As I have already said, and as the Minister for Transport has put on the record already, there is a further investigation into one of those signs over Bull Creek station.

Mrs M.H. ROBERTS: I again reiterate that I have asked whether the Office of Road Safety supported the sign in its original recommendation. That is the only answer I want, minister.
