

CONSERVATION COMMISSION — BOARD AND SENIOR EXECUTIVES

1993. Mr C.J. Tallentire to the Minister for Environment:

With regard to the Conservation Commission, I ask:

- (a) has the Minister met with the members and/or Chairman of the Conservation Commission, and if so, how many times;
- (b) what is the level of remuneration paid to the Chairman;
- (c) what level of remuneration is paid to board members;
- (d) since 1 July 2012 how many times have senior executives travelled for business purposes, to where and at what cost; and
- (e) have board members travelled on Commission business in the past three years and, if so, to where, and at what cost?

**Mr A.P. Jacob replied:**

- (a) Yes. The Minister has held meetings with the Chairman of the Conservation Commission as required and has recently met with members of the Conservation Commission.
- (b) \$40 700 per annum (plus superannuation at the superannuation guarantee rate).
- (c) The Deputy Chairman receives \$15 200 per annum (plus superannuation). Six of the seven Conservation Commission members each receive \$8 700 per annum (plus superannuation). In addition, superannuation is paid at the superannuation guarantee rate. One member does not receive remuneration as he is employed as a public servant.
- (d) Since 1 July 2012, the Director of the Conservation Commission has travelled three times for business purposes to the South West of Western Australia at a travel cost of \$739.29.
- (e) Yes. Since April 1 2011, Commissioners have travelled to South West Western Australia, Karratha and Broome at a total travel cost of \$9 676.81.
