

BUSINESS OF THE HOUSE

Standing Orders Suspension — Motion

HON SUE ELLERY (South Metropolitan — Leader of the House) [3.23 pm] — without notice: I move —

That so much of the standing orders be suspended so as to enable the following variations to the order of business for —

- (1) Wednesday, 27 June —
 - (a) no consideration of committee reports;
 - (b) the Council is to proceed to orders of the day at the conclusion of motion 1, Independent Rural Fire Service;
 - (c) the sittings be suspended between 6.00 and 7.00 pm; and
 - (d) the Council is to sit beyond the normal adjournment time and take members' statements at 9.45 pm.
- (2) Thursday, 28 June —
 - (a) the Council is to commence meeting at 9.00 am;
 - (b) no private members' business; and
 - (c) the Council is to sit beyond the normal adjournment time and take members' statements at 6.20 pm.

I thank members for their assistance in trying to generate additional hours to deal with orders of the day. Members have been very cooperative, and I do appreciate that. In addition, I indicate that I will not list the Coroners Amendment Bill 2017 for consideration in the next few days.

I also want to flag that it would be my intention to see where we are at probably around this time tomorrow. If it is possible for us to proceed in such a way that we might bring question time forward on Thursday in the event that we are making good process and we can then finish earlier on Thursday, that would be my intention. I am trying to build in enough time to cover if we need it. I am hoping that we do not. In fact, we might be able to finish earlier on Thursday. If that is the case, I will check in with the leaders of each party if we need to move another motion to give effect to that.
