## WEDNESDAY, 1 APRIL 2009

#### 1. Meeting of Council

The Council assembled at 4.00pm pursuant to order. The President, Hon Nick Griffiths, took the Chair and read prayers.

# 2. Personal Explanation - Hon Adele Farina - Electoral Office

Hon Adele Farina, by leave, made a personal explanation [SO 85] with respect to the fit-out of her Bunbury electoral office.

#### Point of Order

The Leader of the House raised the following Point of Order -

There is no evidence that what the Member is saying is correct. Leave to a Member to make a personal explanation is given on the basis that we will not have arguable material and personal attacks on individuals who cannot respond.

#### President's Ruling

The President ruled as follows -

The Leader of the House has made two point of orders and I have intervened on another occasion in respect of this particular personal explanation. When Members look at the Standing Order, it states that the matter is not to be debated. It is clear from that that when use of the Standing Order is made Members should not range into areas that can be the subject of debate. I invite Hon Adele Farina to continue with her personal explanation but not to transgress, as she has on no less than three occasions so far.

Hon Anthony Fels moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.
