next time.] I may be opposed; but I am prepared to say I will meet with the same success as I met with last time. Now I will thank members-[THE MINISTER FOR MINES: For a patient hearing.]-if the Minister desires it should be considered patient, I will not oppose his wish. I hope I have made my position clear. I feel confident that there is no time in the history of the politics of Western Australia, or of any part of the Commonwealth, when there was such a political crisis as there is here to-day. I say it is necessary that members on this (Government) side of the House should make their position clear; because I am perfectly satisfied that the electors who returned Labour members to Parliament are thoroughly dissatisfied with the later developments of the last week, in respect of the negotiations with the Opposition.

On motion by Mr. Foulkes, debate

adjourned.
