**Hon Sue Ellery replied:**

The average calendar year FTE for Education Assistants and Aboriginal and Islander Education Officers in 2016 under the former Liberal–National Government was 7561.

In 2017 the average calendar year FTE was 7902.

Schools operate and receive their funding on a calendar-year basis.
