MOTIONS

7. Renewable Energy Technologies - Gross Feed-in Tariff (Notice given 11 November 2008)

Continuation of remarks Minister for Energy (Thursday, 19 March 2009) on the motion of Hon Paul Llewellyn as follows -

That this House calls on the Western Australian Government to introduce a State-based comprehensive gross feed-in tariff for renewable energy technologies.

8. Standing Committee on Estimates and Financial Operations - Office of Shared Services (Notice given 11 November 2008)

Hon Anthony Fels: To move -

That the Standing Committee on Estimates and Financial Operations table in the Legislative Council any documents and transcripts of proceedings of the briefing from the Office of Shared Services provided to them on 21 August 2006, as referred to at 2.34 in the 2006 Annual Report.

9. Native Forests (Notice given 11 November 2008)

Hon Giz Watson: To move -

That in light of the Forest Product Commission's poor financial performance in the native forest sector; the failure of regulation and compliance of native forest logging; the impact of logging on the habitat of vulnerable species; the compelling evidence of native forest ecosystems at risk of irreparable damage; and the compounding impact of climate change, this House calls on the Government to -

- (1) Set in place a full transition to plantation and farm forestry for the production of commodity timber products currently derived from native forests.
- (2) Immediately develop an exit strategy for the native forest commodity timber industry.
- (3) Put in place an independently refereed, scientifically based program to restore the ecological integrity of native forests which underpins the delivery of clean air, clean water, carbon sequestration, biodiversity and natural heritage values of the South West region.

10. Select Committee into the Iron Ore Industry of Western Australia - Establishment (Notice given 11 November 2008)

Hon Anthony Fels: To move -

That -

- (1) A select committee of three members is appointed, any two of whom constitute a quorum.
- (2) The committee is to inquire into and report on -
 - (a) the content and terms of the iron ore policy including and in relation to -
 - (i) the allocation and grant of iron ore tenure;
 - (ii) the grant of certificates of exemption under section 102A of the *Mining Act 1978 (WA)*;
 - (iii) the grant of extensions of term under section 61(2) of the *Mining Act* 1978 (WA) in respect of exploration licences which are authorised for iron ore under section 111 of the *Mining Act 1978 (WA)*; and
 - (iv) the basis upon which exploration licences authorised for iron ore under section 111 of the *Mining Act 1978 (WA)* have been permitted to be utilised as holding titles;
 - (b) the relationship between the iron ore policy and the use of state agreements to facilitate the development of iron ore projects;
 - (c) the extent to which the iron ore policy has been the subject of review and variation including by the Department of Industry and Resources;
 - (d) whether the existence and terms of the iron ore policy have been adequately disclosed, including to new entrants and potential new entrants into the iron ore industry;

- (e) the current operation of the iron ore policy including -
 - (i) the impact of the iron ore policy upon -
 - (A) investment in iron ore exploration in the State; and
 - (B) iron ore royalties and other revenues received by the State (in relation to both quantum and time of receipt);
 - (ii) whether the iron ore policy is anti-competitive in the current market in that it prevents the turn-over of ground and thereby -
 - (A) preserves the market power of existing members of the iron ore industry; and
 - (B) operates as a barrier to entry to new entrants into the market;
- (f) whether the original rationale for the iron ore policy remains applicable today;
- (g) whether there is still any need to treat iron ore differently to other mineral commodities under the *Mining Act 1978 (WA)*; and
- (h) whether it is still necessary and appropriate to use government agreements to facilitate the development of iron ore resources or whether the *Mining Act* 1978 (WA) provides an adequate and appropriate vehicle.
- (3) The committee is to report to the House no later than 12 March 2009.

11. Water Catchments - South West Recovery Program (Notice given 11 November 2008)

Hon Paul Llewellyn: To move -

That in the light of the declining rainfall and catastrophic decline in surface water inflow to our dams, and the impact of salinity on our South West water catchments this House calls on the government to implement as a matter of priority a comprehensive upper catchment recovery program based on farm forestry that aims to restore water and salt balance in the six key water catchments in the region.

18. Appropriate Resourcing for Western Australian Not-for-Profit Sector (Notice given 3 December 2008)

Hon Sue Ellery: To move -

That this House notes the changing demands for assistance on the Western Australian not-forprofit sector and calls on the Barnett Government to ensure the sector has appropriate resources and capacity to meet demand.

19. Child Death Review Committee - Recommendations (Notice given 3 December 2008)

Hon Sue Ellery: To move -

That this House notes the recommendations of the *Group Analysis of Aboriginal Child Death Review Cases in which Chronic Neglect is Present* report of the Child Death Review Committee and calls on the Minister for Child Protection to provide quarterly reports to the House on the implementation of those recommendations.

20. Kimberley Liquefied Natural Gas Precinct (Notice given 18 March 2009)

Hon Jon Ford: To move -

(1) That this House expresses its concern at the comments made by the Premier to the Committee for Economic Development Australia Conference on Tuesday, 3 March 2009 in which he referred to a proposed LNG precinct to the north of Broome and stated -

"...we are proceeding in developing an LNG precinct to the north of Broome. That's not the spectacular part of the Kimberley coast, it's flat tableland, no people living within probably 30 or 40 kilometres of the area.That's important, we're trying to do that by negotiation, the timetable is the end of this month. If we can't do it by negotiation, the State will resume the land. I'll do that reluctantly, but we will do it. We will not hold up economic development and we will not deny the people of the Kimberley – and particularly the Aboriginal people – the opportunity from some economic independence and some economic security."

- (2) This House calls on the Premier to -
 - (a) explain how he can claim to be negotiating in good faith when he put on public record that if he doesn't get a negotiated outcome he will resume the land to develop an LNG precinct to the north of Broome; and
 - (b) explain why he is presenting a veiled threat to indigenous people in respect of this matter and whether this is a sign of things to come.

21. Freedom of Information Process (Notice given 18 March 2009)

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

That this House condemns the Premier for failing to honour his election commitment to review the manner in which Departments are administering the Freedom of Information (FOI) process, to ensure that the Government is accountable and open in accordance with the spirit of the FOI Act and calls on the Premier to explain why he has allowed a culture of arrogance, secrecy and of deliberately keeping information from the public to develop among his Cabinet Ministers when dealing with FOI requests.

22. Fremantle Port - Lead Export (Notice given 18 March 2009)

Hon Sally Talbot: To move -

- (1) That this House condemns the Minister for Environment and the Minister for Mines for their lack of openness and accountability in relation to their decision to allow lead to be transported through 22 suburbs in the metropolitan area on its way to Fremantle and calls on both Ministers to explain why they have not made all details in relation to lead shipments public.
- (2) That this House also calls on the Minister for Environment to explain why, since environmental approval was given by her for Magellan Metals to transport containerised lead carbonate through suburbs to the Fremantle Port, so little has been revealed to the thousands of families living in and around suburbs along the proposed transport route.

23. Lobbyists Register (Notice given 18 March 2009)

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

That this House condemns the Premier for breaking a key election commitment on accountability by not introducing legislation to create a public register for lobbyists in his first 100 days of government, and calls on the Premier to explain –

- (a) why he has not met this commitment and when will he introduce legislation to create a public register for lobbyists;
- (b) how the proposed legislation will be applied to different classes of lobbyists, consultants, consultant-lobbyists, in-house corporate consultants and in-house lobbyists employed by organizations;
- (c) what are the registration requirements for lobbyists before being permitted to be on the register -
 - (i) business registration details;
 - (ii) names of owners;
 - (iii) partner and major shareholders; and
 - (iv) names and positions of those employed and the names of their clients;
- (d) what is the set of principles of ethical conduct relating to a lobbyist before being placed on the register;
- (e) what will be the reporting requirements of lobbyists, including but not limited to -
 - (i) what has to be reported;
 - (ii) when it has to be reported;
 - (iii) who will lobbyists be required to report to; and
 - (iv) whether or not any lobbyists will be banned from being placed on the register and who they might be;
- (f) the means by which a lobbyist can be removed from the Register;
- (g) the appeal mechanisms for a lobbyist who is removed from the register; and
- (h) the frequency that the code will be reviewed and who will have the responsibility for such a function.

24. Public Sector Expenditure - New Government Agencies (Notice given 18 March 2009)

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

- (1) That this House condemns the Premier as Minister for Public Sector Management for wasting taxpayers' money in creating new government agencies, boards, committees and taskforces, at the same time as asking agencies to find savings of three percent resulting in the cuts to front-line services in health, education and law and order.
- (2) That this House calls on the Premier to explain why a three percent savings target is not a "big ask" for government agencies, as he stated to the recent Committee for Economic Development Australia conference, given that the 2009-2010 mid-year review projected no savings and an expense growth of 13%.

25. Ministerial Offices - Staffing (Notice given 18 March 2009)

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

That this House condemns the Premier and his Ministers for breaking the Premier's promise on the staffing cap in ministerial offices and calls on the Premier to explain how he can expect government agencies to cap their staff numbers while at the same time he condones the growth in staff numbers in ministerial offices, and calls on the Premier to -

- (a) reaffirm his commitment to the promise he made during the election campaign to cap the number of staff in ministerial offices at 150 full time equivalent; and
- (b) explain why he is amongst the worst offenders with his current staffing level of 17 employees and a driver rather than the 8.8 FTEs that he is entitled to under his own election promise.

26. Media Consultant Appointments (Notice given 18 March 2009)

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

That this House condemns the Premier as the Minister for Public Sector Management for using tender arrangements as a way of hiring a media consultant for more than a year on a six figure salary, while avoiding the scrutiny of the public sector staffing cap, thereby making a mockery of his promise to cut public spending on both media and consultants; and calls on the Premier to explain -

- (a) why he is hiring consultants to promote the Liberal Party at a time when he is cutting staff in crucial areas such as health, education, and law and order;
- (b) why he is hiring consultants at the same time as the Treasurer announced cuts to Government spending on both marketing and media and the use of consultants in the Mid-Year Review in December:
- (c) why Coulter Consulting has been engaged using a tender on a three month \$25,344 contract, with the Government having an option to keep extending the contract until April 2010, given that the Government recently appointed, as Head of the Government Media Office (GMO), Mr Paul Plowman; and
- (d) whether or not he has lost confidence in Mr Plowman, who was hired to run the GMO on a six figure salary on the basis that he is a highly qualified media professional.

27. Small Business Development Corporation (Notice given 19 March 2009)

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

- (1) That this House calls on the Minister for Commerce and the Minister for Regional Development to make public their positions on the future of the Small Business Development Commission (SBDC), in light of the uncertainty in the small business community and given the Chamber of Commerce and Industry's position as outlined in their 2009/10 pre-budget submission to Government which states that -
 - "The Chamber of Commerce and Industry (CCI) believes that there are significant opportunities for the core functions of the SBDC to be absorbed by other agencies."
- (2) That this House calls on the Minister for Commerce and the Minister for Regional Development to -
 - (a) allay the concern of the small business sector and guarantee that the SBDC will not be privatised in full or part or carved up and its functions distributed to other agencies as part of the Government's three per cent efficiency dividend; and

(b) confirm that the future of the small business centres around the state is assured and that they will not be privatised in full or part or carved up and their functions distributed to other agencies as part of the Government's three per cent efficiency dividend.

28. Government Training Policy (Notice given 19 March 2009)

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

That this House condemns the Minister for Training for his failure to produce a training policy and calls on the Minister to outline what he will do to assist industry and Western Australian workers who have been adversely impacted by the global financial crisis, and calls on the Minister to outline -

- (a) his Government's policies to deal with the impact of the global financial crisis on workers who lose their jobs and need retraining;
- (b) how many training places will be delivered to apprentices and trainees over four years;
- (c) how many training places will be delivered in green skills areas;
- (d) how much funding will be allocated by the State Government to retraining retrenched workers across the state;
- (e) how much funding will be allocated to VET in schools; and
- (f) what is the Government's plan for training infrastructure in Western Australia.

29. Government Small Business Policy (Notice given 19 March 2009)

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

- (1) That this House condemns the Minister for Commerce for his failure to produce a small business policy and calls on the Minister to outline what he will do to assist small businesses and Western Australian workers who have been adversely impacted by the global financial crisis.
- (2) That this House calls on the Minister to explain -
 - (a) his Government's policies to deal with the impact of the global financial crisis on small business and the thousands of workers who lose their jobs and require retraining;
 - (b) what strategies he has put in place to protect small business and their workers;
 - (c) what practical assistance is available to small businesses that go bust and the thousands of workers who lose their jobs; and
 - (d) why he has been asleep at the wheel whilst small business in Western Australia go under.

30. Government Tourism Policy (Notice given 10 March 2009)

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

- (1) That this House condemns the Minister for Tourism for her failure to produce a tourism policy at a time of economic uncertainty and calls on the Minister to outline what she will do to assist tourism businesses and Western Australian workers who are adversely impacted by the global financial crisis.
- (2) That this House calls on the Minister to explain -
 - (a) her Government's policies to deal with the impact of the global financial crisis on tourism operators in Western Australia and the thousands of workers that are being retrenched in the tourism and hospitality sector;
 - (b) what strategies she has put in place to protect small business and their workers;
 - (c) what practical assistance is available to tourism operators that go bust and the thousands of workers who lose their jobs; and
 - (d) why she has been asleep at the wheel whilst tourism operators in Western Australia go under.

31. Review of TAFEWA Operations (Notice given 19 March 2009)

Hon Ljiljanna Ravlich: To move -

That this House calls on the Minister for Training to provide information to the House on the review of TAFEWA operations, which will among other things, be giving consideration to the level of independence required by TAFE Colleges and the manner in which Colleges can improve and streamline the way business is conducted and asks the Minister to explain -

- (a) who is undertaking this review;
- (b) what are the terms of reference for the review and the timeline for completion;
- (c) why he has been secretive about the review by not announcing it but rather letting it slip under the radar;
- (d) why he was selective in which stakeholders he wrote to about the review in December and why he did not inform the whole sector; and
- (e) why he has not allayed the concerns of the training sector that TAFE colleges will be have to contest with each other, be privatized or have their functions contracted out
