

TRANSPORT NETWORK SURVEY — MODE SHARE

**712. Hon Dr BRAD PETTITT to the minister representing the Minister for Transport:**

My question is to the Leader of the House representing the Minister for Transport.

- (1) What is the current transport mode share split in metropolitan Perth between cars, public transport and active transport, broken down by walking and cycling, if available?
- (2) Does the WA government have a target for a transport mode share split?
- (3) If yes to (2), what is this target?
- (4) If no to (2), why not?

**Hon STEPHEN DAWSON replied:**

I thank the honourable member for some notice of the question. I now represent the Minister for Transport, so I will provide the answer to the honourable member.

- (1) Data currently available from the first three years of the four-year *Perth area travel and household survey* shows a mode split as follows: car driver, 58.8 per cent; car passenger, 23.8 per cent; public transport, 4.1 per cent; cycling, 1.4 per cent; and walking 11.9 per cent.
- (2)–(3) Our government is committed to providing Western Australians with more transport options through Metronet and a record investment in active transport.
