- (1) In reference to the One Future Program:
- (a) How much did Gold Corporation pay KPMG to conduct One Future Program Health Checks;
  - (b) How many One Future Program Health Checks were conducted;
  - (c) Please table each of the One Future Program Health Checks in chronological order; and
  - (d) Was the Minister responsible for Gold Corporation provided copies of the One Future Program Health Checks and on what dates did this occur?
- (2) In reference to staff at Gold Corporation since the previous CEO finished in October 2021:
- (a) How many staff have left Gold Corporation since October 2021;
  - (b) How many staff in total have taken extended leave from Gold Corporation since October 2021; and
  - (c) How many staff are currently on leave without pay and have been since October 2021?
- (3) How many Gold Corporation staff have worked on the One Future Program each year since 2015 categorised by:
- (a) Headcount;
  - (b) Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) actual; and
  - (c) FTE authorised?
