I do not want to bovrilise the session towards the end, but as we have made so much progress with the Estimates, it is possible we can finish on Thursday night. If this were not possible, it would mean calling the House together on the following week. I do not think there is any opposition to the House sitting at 2.15 p.m. on Tuesday next—I have discussed this with the Leader of the Opposition—and therefore I move—

That the House at its rising adjourn until 2.15 p.m. on Tuesday, the 7th November.
