*[Supplementary Information No A5.]*

*Question:* Mr V.A. Catania asked how many Aboriginal police officers were recruited by Western Australia Police Force in the past two years.

*Answer:* 59 Aboriginal officers graduated from the Police Recruit Program in the last two years.

*[Supplementary Information No A6.]*

*Question:* Ms L. Mettam asked why the Prevent Alcohol and Risk-related Trauma in Youth Program was paused and when it was resumed?

*Answer:* The Prevent Alcohol and Risk-related Trauma in Youth (P.A.R.T.Y) Program is an injury prevention initiative coordinated through Royal Perth Hospital (RPH) and operates from a number of hospitals across WA.

Whilst the P.A.R.T.Y Program is primarily focused on in-hospital delivery, where schools are unable to facilitate students attending a participating hospital, an outreach option is also available.

The P.A.R.T.Y Program temporarily ceased in-hospital programs 1 March 2022 due to COVID restrictions, however outreach programs continued.

Royal Perth Hospital resumed normal operations from 2 June 2022.

Midland, Busselton, Bunbury and Fiona Stanley in-hospital programs will recommence in Term 3.

Geraldton and Albany have not yet recommenced in-hospital programs.
