

PUBLIC HOUSING — HEAD CONTRACTOR MAINTENANCE MODEL

5943. Hon Helen Bullock to the Minister for Education representing the Minister for Housing

I refer to Homeswest housing maintenance, and I ask —

- (1) How many job orders submitted to the Department of Housing for payment by the head contractors were audited by the department in —
 - (a) 2010–11; and
 - (b) 2011–12?
- (2) What was the amount the department sought to recover from the head contractors for fraudulent or non-compliant job orders and how much of that amount was actually paid back by the head contractors within these financial years —
 - (a) 2010–11; and
 - (b) 2011–12?
- (3) What was the total face value, not the negotiated settlement amount, of the job orders found to be non-compliant in —
 - (a) 2010–11; and
 - (b) 2011–12?

 - (b) \$1 769 544.73 of job orders under investigation.
