

PLANNING — BUNBURY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

4053. Mrs L.M. Harvey to the Minister for Planning:

I refer to the creation of the Bunbury Development Committee, and I ask:

- (a) do any members of the committee receive any payment for being part of the Committee or receive any sitting fees;
- (b) if yes to (a) how much are the members entitled to receive;
- (c) how many times has the Committee met and on what dates did the Committee meet;
- (d) has the Minister met with the Committee and if so, on what dates has the Minister met with the Committee;
- (e) If yes to (d) will the Minister table the agendas for those meetings and the issues raised by the committee with the Minister;
- (f) has the Committee met with Government departments and if so, which departments and on which dates;
- (g) if yes to (f), will the Minister table the agendas for those meetings;
- (h) has the Committee met with other stakeholders and if yes, which stakeholders has the Committee met with and on what dates; and
- (i) if yes to (h) will the Minister table the agendas for those meetings?

**Ms R. Saffioti replied:**

- (a) Yes.
- (b) Eligible members of the Bunbury Development Committee are entitled to receive the following sitting fees: Chairperson – \$563 per full day or \$366 per part day; Members – \$366 per full day or \$238 per part day. Fees are recommended by the Public Sector Commissioner.
- (c) 26 April 2018, 28 June 2018 and 23 August 2018.
- (d) No.
- (e) Not applicable.
- (f) Representatives from Main Roads Western Australia and the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions gave presentations at the 28 June 2018 meeting. The Committee also includes representatives from government departments, including the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, Landcorp, Department of Communities, Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage, Department of Transport and Southern Ports Authority.
