

POLICE — SPEED CAMERAS — INFRINGEMENTS REVIEW

654. Hon COLIN HOLT to the minister representing the Minister for Police:

I refer to reports earlier this year that 53 000 infringements were under review following the identification of a technical fault with the equipment.

- (1) How many fixed and mobile speed cameras remain suspended as a result of the technical issue?
- (2) How many infringements have been withdrawn by Western Australia Police Force as a result of the review?
- (3) What has been the cost of conducting the review and correcting the technical issue?
- (4) Is there likely to be a material impact on the forecast \$116 million in receipts to the road trauma trust account in 2018–19?

Hon STEPHEN DAWSON replied:

I thank the honourable member for some notice of the question. This information has been provided to me by the Minister for Police.

The Western Australia Police Force advises the following.

- (1) There are 11 fixed and mobile speed cameras suspended as a result of the technical issue.
- (2) WA police have withdrawn 27 infringements resulting from the review of the Jenoptik cameras.
- (3) The WA Police Force referred a number of speed detections to Jenoptik for validation. The cost of the validation of these speed detections and to ratify the fault will be met by Jenoptik.
- (4) There is likely to be no material impact on the forecast \$116 million in receipts to the road trauma trust account in 2018–19. Replacement cameras have been deployed while the technical issue is resolved.
