THURSDAY, 1 MARCH 2007

1. Meeting of Assembly

The Assembly met at 9.00 a.m. in the Legislative Council Chamber pursuant to adjournment.

The Speaker took the Chair.

Prayers were read.

2. Speaker's Statement - Disorder in the Public Gallery

The Speaker advised members that, as result of an object being thrown over the balcony of the public gallery in the previous day's sitting, a person had been barred from the public gallery until further notice.

3. Speaker's Statement - Authority of the Chair

The Speaker advised members that the proper operation of the House required the Chair to be respected at all times, which included complying with the directions of the Chair, addressing the Chair respectfully and in proper terms, not personalising the Chair, and not drawing the Chair into debate. The Speaker also advised members that, while they were entitled to approach the Chair to discuss matters, they were not to do so in an aggressive or intimidatory manner.

In relation to the actions yesterday, while disrespectful to the Chair, the Speaker did not intend to take any further action in relation to this matter.

4. Petitions

Drummond Cove, Geraldton - Mr G.A. Woodhams presented a petition from 1,034 persons requesting that the leases for houses along the west side of Whitehill Road in Drummond Cove, Geraldton be continued due to their significant heritage value (P. 181).

Southern Yarragadee Aquifer - Mr P.D. Omodei presented a petition from 4,097 persons requesting that no water be taken from the Southern Yarragadee Aquifer until South West water needs are met and guaranteed for the future and the environmental impact of the extraction is assessed by an independent scientific body (P. 182).
