## DOMESTIC GAS RESERVATION POLICY

## 790. Hon Dr STEVE THOMAS to the minister representing the Minister for State and Industry Development, Jobs and Trade:

I refer to the state government's domestic gas reservation policy, under which 15 per cent of a project's reserves are supposed to be set aside for the local market.

- (1) As at 8 August 2023, how many liquefied natural gas exporters are using permissible offset provisions to meet their obligations under the state's domestic gas policy?
- (2) As of that date, which LNG exporters are applying and utilising permissible offset provisions?
- What governmental agencies or departments have compliance, oversight monitoring and real-time assessment in the accuracy of energy outcome deliverables of the permitted offsets?
- (4) Are all LNG companies utilising permissible offsets meeting their obligations to provide a net addition to WA's domestic gas supply, inherent to their obligations under the state's domestic gas reservation policy?
- (5) If no to (4), why not?
