

PRISONS — JUVENILE MALE NON-INDIGENOUS RE-OFFENDERS

2451. Mr P. Papalia to the Minister for Corrective Services:

- (1) What percentage of male juvenile non-indigenous offenders who entered the detention system after 10 February 2001 and before 8 September 2008, then re-offended resulting in a new custodial sentence having completed their first custodial sentence (including each exit and/or return but excluding imprisonment for fine default only and returns for fine default or breach early release order)?
- (2) What percentage of male juvenile non-indigenous offenders who entered the detention system after 10 February 2001 and before 8 September 2008, then re-offended within one year of release resulting in a new custodial sentence having completed their first custodial sentence?
- (3) What percentage of male juvenile non-indigenous offenders who entered the detention system after 10 February 2001 and before 8 September 2008, then re-offended within two years of release resulting in a new custodial sentence having completed their first custodial sentence?
- (4) What percentage of male juvenile non-indigenous offenders who entered the detention system after 10 February 2001 and before 8 September 2008, then re-offended within five years of release resulting in a new custodial sentence having completed their first custodial sentence?
