5219. Mr P. Papalia to the Minister representing the Attorney General:

For each calendar year 2013, 2014 and 2015:

- (a) what total amount of money was spent on accumulating, analysing and reporting crime and related statistics;
- (b) how many FTE and what level or rank were dedicated to this task; and
- (c) what total amount of money was expended on external consultants or studies associated with analysing crime statistic, assessing effectiveness of policies and/or advising on organisational practices or structure?

Director of Public Prosecutions

- (a)–(b) The Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (‘ODPP’) does not maintain crime statistics. The ODPP only maintains statistics of actual prosecutions conducted. A wide range of ODPP staff members have varying roles in these processes as part of their routine work, however, it is impossible to accurately segregate the cost of maintaining these statistics.
