

PFAS CONTAMINATION — FORRESTFIELD–AIRPORT LINK

1145. Hon Dr STEVE THOMAS to the minister representing the Minister for Transport:

I refer to the Abernethy Road stockpile of PFAS-contaminated spoil extracted from the Forrestfield–Airport Link.

- (1) As at 16 August 2023, what volume of spoil extracted from the FAL project was stockpiled at 777 Abernethy Road, Forrestfield?
- (2) As at that date, what volume of stockpiled FAL spoil had been utilised on the Great Eastern Highway project?
- (3) Excluding the spoil utilised on the Great Eastern Highway bypass, what infrastructure projects across Perth have been beneficial recipients of the Abernethy Road spoil since October 2022?
- (4) What volumes of Abernethy Road spoil have been utilised on each of those infrastructure projects and in what manner?

Hon STEPHEN DAWSON replied:

- (1) Approximately 450 000 cubic metres.
- (2) Approximately 150 000 cubic metres.
- (3)–(4) No other infrastructure projects have beneficially re-used the spoil during this time.
