As to Remaining Stages

HON SIMON O'BRIEN (South Metropolitan — Minister for Commerce) [2.36 pm]: It is appropriate now to seek leave of the house to proceed through all stages of these bills at this day's sitting. By way of brief explanation, I seek that leave mindful of the fact there is a deadline for these bills to be passed to enable the implementation of a detailed system of administration by 31 October and these bills still need to pass through another place before becoming law. Again, by way of brief explanation, I would not seek to truncate the process of the adoption of a report and third reading without the safety net that these bills still have to pass through another parliamentary process, in case there are any problems. I respectfully seek the leave of the house to do that on this occasion.

The DEPUTY PRESIDENT (Hon Michael Mischin): We have two stages to this. We need, first, leave to adopt the reports, given that the bills have been amended, and then to proceed with the question of whether standing orders are suspended to permit the house to proceed to the third reading on this occasion. Dealing with those in that order, I take it the minister will move for consideration and adoption of the report for each bill. The question is whether leave is granted.

Leave granted to proceed forthwith through remaining stages.

Report

That the reports be adopted.

Question put and passed; reports of committee adopted.

Suspension of Standing Orders — Motion
