4723. Mr R.H. Cook to the Minister for Health:

I refer to the no smoking policy on the grounds of all public hospitals in the Perth metropolitan area, with the exception of Graylands and including privately-owned hospitals that treat public patients listed by hospital, I ask:

- (a) does the hospital fine people for violating the smoke free zone, and if so, how much is the fine, listed by hospital;
- (b) for each hospital, are inpatients advised in writing of the smoke free zone prior to admission:
- (c) in addition, for each hospital, are outpatients advised of the no smoking policy prior to attending appointments;
- (d) listed by hospital, how many warnings have been issued for violating the smoke free zone since 2013; and
- (e) listed by hospital, how many infringements have been issued since 2013?

4724. Mr R.H. Cook to the Minister for Health:

I refer to the growing number of beauty clinics providing botox and other schedule four drugs (predominantly dermal fillers and muscle relaxants), and ask:

- (a) can a prescribing Doctor or Nurse Practitioner legally prescribe without physically seeing the patient (eg. is Skype considered a legal consultation);
- (b) can a prescribing Doctor or Nurse Practitioner be physically located interstate during the consultation:
- (c) has any action been taken about clinics administering botox and dermal fillers for failing to provide details of prescribing Nurse Practitioners or Doctors;
- (d) Is there a legal requirement to notify the Department of Health of any severe sideeffect cases, and if so, how many cases have been reported in WA;
- (e) does the Department of Health conduct physical inspections of premises to ensure sterile equipment, etc., and if so, how frequently;
- (f) how many poisons licenses for botox are issued in WA annually;
- (g) how many licenses (if any) have been revoked in WA; and
- (h) how many clinics (if any), have been referred to Pharmaceutical Services Brand or the Department of Health for further investigation?

4725. Mr W.J. Johnston to the Minister for Energy:

I refer to the Business Efficiency Program announced in the 2015 Budget for Synergy, and I ask, have any consultants been appointed to support the Business Efficiency Program:

- (a) if yes, who or whom are the consultants;
- (b) from what date were each of the consultants appointed, and if their appointment has completed, when did the appointment conclude;
- (c) how much has been paid to each consultant. What is the total value of each consultants contract; and
- (d) how much was paid to each consultant prior to 30 June 2015?

4726. Ms L.L. Baker to the Minister for Police:

In relation to the domestic dog named Biggie that was recently shot dead by WA Police, I ask:

(a) is a review being conducted into the killing of this dog by police;

- (b) if yes, when will this review be completed; and
- (c) will the results of a review be released to the public?

4727. Ms L.L. Baker to the Minister for Police:

- (1) What training is currently given to WA police to help them to:
 - (a) recognise and interpret animal behaviour, specifically the warning signs of fear and aggression in dogs; and
 - (b) de-escalate heightened fear or aggression in animals especially dogs?
- (2) Do WA Police intend reviewing and upgrading training in recognising and managing animal behaviour, especially dog behaviour?
