parts of Midland.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 July 1999. (P.D.p. 9935)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 19 August 1999 and in the Legislative Council on 27 October 1999.

(Act No.38 of 1999 -- assented to on 11 November 1999)

Misuse of Drugs Amendment (Cannabis Cautioning Notices) Bill 1999 * (LC No. 19)
(Hon. C. Sharp)

The main purposes of this Bill are -

- to reduce the social impacts of a conviction for simple cannabis offences;
- to make the penalties which apply to the drug consistent with its capacity to produce harm;
- to reduce the costs to the criminal justice system, including the police and the courts, of prosecuting simple cannabis offences;
- to make cannabis law more consistent with community values; and
- to acknowledge the use of cannabis as primarily a health issue.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 19 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2151)

Amended in the Legislative Council 6 April 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Mount Yokine Land Acquisition Repeal Bill 2000 (No. 131) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *Mount Yokine Land Acquisition Act 1960*, to permit alternative land tenure to be put in place in favour of the Western Australian Golf Club (Inc.).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8409)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

National Rail Corporation Agreement Repeal Bill 1999 * (LC No. 2) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the *National Rail Corporation Agreement Act 1992*. The Bill is to come into effect on the day when the National Rail Corporation is sold.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 12 August 1999. (P.D.p. 135)

(Act No.48 of 1999 -- assented to on 8 December 1999)

Native Title (State Provisions) Bill 1999 * (No. 70) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to establish a State Native Title Commission to deal with future acts involving native title in this State. It establishes a State based regime for unallocated Crown land and Aboriginal reserves and there is a new process for consultation for infrastructure titles and developments within towns and cities.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3299)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 25 November 1999 and in the Legislative Council on 14 December 1999

(Act No.60 of 2000 -- assented to on 10 January 2000)

New Tax System Price Exploitation Code (Taxing) Bill 1999 * (No. 43) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to support the *New Tax System Price Exploitation Code (Western Australia) Bill 1999*. This Bill provides that if a fee is a tax in connection with the regulation of the New Tax System Price Exploitation Code, this Act imposes the fee. These fees must be paid to the Commonwealth.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 September 1999. (P.D.p. 1659)

Referred to Standing Committee on Constitutional Affairs in the Legislative Council on 21 October 1999.

(Act No.50 of 1999 -- assented to on 7 December 1999)

New Tax System Price Exploitation Code (Western Australia) Bill 1999 * (No. 44) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to assist in the prevention of price exploitation under the Commonwealth Government's new tax system. The Bill is designed to overcome the limitations of the legislative power of the Commonwealth Parliament. This is due to the fact that certain activities, such as transactions involving individuals or partnerships, may fall outside the scope of the revised Commonwealth *Trade Practices Act 1974*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 September 1999. (P.D.p. 1658)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 20 October 1999.

Referred to Standing Committee on Constitutional Affairs in the Legislative Council on 21 October 1999.

(Act No.51 of 1999 -- assented to on 7 December 1999)

Nuclear Activities (Prohibitions) Bill 2000 (LC No. 144) (Hon. G. Watson)

The objects of this Bill are to protect the health, welfare and safety of the people of Western Australia; and to limit deterioration of the environment by prohibiting nuclear activities. It also prohibits the exploration for, and the mining of, thorium or uranium. It also prohibits the construction or operation of any facility, or alter or modify an existing facility, for any purpose that is intended for, or enables engaging in, nuclear activities.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 21 June 2000. (P.D.p. 7929)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Nuclear Waste Storage (Prohibition) Act 1999 (No. 38) [E] (Dr G.I. Gallop)

The purpose of this Bill is to prohibit the construction and operation of a nuclear waste storage facility for any radioactive material derived from the operations of a nuclear reactor, nuclear weapons facility, nuclear reprocessing plant or isotope enrichment plant in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 8 September 1999. (P.D.p. 885)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 20 October 1999 and in the Legislative Council on 24 November 1999.

(Act No.54 of 1999 -- assented to on 7 December 1999)

Occupational Safety and Health Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 109) (Dr G.I. Gallop)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the definition of an "employee" in the *Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984* to include officers of the Western Australian Police Service, thus bringing police officers under the provisions of the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 June 1999. (P.D.p. 9461)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Offshore Minerals Bill 2000 * (No. 126) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the administration of mineral exploration and development in coastal waters adjacent to the State.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6888)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Offshore Minerals (Consequential Amendments) Bill 2000 * (No. 127) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the various Acts to be affected by the proclamation of the *Offshore Minerals Act 2000*. These Acts are -

- the *Mining Act 1978*;
- the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984*; and
- the *Fish Resources Management Act 1994*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6889)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Offshore Minerals (Registration Fees) Bill 2000 * (No. 128) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to effectively mirror the Commonwealth *Offshore (Registration Fees) Act 1994* and provides for the method of calculation and payment of fees required for the registration of certain documents affecting titles in State coastal waters - titles to be granted under the *Offshore Minerals Act 2000*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6890)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Parks and Reserves Amendment Bill 1998 (No. 14)

The purpose of this Bill is to enable the appointment of Boards to manage reserves regardless of which Act of Parliament created them. This will assist the Government in its program of efficient management of Crown land in the public interest.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 October 1998. (P.D.p. 2188)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Parliamentary Superannuation Legislation Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 81) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to introduce a number of changes to the superannuation arrangements for State parliamentarians. These are -

- closing the existing scheme to future Members of Parliament;
- allowing certain current Members to withdraw from the existing scheme and transfer to the new arrangements;
- transferring responsibility for changes to the rules of the existing scheme to an independent statutory authority, the Salaries and Allowances Tribunal, and;
- empowering the Salaries and Allowances Tribunal to determine the level of superannuation for future Members of Parliament and for any current Members who choose to withdraw from the existing scheme.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 18 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3454)

Amended in the Legislative Council 28 June 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Planning Appeals Bill 1999 * (No. 102)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the abolition of the Tribunal and Ministerial planning appeal systems, replacing them with a single entirely new system. This new system will not materially affect the manner in which appeals arise or are lodged, but will substitute a new process by which they are handled and determined. A new position of "Director of Planning Appeals" will be created. The person occupying this position will, with the assistance of a community representative, a Registrar, a number of professional and experienced assessors, and necessary staff, arrange for the appeals to be processed and determined.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 June 1999. (P.D.p. 9551)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Planning Appeals (Transitional and Consequential Provisions) Bill 1999 * (No. 103)

The purpose of this Bill is to make various other amendments required to other pieces of legislation as a consequence of the proposals contained in the *Planning Appeals Bill 1999*, under which the existing Tribunal and Ministerial planning appeal systems will be replaced by one new appeals system.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 June 1999. (P.D.p. 9555)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Planning Legislation Amendment Bill 1998 * (No. 119)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the current planning legislation to achieve three separate outcomes. These are to -

- provide two new rights of appeal under the *Town Planning and Development Act 1928*;
- provide a head of power for local government fees and charges for planning services under the *Town Planning and Development Act 1928*;
- amend the *Western Australian Planning Commission Act 1985* to provide the WA Planning Commission with the same planning tools for country region schemes as it now has for the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 7 April 1998. (P.D.p. 1551)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 18 November 1998 and in the Legislative Council on 22 April 1999

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No.59 of 2000 -- assented to on 10. January 2000)

Plant Pests and Diseases (Eradication Funds) Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 107) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to extend the expiry date of the *Plant Pests and Diseases (Eradication Funds) Act 1974* by two years to 31 October 2002. This extension is necessary to avoid the loss of the fund-raising mechanisms provided to the grains and seeds industries by the Act, and enable continuity of eradication programs currently being funded under the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 5 April 2000. (P.D.p. 5981)

(Act No.15 of 2000 -- assented to on 9 June 2000)

Poisons Amendment (Cannabis for Medical and Commercial Uses) Bill 1999 * (LC No. 20) (Hon. C. Sharp)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Poisons Act 1964*. It will allow General Practitioners to recommend to the Commissioner of Health that particular patients be permitted to use cannabis to relieve specific ailments. Criminal penalties for patients who use cannabis medicinally will be removed. The commercial production of low THC cannabis for hemp will be legalised.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 19 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2154)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Police Act Amendment (Prohibition of Street Prostitution) Bill 1999 (No. 82) [E] (Mrs M. Roberts)

The purpose of this Bill is to prohibit the activity of street prostitution and set various penalties arising from prosecutions associated with this activity.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3320)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Police (Confidence Power and Review) Amendment Bill 1998 (No. 6) (Dr G.I. Gallop)

Synopsis to follow when second reading of the Bill commences.

Bill introduced and first read in the Legislative Assembly on 12 August 1998.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Police (Immunity from Civil Liability) Bill 1998 * (No. 13) (Hon. P.G. Pandal)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for civil immunity for police officers for acts or omissions done in good faith in the course of exercising their powers and duties as police officers.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 September 1998. (P.D.p. 1090)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Prisoners (International Transfer) Bill 1999 * (LC No. 26) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to enable Western Australia to join a Commonwealth-State scheme for the international transfer of prisoners.

As a consequence of the enactment of the Commonwealth *International Transfer of Prisoners Act 1997*, it is necessary for Western Australia to enact "model" State legislation to give effect to the scheme. It provides a framework to allow the Commonwealth Act to operate in Western Australia and complements the Commonwealth Act which contains most of the core elements of the transfer scheme.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 14 September 1999. (P.D.p. 1051)

(Act No.10 of 2000 -- assented to on 19 May 2000)

Prisons Amendment Bill 1998 * (No. 56)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Prisons Act 1981* to establish a framework which will allow for the provision of prison services under contract and for related matters and also to amend various other Acts as a consequence.

The core of the Bill is the extension of the statutory powers of the Chief Executive Officer of the Ministry of Justice to enter into service delivery arrangements with the private sector. The Chief Executive Officer will continue to be accountable for the operation of all Western Australian prisons, private as well as public, and will have all the powers necessary to ensure compliance with the Act and to ensure that services meet or exceed the standards set by the Ministry. The Chief Executive Officer will also be authorised to delegate sufficient powers to enable operational duties to be performed by a contractor.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 3 December 1998. (P.D.p. 4859)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 8 September 1999.

(Act No.43 of 1999 -- assented to on 8 December 1999)

Prisons (Pyrton) Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 139) [E] (Mr C.M. Brown)

The purpose of this Bill is to ensure that the proclamation made by the Governor under section 5 of the *Prisons Act 1981* declaring the land known as Pyrton as a prison is revoked, and to remove any power for the Governor to make a proclamation of that nature in the future.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 June 2000. (P.D.p. 7644)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Prostitution Bill 1999 * (No. 87) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide increased powers for Western Australian police to control better child prostitution, kerb crawlers, and advertising and sponsorship.

Specifically the Bill -

- precludes children from being prostitutes and prevents their exploitation for sexual gratification;
- protects the community by creating offences relating to health; and
- introduces offences to make street soliciting and kerb crawling illegal, regardless of who initiated the action, whether a prostitute or a client.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3599)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 24 November 1999 and in the Legislative Council on 9 December 1999.

(Act No.17 of 2000 -- assented to on 22 June 2000)

Prostitution Limitation Bill 2000 (LC No. 115) (Hon. M.W. Nevill)

The purpose of this Bill is to impose limitations on soliciting in a public place for the purposes of prostitution. The Bill allows prostitutes soliciting and persons soliciting the services of a prostitute in a public place to be detained for up to 12 hours and if apprehended for a second time [in the case of a prostitute] must attend a court-approved drug rehabilitation program and [in the case of a person soliciting the services of a prostitute] is liable for a fine of \$1000 for a first offence, a fine of \$3000 for a second offence and a fine of \$5000 for subsequent offences.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 6 April 2000. (P.D.p. 6069)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Protective Custody Bill 2000 * (No. 97) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to extend the provisions of Part VA of the *Police Act 1892* to include all intoxicated persons, whatever the cause of the intoxication. Part VA provides police with the power to apprehend and detain persons intoxicated by alcohol.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5466)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Public Scrutiny of Bills and Regulations Bill 1997 * (No. 113) (Mr C.M. Brown)

The purpose of this Bill is to establish a framework and process to facilitate scrutiny of Government legislation by the Parliament and the people of Western Australia. The Bill seeks to achieve this objective by

-

- opening up the legislative process to make it more transparent and accountable;
- encouraging greater public participation in the assessment of legislation;
- creating better legislative outcomes by testing the economic, social and environmental impact of proposed laws and regulations.

Provisions of the Bill include requiring the Minister to table an impact statement on the day of the second reading of a Bill in the House in which the Bill originates; requiring that all Bills be referred to a committee with the mandate to review the proposed legislation; and, giving the public an opportunity to comment on the proposed legislation through submissions to the parliamentary committee considering the Bill. The Bill includes similar provisions in relation to regulations.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 November 1997. (P.D.p. 8698)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Rail Freight System Bill 1999 * (No. 89) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide the legislative authority for the Government to sell Westrail's freight business and the associated assets other than the freight railway corridor.

To achieve this, the Bill provides for -

- the establishment of a Rail Corridor Minister to exercise powers on behalf of the State in respect of the freight railway corridor, including the power to dispose of interests and right of use no greater than leasehold;
- the conferral of powers on the Minister and Westrail to dispose of the rail freight business;
- the removal of the freight railway from the control of the Government Railways Act 1904, designating it as "corridor land" or "land other than corridor land" and placing it under the control of the Rail Corridor Minister;
- the cancellation of the designation of corridor land if the agreement permitting its use is terminated. There is provision for the land to be redesignated as a government railway in such a case;
- placing the rail corridor on an equal footing to a road corridor with respect to exemption from State land taxes and local government rates; and
- extending the application of the State rail access regime to a private operator of the Westrail network, and amending the Government Railways (Access) Act 1998 accordingly.

Railway Discontinuance Bill 2000 (LC No. 15) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to formally discontinue the Midland Junction to Welshpool Railway and the Fremantle to Kwinana Railway.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 4 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6518)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Railway (Northern and Southern Urban Extensions) Bill 1999 (LC No. 73) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to authorise the construction of a railway from -

- Currambine to Butler; and
- Jandakot to Rockingham and from Rockingham to Mandurah.

This new railway will be an extension of the urban passenger railway network and will provide for a new urban passenger railway service to operate from Perth to Mandurah via Kenwick, Jandakot, Kwinana and Rockingham.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 10 November 1999. (P.D.p. 2895)

(Act No.49 of 1999 -- assented to on 8 December 1999)

Real Estate Legislation (Fidelity Guarantee Funds) Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 29) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to give consumers greater protection in their dealings with real estate and business agents and settlement agents, by improving their access to the Fidelity Guarantee Funds. These funds are administered by the Real Estate and Business Agents Supervisory Board and the Settlement Agents Supervisory Board. Currently, the relevant Acts require that a person lodge notice of a claim within 12 months of the consumer becoming aware of the defalcation on which the claim is based. This Bill extends that period to 3 years, and provides the Boards with the discretionary ability to accept claims that are up to 6 years old.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2090)

(Act No.3 of 2000 -- assented to on 12 April 2000)

Restraining Orders Amendment Bill 2000 (LC No. 74) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Restraining Orders Act 1997* by -

- expanding protection to children and proceedings in the Children's Court;
- granting power to courts exercising family law jurisdiction to make restraining orders; and
- clarifying the transitional provisions of the principal Act in relation to orders made previously under the *Justices Act 1902*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 29 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5644)

(Act No.2 of 2000 -- assented to on 30 June 2000)

Revenue Laws Amendment (Assessment) Bill 2000 (No. 135) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to implement a number of measures to improve the equity and efficiency of the taxation arrangements of the State, via amendments to the *Stamp Act 1921* and the *Land Tax Assessment Act 1976*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 May 2000. (P.D.p. 7273)

(Act No.29 of 2000 -- assented to on 6 July 2000)

Rights in Water and Irrigation Amendment Bill 1999 * (No. 100) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to establish objectives for managing water. It sets out the scope of water resource management, the types of resource use that should be fostered and an obligation for the Water and Rivers Commission to work with the community. The objectives of the Bill are to manage water resources sustainable; protect environmental values; encourage the efficient use of water; and actively engage local communities in management.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 1 July 1999. (P.D.p. 9936)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 23 November 1999.

Referred to Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on 29 March 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Road Traffic Amendment Bill 1999 * (No. 40) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to implement aspects of the Driver Licence Module developed by the National Road Transport Commission Reform Package and the Government's road safety objectives as outlined in the report entitled "The Way Ahead - Road Safety Directions for Western Australia". Changes include the introduction of nationally agreed drivers licence classifications, Graduated Driver Training and Licensing System, compulsory photographs and signatures on drivers licences, and the storage of digital photographic images. The Bill also provides for the service of demerit point suspension notices by mail.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3700)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 6 April 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Road Traffic Amendment Bill (No.2) 2000 * (LC No. 124) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to make minor amendments to the *Road Traffic Act 1974* necessary to empower the making of regulations, which will introduce two national road transport reforms in Western Australia. These reforms are the Australian Vehicle Standards Rules and the Heavy Vehicle Operating Standards.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 23 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6966)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Road Traffic Amendment (Vehicle Licensing) Bill 2000 * (No. 148) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to align vehicle licensing practices in Western Australia with the National Registration Scheme under the national competition policy agreement.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8589)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Road Traffic Amendment (Vehicle Licensing) (Taxing) Bill 2000 * (No. 147) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to accommodate changes consequent upon the *Road Traffic Amendment (Vehicle Licensing) Bill 2000*, which includes amendments that transfer the Second Schedule of the Act containing vehicle licence fees to the regulations. This Bill imposes certain charges under section 19(3) of the *Road Traffic Act 1974* to the extent that those fees or charges may be a tax.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8590)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Salaries and Allowances Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 12) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to remedy an inequity that exists with regard to the process of review and determination of remuneration for part-time members of tribunals and boards. The present provisions of the *Salaries and Allowances Act 1975* limits the power of the Salaries and Allowances Tribunal to make determinations of remuneration only in respect to persons who hold an office of a full-time nature.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 21 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2464)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

School Education Bill 1997 * (No. 47) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide a completely new legislative and administrative framework by which the operations of Government schools, non-government schools and home education can be effectively managed.

The Bill is based on four key objectives -

- every Western Australian child has a right to receive a school education;
- parents have a right to choose the form of education that best suits their child's needs, whether at a Government school, a non-government school or in a home educating setting;
- parents have a responsibility to work together in partnership with schools for children's schooling to be successful;
- a Government school system must be provided to meet the educational needs of all children; and
- repeals the *Education Act 1928*.

Highlights of the Bill include -

- compulsory education for children aged between 6 and 15 years (with an exemption provision);
- provision of enrolment information to be collected by schools, including both custody information for estranged families and information about the vaccination status of the child;
- the compulsory education requirement can be met by home education and a Home Education Advisory Board will be established;
- establishing School Attendance Panels to help deal with absenteeism;
- allowing flexibility in setting intake boundaries for Government schools;
- requiring the education minister to consult the local community before closing or amalgamating schools;
- ruling out corporal punishment in Government schools; and
- provision for students to withdraw from programs such as religious education, on the ground of conscientious objection.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 November 1997. (P.D.p. 8663)

Referred to Standing Committee on Public Administration in the Legislative on 19 August 1998.

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 23 June 1998 and in the Legislative Council on 1 December 1998
Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No.36 of 1999 -- assented to on 2 November 1999)

Scrutiny of Government Publicity Bill 1997 (No. 72) (Dr G.I. Gallop)

The purpose of this Bill is to restrict the expenditure of public money on Government publicity for a partisan political purpose, ie. government publicity that has, or is likely to have, the capacity to influence public support for a political party or its candidates or for a member of a House of Parliament.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 September 1997. (P.D.p. 6391)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Sentence Administration Bill 1998 * (No. 49) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is, in conjunction with the *Sentence Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 1998*, to -

- provide a clear, consistent sentencing regime that the public will be able to understand;
- make the Courts more accountable and consistent in sentencing; and
- give Parliament more control over the sentences that will be imposed, particularly for offences seen as of especial aggravation to the community.

The principal reforms contained in both Bills relate to -

- changes to the systems of remission and parole;
- the introduction of a presumptive sentencing matrix; and
- changes to sentencing legislation concerning suspended sentences, driving licence disqualification, sentencing guidelines to be issued by the Chief Stipendiary Magistrate, and restitution and compensation.

- give Parliament more control over the sentences that will be imposed, particularly for offences seen as of especial aggravation to the community.

The principal reforms contained in both Bills relate to -

- changes to the systems of remission and parole;
- the introduction of a presumptive sentencing matrix; and
- changes to sentencing legislation concerning suspended sentences, driving licence disqualification, sentencing guidelines to be issued by the Chief Stipendiary Magistrate, and restitution and compensation.

- give Parliament more control over the sentences that will be imposed, particularly for offences seen as of especial aggravation to the community.

This Bill forms part of the *Sentencing Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 1998* [50-2], which was divided into two Bills by the Legislative Council. The reason for dividing that Bill was so that the other part of the Bill; the *Sentencing Matrix Bill 1999* [99-1], could be referred to the Standing Committee on Legislation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 8 December 1998. (P.D.p. 5036)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 19 October 1999.

(Act No.57 of 1999 -- assented to on 16 December 1999)

Sentencing Matrix Bill 1999 * (LC No. 99)

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- amend the *Sentencing Act 1995*;
- amend the *Young Offenders Act 1994*; and
- provide for a sentencing matrix enabling a clear and consistent sentencing regime that the public will be able to understand.

This Bill was created after the *Sentencing Legislation Amendment and Repeal Bill 1998* [50-2] had its second reading agreed to and the House further agreed to divide that Bill into two Bills, thus enabling this part of the Bill to be referred to the Standing Committee on Legislation.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 27 May 1999. (P.D.p. 8515)

Referred to Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on 27 May 1999.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Soil and Land Conservation Amendment Bill 2000 * (No. 142) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to give effect to the thrust of the proposed *Tree Plantation Agreements Act 2000*, by providing protection from a prohibition of harvest that may be applied under the *Soil and Land Conservation Act 1945*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8405)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Stamp Amendment Bill 1999 (LC No. 68) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to -

- amend the *Stamp Act 1921*;
- ensure that duty is paid on chattels that are transferred in conjunction with the grant of a long term lease; and
- provide an exemption from stamp duty in circumstances where property that is vested in a bankruptcy trustee on the bankruptcy of a person is conveyed from the bankruptcy trustee back to that person.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 23 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3510)

(Act No.28 of 2000 -- assented to on 6 July 2000)

Stamp Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2000 * (No. 141) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to exempt tree plantation agreements from duty under the *Stamp Act 1921*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8407)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

State Entities (Payments) Bill 1999 (No. 45) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for GST equivalent payments to be made by State entities to the Australian Taxation Office.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 September 1999. (P.D.p. 1657)

Referred to Standing Committee on Constitutional Affairs in the Legislative Council on 20 October 1999.

(Act No.52 of 1999 -- assented to on 7 December 1999)

State Records Bill 1999 * (No. 83) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to replace the record keeping aspects of the *Library Board of Western Australia Act 1951* and provide for the establishment of an independent State Records Commission, which will strengthen public sector accountability through effective record keeping, provide a standard-setting and monitoring function reportable directly to the Parliament and take account of technological and administrative trends in record keeping.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3697)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

State Records (Consequential Provisions) Bill 1999 * (No. 84) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend all State Acts, which make reference to record keeping, to conform with the provisions laid out in the *State Records Bill 1999*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3699)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

State Superannuation Bill 1999 * (No. 63) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to repeal the legislation governing the State's public sector superannuation schemes and establish a new framework to provide better superannuation for public sector employees.

At the broad level the proposed changes will -

- provide more flexibility for members and access to industry standard superannuation and new products and services;
- remove unintended anomalies and inequities;
- ensure timely compliance with relevant Commonwealth legislation; and
- support more efficient administration, which has the potential to deliver lower costs to members and savings to Government.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2789)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

State Superannuation (Transitional and Consequential Provisions) Bill 1999 * (No. 62) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to, as a consequence of the *State Superannuation Bill 1999*, -

- allow for the transition of the Government Employees Superannuation Board and the Government Employees Superannuation Fund from the existing legislative framework contained in the *Government Employees Superannuation Act 1987* and the *Superannuation and Family Benefits Act 1938*, to the new legislative framework proposed in the *State Superannuation Bill 1999*;
- amend various other Acts to replace references to the *Government Employees Superannuation Act 1987* and the *Superannuation and Family Benefits Act 1938* with the new references required as a result of the *State Superannuation Bill 1999*; and
- delete references in the enabling legislation of various statutory authorities and statutory office holders that recognise those authorities and office holders for superannuation purposes, so that these provisions can be incorporated within the regulations of the new legislative framework.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2790)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

State Trading Concerns Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 65)

The purpose of this Bill is to enable the Treasurer to extend by regulation the statutory powers of statutory authorities and departments whose Minister or Chief Executive Officer is constituted as a body corporate, to engage in certain commercial activities involving the provision of -

- goods, information or intellectual property;
- scientific, technical, educational, training, management or advisory services; and
- advertising opportunities which would include sponsorships.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 25 March 1999. (P.D.p. 7143)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 10 November 1999.

(Act No.45 of 1999 -- assented to on 7 December 1999)

Statutes (Repeals and Minor Amendments) Bill 1998 (LC No. 57) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the statute law by repealing -

- the *Dried Fruits Act 1947*;
 - the *Snowy Mountains Engineering Corporation Enabling Act 1971*; and
 - the *Wundowie Works Management and Foundry Agreement Act 1966*,
- and by making minor amendments to various enactments, and for related purposes.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 3 December 1998. (P.D.p. 4800)

Referred to Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on 9 December 1998.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Amended in the Legislative Council on 14 March 23000.

(Act No.24 of 2000 -- assented to on 4 July 2000)

Superannuation and Family Benefits Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 106) (Hon. P.G. Pental)

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Superannuation and Family Benefits Act 1938* to allow widowers access to the benefits of a deceased wife's superannuation (who was employed in the Public Service and had superannuation with the Government Employees Superannuation Fund) from the Government Employees Superannuation Fund.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 23 June 1999. (P.D.p. 9465)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Telecommunications (Interception) Western Australia Amendment Bill 1999 * (No. 91)

The purpose of this Bill is to provide telecommunication interception powers for the Anti-Corruption Commission by declaring them an eligible agency under the *Telecommunications (Interception) Western Australia Act 1996*.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 17 June 1999. (P.D.p. 9244)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No.1 of 2000 -- assented to on 28 March 2000)

Therapeutic Goods (Western Australia) Bill 1999 * (No. 88) (Ms S. McHale) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide Western Australia with legislation complementary to the Commonwealth *Therapeutic Goods Act 1989*, which provided for state jurisdictions to enact their own complementary legislation to enable trade through each State. The Bill will ensure the development of a national system of controls relating to quality, safety, efficacy and timely availability of therapeutic goods.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 24 November 1999. (P.D.p. 3724)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Therapeutic Goods (Western Australia) Bill 2000 * (No. 138) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to complement the Commonwealth *Therapeutic Goods Act 1989*, in further advancing towards the achievement of a unified national system of controls in relation to products with the potential to affect public health.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8410)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Titles (Validation) and Native Title (Effect of Past Acts) Amendment Bill 1999 (No. 42) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to amend the *Titles (Validation) and Native Title (Effect of Past Acts) Act 1995* to confirm the effect on native title of all previous exclusive possession acts and to confirm the effects of all public works on native title.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 September 1999. (P.D.p. 1309)

Amended in the Legislative Council on 16 November 1999.

(Act No.55 of 1999 -- assented to on 13 December 1999)

Totalisator Agency Board Betting Tax Amendment Bill 1999 * (No. 23) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to complement the *Acts Amendment (Fixed Odds Betting) Bill 1999*, which authorises the conduct of fixed odds betting by the Totalisator Agency Board (T.A.B.). With the proposed introduction of this initiative, this Bill establishes the rate of tax payable on fixed odds betting turnover.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 19 August 1999. (P.D.p. 504)

(Act No.41 of 1999 -- assented to on 16 November 1999)

Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (Western Australia) Bill 1999 * (No. 7) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to implement the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Agreement in Western Australia. All Australian heads of government and the New Zealand Prime Minister signed the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Arrangement in 1996. The objective of the arrangement is to remove regulatory barriers to the movement of goods and services between Australian jurisdictions and New Zealand.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 14 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2092)

Referred to Standing Committee on Constitutional Affairs in the Legislative Council on 27 October 1999.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Transport Co-ordination Amendment Bill 1998 (No. 120) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for private sector management through competitive tendering of the Transperth Bus Fleet, which was purchased by Transport in June 1996. The Bill will provide a regulatory regime for the setting of fares, the conduct of passengers and the issue of infringement notices for non-payment of fares on contract bus services, as well as the introduction of standards for the bus and coach industry in Western Australia.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 9 April 1998. (P.D.p. 1849)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 6 May 1999 and 3 June 1999.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Referred to Standing Committee on Estimates and Financial Operations in the Legislative Council on 14 March 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Bill 2000 (No. 118) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to authorise the Treasurer to make certain payments and advances for authorised purposes chargeable to the Consolidated Fund or the Treasurer's Advance Account within the monetary limit available for the financial year commencing 1 July 2000. The monetary limit specified within clause 4 of the Bill represents an authorisation for the Treasurer to withdraw up to \$300 million for the financing of payments and advances in the 2000/2001 financial year.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 11 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6917)

(Act No.30 of 2000 -- assented to on 6 July 2000)

Tree Plantation Agreements Bill 2000 * (No. 140) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the making of agreements between owners, or lessees of land with the consent of the owners, and persons who wish to establish joint ventures with them for the purpose of planting, maintaining and harvesting a tree plantation on the land.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8402)

Lapsed in the Legislative Assembly on prorogation of the Session.

Trust Removal (Mount Claremont Land) Bill 1998 (No. 22)

The purpose of this Bill is to effect the removal of a trust from Lot 87 held by the Crown in Certificate of Title Volume 1809 Folio 190. Lot 87 is bounded by Rochdale Road and Whitney Crescent, Mount Claremont.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 12 November 1998. (P.D.p. 3372)

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Vexatious Proceedings Restriction Bill 2000 * (LC No. 136) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to address the difficulties of having persons declared to be vexatious under the existing *Vexatious Proceedings Restriction Act 1930*, which is proposed to be repealed.

Importantly, the Bill will widen the range of persons who may seek an order that a person is a vexatious litigant. Another key feature of the Bill is that it also provides for the rescission or variation of an order that a person is a vexatious litigant and for the recognition of orders made in another jurisdiction. The Bill also provides protection to a person who may be the target of a vexatious litigant.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 28 June 2000. (P.D.p. 8354)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Voluntary Euthanasia Bill 2000 (LC No. 121) (Hon. N. Kelly)

The purpose of this Bill is to permit a person to end his or her life deliberately with medical assistance where that person has an illness or medical condition that will most likely cause the death of that person and the pain and suffering arising from or relating to that illness or medical condition has, or is in the process of becoming, unbearable to the person.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 10 May 2000. (P.D.p. 6720)

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Water Services Coordination Amendment Bill 1999 * (No. 71) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for the establishment of the Plumber Licensing Board and shift responsibility for the licensing of plumbers from the Water Corporation to a Board with licensing, inspectorial, customer complaint and advisory responsibilities.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 13 May 1999. (P.D.p. 8367)

Amended in the Legislative Council on 20 October 1999.

(Act No.39 of 1999 -- assented to on 9 November 1999)

Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Amendment Bill 1997 * (No. 85)

The purpose of this Bill is to reduce potential legal costs for injured workers where an employer appeals the decision of a review officer and to provide an option for a permanently but partially incapacitated worker to redeem future weekly earnings. The Bill also provides for automatic indexing of a number of key compensation entitlements including funeral expenses, wheeled-chairs, meals, board and lodging. It introduces specific claim forms for dependants of deceased workers to directly access compensation awarded. This Bill consolidates the major changes contained in *the Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Amendment Bill 1996* which lapsed at the conclusion of the last Session.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 16 October 1997. (P.D.p. 6973)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 19 November 1997 and in the Legislative Council on 1 April 1998.

Referred to Standing Committee on Legislation in the Legislative Council on 13 August 1998.

Bill Laid Aside in the Legislative Council on 16 December 1998.

Reinstated to the stage reached in the previous Session.

(Act No.34 of 1999 -- assented to on 5 October 1999)

Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Amendment Bill 2000 (No. 104) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to ensure that injured workers are not precluded from making an election where a question regarding the degree of disability, properly referred, has not been agreed or determined before the termination day. The purpose of the changes is to remove an unintended anomaly which may arise due to the current timeframes for the processing of a question regarding the degree of disability referred to the Director by the worker pursuant to section 93D(6), read in conjunction with section 93E(6).

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 15 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5014)

Amended in the Legislative Assembly on 28 March 2000 and in the Legislative Council on 1 June 2000.

Lapsed in the Legislative Council on prorogation of the Session.

Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Amendment Bill (No. 3) 1999 * (No. 59)

The purpose of this Bill is to clarify the application of section 32(8) of the *Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Amendment Act 1999*. This section was intended to provide that if weekly payments commenced before the day of assent of the Act, all workers wishing to elect to claim common law must make an election no later than 6 months from the date of commencement of weekly payments, or 3 months from the date of assent of the Act, whichever is the later. The clear intent was that the 3 month period applies to workers who have been on compensation for longer than 6 months.

Doubt has been expressed as to whether the wording of the legislation has this effect. This Bill clarifies unambiguously that this is the intent of the Act.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 26 October 1999. (P.D.p. 2581)

Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Amendment Bill (No.2) 1999 (LC No. 28) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for an extension for injured workers to seek redemption of future entitlements where they have a permanent partial disability. Where an injured worker and their employer agree upon redemption, this agreement can be registered by the Director of Conciliation and Review and will enable workers with a residual disability to receive a lump sum in lieu of ongoing small payments.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Council was moved on 19 August 1999. (P.D.p. 486)

Zoological Parks Authority Bill 2000 * (No. 80) [E]

The purpose of this Bill is to bring the legislation governing all aspects of the operation of Perth Zoo into a modern environment. Specifically, the Bill will -

- provide a definition of a modern zoo;
- enable the zoo to participate in its own right in the federally funded cooperative centre for the conservation and management of marsupials or in future Cooperative Research Centres;
- recognise the educational role of the zoo in the community;
- enable the zoo to enter business arrangements for profit;
- enable the zoo to expand to other geographical locations and varieties of premises;
- enable the Board to appoint committees to assist it in the performance of its functions; and
- provide clear statutory powers with respect to the issuing of infringement notices for breaches of the Zoological Gardens By-laws, the removal, detention or prosecution of offenders.

The motion for the Second Reading of the Bill in the Legislative Assembly was moved on 29 March 2000. (P.D.p. 5680)
