- (2) Is the Minister further aware that Pozieres will have only a ceremonial activity in 2016 and there have been no funds allocated by the Federal government to more formally commemorate on site the death of 7,000 Australian soldiers and the wounding of countless more at Pozieres in 1916?

- (4) If the Minister was not aware, will the Minister now undertake to make such representations so that the service of Western Australians who fought and or died at Pozieres are appropriately honoured?
