

POLICE PORTFOLIO — LEGISLATION

430. Mrs M.H. ROBERTS to the Minister for Police:

At the start of the year the Premier outlined key pieces of legislation that the government planned to introduce this year.

- (1) Is the minister able to outline to the house what pieces of legislation she will be introducing in the remaining seven weeks of the current session of Parliament, apart from the out-of-control party legislation that she has already announced?
- (2) Is any of the legislation drafted and ready to be introduced; and, which pieces, if any, will be introduced in sufficient time —

Several members interjected.

Mrs M.H. ROBERTS: Do you people think the minister cannot answer this question? Do you think you have to answer it for her? Do you have to give her a little hint; is that it?

The SPEAKER: Member for Eyre and member for Jandakot, I think I have given the member for Midland the call. I formally call you both to order for the first time today. Member for Midland, I do not think you need any assistance.

Mrs M.H. ROBERTS: The second part of my question was —

- (2) Is any of the legislation drafted and ready to be introduced; and, which pieces, if any, will be introduced in sufficient time or given sufficient priority to become law by the end of the year?

Mrs M.H. ROBERTS: Mr Speaker, the Treasurer continually interjected on my question.

The SPEAKER: I think the Minister for Police has heard the question. I hear the Treasurer. I can deal with the Treasurer; the member for Midland does not need to deal with the Treasurer. The member for Midland has asked a question of the Minister for Police.
